



Ginger Snap

Fans rave about champion mare as she sets sights on another Gr. I

Nuno Santos gets to gallop Ginger Punch. Angel Cordero gets to breeze her. Ruben Loza gets to oversee her. Jose Cuevas gets to pretend he's train-

The foursome did their level best Thursday morning, a day before the reigning champion was set to take on five rivals in the Grade I Personal Ensign. Trainer Bobby Frankel traveled to California and left the training duties to Santos, Cordero, Loza and Cuevas.

By 9 in the morning, Ginger Punch had cooled out from her gallop (moved up an hour because she was running the next day) and was eating from her hay net. The chestnut mare rattled the hay net, then grabbed the rubber runner across her stall and went back to eating.

Her compatriots were busy, but not too busy to talk about the \$2.7 million earner.

"Class. Class. She's easy to ride. She does whatever you want," Santos said. "No attitude, other than she hates when you push her, if you smooth at her, even a little, she pins her ears, that's it."

PERSONAL ENSIGN PREVIEW

Born in Portugal, Santos has been galloping Ginger Punch for about a year. He's watched her fill out and grow

"She changed totally. Her weight, her attitude, she keeps her weight, she's stronger. She's just classy," Santos said. "This is one of those things that give you goosebumps. The way she gallops, she's happy. Happy. This is her year."

So far, Ginger Punch has won four of five starts; the only blemish came when she was on the lead in the Apple Blossom and faded badly, finishing 8 lengths behind the undefeated Zenyatta.

Any advice about galloping her,

"Just leave her alone, let her do her job, she just floats around there," Santos said. "A horse passes her, she plays with the horse. Just leave her alone.'

And if she were a woman?

"Halle Berry," Santos said. "Definitely Halle Berry.

Santos hands the reins to Cordero for all breezes. The Hall of Famer put her through an easy 5 furlongs over the

Oklahoma in 1:00 2/5 a week ago. It could have been 58 or 1:04.

"She's beautiful. She's nice, quiet, very obedient, sound, doesn't make a noise, very smart, very good to hang around with. She will go in any time Bobby wants her to go in," Cordero said. "I used to work Sightseek for him – she was tough, she'd go in 58, 59, no matter how hard you tried. This one is very obedient, she knows the rules. She goes by herself,

she doesn't make you worry. She's very athletic, although she doesn't look like it, if you didn't know it was Ginger Punch walking past you, you wouldn't think anything about her."

And if she were a woman? "Mariah Carey," Cordero said, "but

Loza and Cuevas couldn't decide. "Britney Spears," Cuevas said. "Not even close," Loza said.



Punchers' Chances

Ginger Punch, who tries 1 1/4 miles for the first time, is not the only horse in the Personal Ensign – today's ninth race and the first of four Grade I stakes on the weekend.

Spring Waltz will be a more than capable backup should the favorite not start. Also trained by Bobby Frankel, Stronach Stable's daughter of Silver Charm exits a fourth in the Grade II Delaware Handicap at 10 furlongs, her first start in more than four months. Prior to the Del Cap, Spring Waltz dominated a pair of 9-furlong contests at Gulfstream Park, including an easy win in the Grade II Rampart March 9. Javier Castellano has the call should Spring Waltz start Friday.

Unbridled Belle enters as the most experienced 10-furlong horse in the race with five starts at the distance. Trained by Todd Pletcher for Team Valor Stable, Unbridled Belle comes in off a third in the Del Cap, a race she won last year before running second as the favorite in the Personal Ensign. The Broken Vow mare defeated Ginger Punch in the Grade I Beldame at Belmont in October and finished fifth to the favorite in the Breeders' Cup Distaff.

Unbridled Belle began her 2008 season with an easy score in the Grade III Obeah at Delaware June 14. In the paddock before the Delaware Handicap, she froze and then fell, but rebounded to run well, considering the circumstances.

"I don't really know what happened to her that day, it was very odd and atypical of her behavior because she usually handles herself so well. But we've schooled her since then and she's doing excellent and training great," Pletcher said. "A mile and a quarter is kind of her game and something she handles very well so we're looking forward to Friday."

Ramon Dominguez has the return call.

Darley Stable's Golden Velvet (Eibar Coa to ride) was freshened after a distant second to Ginger Punch in the Grade I Ogden Phipps. The daughter of Seeking The Gold stretches back out in the Personal Ensign and her last two-turn start was a runaway score in the Grade III Sixty Sails Handicap at Hawthorne April 19. Kiaran McLaughlin took over as trainer last fall after Golden Velvet left Saeed bin Suroor's Dubai barn, and she immediately paid dividends. She took an optional claimer last October and dead-heated for the win in the Grade III Sabin January 6 at Gulfstream Park.

With four races through the first half of the season, McLaughlin opted for a break and circled the Personal Ensign. She shows three works over the Polytrack at Godolphin's Greentree Training Center.

"Golden Velvet worked really well over the Polytrack and we've had three or four horses do that and come over to the main track and win, so I think the horses are moving forward off that surface. She took the last race pretty hard so we decided to give her a little time in between starts. We gave her about 10 days off after the Phipps and since then she's been training fabulous," McLaughlin said. "She's a better filly going two turns and we're excited to stretch her back out. I don't know how we beat Ginger Punch; she's a very good horse. But Golden Velvet wants 10 furlongs, no question about it."

Lemon Drop Mom comes in off a second in the Del Cap, where she beat Unbridled Belle. Robert Evans' homebred has matured this season under Tim Ritchey's tutelage and the 4-year-old Lemon Drop Kid filly rates an upset chance. Regular jockey Jose Caraballo put Lemon Drop Mom on the front in the Del Cap and she responded with a strong effort behind runaway winner Hystericalady. The Kentucky-bred could find herself on the lead again in a paceless race and Ritchey enters full of guarded optimism.

"The Del Cap was her best race so far and she's come out of it well so we're excited. Certainly she's got to step up her game again, there are some tough fillies in there, but that's why they run the races," Ritchey said. "Her pedigree says she should handle the trip no problem. Last year she wasn't a graded-stakes caliber filly but this year she's turned into that."

Indescribable (Kent Desormeaux) chased Ginger Punch home in the Go For Wand, rallying from last to check in third. Don Adam sent the 4-year-old Pleasant Tap filly to Bill Mott two starts back after a win in the Grade III Arlington Matron for Graham Motion.

Mrs. Leverett Miller's So Glitzy (Cornelio Velasquez) owns a win over the track July 25, when she won an optional claimer by a nose at 9 furlongs. Trainer Allen Jerkens upset the Personal Ensign last year with Miss Shop.

FRIDAY'S DETAILED ANALYSIS

BY BRIAN NADEAU

RACE 1: GLOBALIZATION appears first-time for a tag and could prove to be the controlling speed in this 9-furlong contest; experience going two turns is always a plus. STONE BIRD is another who plummets after chasing much better in the spring. LOVE EVERYBODY has some back form to suggest he can compete at this level, even though he figures for a wide trip.

RACE 2: DREAM EMPRESS got to stretch her legs in her debut at Ellis Park; that she shows up here is most encouraging. By just betting Ken McPeek's second-time starters or first-time Lasix users you'll retire to a life of luxury. Judging by her morning trials PLATINUM GIRL looks to be a bit faster than her stablemate Weekend Strike and she goes for a barn that's been winning these 2-year-old turf routes with regularity. DYNASLEW has a nice turf pedigree for a barn long overdue to win.

RACE 3: TZIPI gets a perfect attack post in this spot and should be a factor from the opening bell. Enrique Arrovo is one of the best claiming trainers you've never heard of. TIGHT STORM chased tough customers downstate and should appreciate the drop. MUTAKAWAY wheels back on two weeks rest after the claim by Mike Trombetta and that's a mighty good sign

RACE 4: Take a deep breath and hope COCKTAIL ATTIRE hits the wire first in this sprint; she did everything but win in her local bow and should be that much tougher today. ARTISTIC TALENT is a threat once again, but she's been knocking at the door a little too long for me to fall in love. Not sure what to make of ONOITSMYMOTHERNLAW on the shortened trip but she won't have to sprout wings to fit.

RACE 5: CAPTAIN SWORD was claimed by Rick Dutrow Jr. after a halflength loss downstate; he should move forward mightily off that effort and looks tough to deny at about even-money. SOPHIE'S SPLINTER ran well against open company earlier in the meet and looms the main danger. SLICK WHEELIE figures off his start two back and can be forgiven for his last, when he caught slop against special-weights.

RACE 6: DANCING FERN gets to play against state-breds for the first time in her six-race career and should enjoy the company; comes in off a big allowance win at Delaware Park and could get set up nicely. ONE TOUGH BELLE has some hidden form and her last start on fast dirt would win this for fun. CRITICAL CATHY ran huge last time but benefited when the oddson favorite was eliminated at the break; gets no free passes today.

RACE 7: We almost got FITNESS home last time at almost 12-1, and though he'll be a third of that today he's still worth a play. The day's best bet should move forward and seemingly has only favorite MOGUL MAN to worry about. That one rates a long look off his last three but how much is left in the tank? QUICK COMEBACK will take them as far as he can on the engine.

RACE 8: VIVA LA FLAG has to win on Personal Ensign day, right? The Phipps' stable Friday color-bearer disappointed at Belmont Park but she's been freshened for a big run today. CAPRICE made a favorable first impression at DelPark and figures a major player. DUCHESS ROYALE has regrouped since a poor run in the Grade III Orchid and merits respect for a top turf barn.

RACE 9: The Graveyard of Favorites has claimed many over the years, including champion Ashado at 2-5 in this very race in 2005. With that in mind let's look for some value and take UNBRIDLED BELLE, who had little chance in the Del Cap after encountering some paddock woes prior to the race, and then monster Hystericalady during it. She figures to love the 10 furlongs, a distance that GINGER PUNCH may or may not appreciate. The champ is a deserving favorite but save her Phipps win at Belmont – which was at one turn - she really hasn't run faster than any she meets today. She's every bit of 1-2, so it's worth trying to beat her at a distance she's never tried. GOLDEN VELVET has run well at two turns and should get a nice trip today stalking a pace that figures to be very, very pedestrian.

RACE 10: C STREET gets a lot of bonus points for just missing against winners after breaking his maiden in his debut; he looks to have a very bright future that extends far beyond this allowance. SO IT GOES ran well against subsequent stakes winner Summer Patriot and drew a cozy post. MY MAN LARS wheels back on short rest after a big run in the West Point against state-breds Aug. 10.

Spotlight on UK Racing

Friday, August 22nd, Newmarket (UK) Race 4 (9:05 am) Darley Yorkshire Oaks Gr1 (3yo+ Fillies & Mares) 1m½; Purse \$325,000

RACE ANALYSIS (In Program Number Order)

- **ALLEGRETTO** Effective at this trip and further. Finished fourth in the Ascot Gold Cup in June, and she was second in this race last year. She runs in a visor here for the first time since then. Her trainer is a master with older horses, and he will most likely need to draw a little more from Allegretto than she has shown to date in order to win. Timeform Rating 124
- PASSAGE OF TIME A creditable third over this trip in the Prix Vermeille at Longchamp last October. She has belatedly confirmed on her last two runs that she retains the ability she showed as a three year old, winning a listed race at Newbury in July and then finishing a close-up third to Halfway To Heaven and Lush Lashes in the Nassau Stakes at Goodwood last time. 122
- CAPE AMBER Has been running in most of the major fillies' races this season, her best effort coming when second behind Lush Lashes in the Musidora Stakes at York. She tends to run freely, and that has seemed to prevent her from repeating her best form on her three outings since. It also suggests she may be better at short of today's trip. 114
- DAR RE MI Finished third in the Musidora Stakes, and has shown a fair amount of improvement since. Displayed smart form over this course and distance in a listed contest in July, having raced quite freely off a steady pace, then recorded her first pattern race success with a Gr2 win at Deauville. She's possibly capable of better still. 117
- **LUSH LASHES** Unlucky not to be a dual Gr1 winner already, winning the Coronation Stakes at Royal Ascot then beaten only a head after finding plenty of trouble in the Nassau Stakes. She's bred to stay twelve furlongs, but disappointed on her only previous attempt at the trip when a well-beaten favorite in the Oaks, so stamina must still be a worry. 129
- MICHITA Finished one place ahead of Lush Lashes in seventh at Epsom, looking unsuited by the course, then won the Ribblesdale Stakes at Royal Ascot over this distance, so her stamina is not in doubt. Unexposed after just five career runs but, on form, she has something to find with Lush Lashes. 124

CONCLUSION

Riding tactics could be interesting in this small field. This track, with its uphill finish, places more of an emphasis on stamina than York, which would not seem to suit LUSH LASHES given her performance in the Gr1 Juddmonte Oaks over 1 1/2 miles at Epsom. She has improved since then however, and she is so far ahead on form that she is worth another chance here. The resurgent Passage of Time was unsuited by the slow pace in the Gr1 Nassau at Goodwood on her last run, and was ultimately only beaten a head by Lush Lashes that day. She may well prove to be the main threat.



- BENBAUN Winner of last year's Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp. Fifth in this race in 2005 at its regular home. A poor tenth in the July Cup here on his latest start, but that was over a furlong further. Timeform Rating 124
- **BORDERLESCOTT** Stalwart of the handicapping scene. Showed very smart form, not to mention a great deal of early pace, when second in the Stewards' Cup at Goodwood on his latest start. 124
- **DANDY MAN** Has shown his form just once in three starts for his new stable, when fourth in the King's Stand Stakes at Royal Ascot. A poor third at Goodwood latest, he blew his chance by hanging right late on. 124
- DESERT LORD Speedy front-runner, he won the Prix de l'Abbaye in 2006. He has been quite inconsistent this season, and a disappointing run last time won't fill anyone with confidence. 119
- MOORHOUSE LAD Lightly raced this season, where he has been disappointing on both starts. Capable of very smart form, but it's over a year since he showed it. 124
- **PRIME DEFENDER** Creditable run on his only five-furlong outing of the season, second by a neck behind Ancien

- Regime. Unlucky seventh in the July Cup on his penultimate start, having found little room to mount a challenge. 121
- SAKHEE'S SECRET A high-class sprinter last season, winning the July Cup. Ran creditably when second in the Palace House Stakes on his reappearance (his first run over five furlongs). Disappointed in the Golden Jubilee Stakes at Royal Ascot latest, but possibly had excuses having been bumped and reportedly lost a shoe. 127
- **CAPTAIN GERRARD** Received 14 lb when the conqueror of Sakhee's Secret in the Palace House, ran poorly in France on his only subsequent start. A front-runner, with plenty of speed. 119
- EQUIANO Became the first Spanish-trained Gr1 winner when causing a shock in the King's Stand Stakes at Royal Ascot. Now trained in England, it will be interesting to see if he improves again on his second British start. 128
- 10 KINGSGATE NATIVE Won this race last year as a juvenile. He won't receive so much weight this year, but he proved he has trained on when winning the Golden Jubilee Stakes at Royal Ascot. He seemed to run out of steam over six furlongs here last time. 127
- 11 NATIONAL COLOUR Has made only one British start, finishing a smart sixth in the King's Stand, showing good speed. Won a minor event at the 2007 Dubai Carnival, but it is hard to get a handle on her form nevertheless. 119

- 12 FLASHMAN'S PAPERS 100/1 winner of the Windsor Castle Stakes at Royal Ascot. He has continued to show useful form since, and the stiffer track should help, but he has lot to find here. 114
- **PERCOLATOR** Speedy front running two year old who has been progressing all year, winning a French Gr3 on her penultimate outing. Needs to improve still further if she's to figure here. 122
- SHYRL Completes a trio of two year olds, and showed useful form when second in the Queen Mary Stakes at Royal Ascot. Hasn't gone on from that though, and refused to settle when disappointing in a listed race last time. That gives her a lot to find here. 111

CONCLUSION

An interesting renewal of this famous race, with both an unusual venue and an open field. Ability to see out five furlongs well is essential, and the stiffer finish at Newmarket may find out some of the front-runners. KINGSGATE NATIVE has a fine record at the top level and won this race last year as a two year old when run at York. After looking like six furlongs here at Newmarket blunted his strong finish last time, a testing five furlongs with plenty of pace throughout the field may be right up his street. The British Horseracing Authority weight allowance for two year olds is more generous than it should be, and Percolator is the youngster most likely to take advantage by running into a place at generous odds.

Waiting Game

For Wait A While, it was about pace

It didn't take long for John Velazquez to handicap Thursday's Ballston Spa Stakes. Five horses. Two possible pace scenarios. He'd be in front on Wait A While and Kent Desormeaux would stalk aboard Sharp Susan. Or Sharp Susan would be in front and Wait A While would stalk.

"Him or me," Velazquez said Wednesday. "It's simple."

A day later, Velazquez broke from the inside post aboard Wait A While and eyed Desormeaux, breaking from the 3 stall.

What's it going to be?

Velazquez instantly knew the answer. Him. Desormeaux scooted Sharp Susan to the lead and Velazquez knew he had one move to make, ease off the rail and get outside the pace.

From there it all came easily for the 4-5 favorite, who inhaled Sharp Susan when the time came and won by a comfortable length over late-running Carriage Trail and Rutherienne. Arindel Farm's 5-year-old mare collected her second straight Ballston Spa (Grade II) title, her third Saratoga stakes victory and 11th career victory. The win, worth

\$120,000 of a \$200,000 purse, nearly pushed her past the \$2 million mark. The daughter of Maria's Mon increased her bankroll to a cool \$1.94 million while going the 1 1/16 miles in 1:39.70 over the Mellon Turf.

This one was all about the pace.

"It worked out the way we thought," Velazquez said. "We knew if he goes, we'll lay second and if he doesn't go, we'd end up on the lead. He went pretty quick in front, it was much better than I thought."

Trainer Todd Pletcher watched from his box seat and begged Velazquez to make the move. That's why they win races together; Velazquez made it about the same time Pletcher pleaded for it.

"We talked about it in the paddock and I thought we'd be on the lead, the only other one that could go was Sharp Susan," Pletcher said. "When she went, I couldn't tell what Johnny was going to do, I was like, 'Let that one go, let that one go, let that one go.' It was almost like he heard me because he did it right then."

Hey, that's why he's leading rider at the meet.

Sharp Susan refused to settle through a quick opening quarter-mile in 23.93 seconds and a half in 47.08. She opened 3 lengths heading down the backside while Wait A While traveled smoothly in second. Carriage Trail (Edgar Prado) sat third with Valbenny (Ramon Dominguez) and the confirmed closer Rutherienne (Julien Leparoux) in last. Velazquez knew Sharp Susan was rolling on the lead. How did he know?

"By my horse. By how my horse is moving. She's relaxed, going a good pace, but not overdoing it. If we go 48 and change, she's going to be pulling my guts out, believe me, no matter what," Velazquez said. "I rode her before, I know it, especially on this kind of track. As we got to the first turn he went on and she didn't pull, you can see she's in a good rhythm."

Desormeaux tried to slip away at the half-mile pole. Nobody bit.

"He opened up 3 lengths on me down the backside, I was like, 'I'm not taking any of that, I'm going to wait and

bide my time.' It worked out perfectly," Velazquez said. "I caught up with him at the five sixteenths pole and then I waited until I felt Prado's horse come, I got after her and I had the other one inside so I'm kind of pushing the other one in, Prado was the only one running down the lane but she responded right away."

Making her second start after a sixmonth layoff due to a stress fracture in her left tibia, Wait A While performed like she never left. Time forced Pletcher's hand earlier in the meet, as he ran Wait A While in the Diana over a rainsoaked turf course. She went off the favorite that day but struggled over the good turf, finishing seventh. She breezed twice since that performance. A halfmile move Aug.15 convinced Pletcher the old Wait A While was back.

"I thought her work the other day was as good as she's ever worked, Pletcher said. "She tipped her hand, she came out of it well, I had a positive feeling. When you know she's training well, doing well, you know she's good on this turf course, you get confident. The only concern I had was with the weather, the rain Tuesday morning, I was like, 'Oh, man, we're getting close.' I felt pretty good when they ran that five and a half race earlier and they went in 1:02 and 2, it looked like the Mellon turf was firmer than the inner turf. Once I saw that, my confidence level was pretty high. Everything seemed to be coming together."

Wait A While injured herself after winning the San Gorgonio at Santa Anita in her 5-year-old debut this January. Pletcher conferred with owner Alan Cohen and everyone decided to give her the time and bring her back for the Saratoga meet.

"It's really a credit to Mr. Cohen," Pletcher said. "A lot of guys would have stopped and bred her but she's such a good mare, we told him, 'Look, we're confident, this thing will heal, we've got to just give her time and she will come back.' The Breeders' Cup was always the target anyway so we could give her

enough time. The decision on his part was clear, 'She's going to be OK, let's run her.' She's been perfect."

Wait A While made her career debut at Saratoga in 2005. She finished fifth that day and broke her maiden on the turf in the fall. Pletcher returned her to the dirt where she won the Miss Grillo (after it was rained off the turf) and the Grade II Davona Dale at a sloppy Gulfstream Park. She picked up placings in the Grade I Ashland and Kentucky Oaks before going back to the turf, picking off the American Oaks, Lake Placid and Yellow Ribbon on her way to a champi-

onship in 2006. Last year, she won two of six starts including a front-running score in the Honey Fox and a late arriving win in the Ballston Spa.

"It's the fourth year we've had her at Saratoga. From her 2-year-old year, we liked her then, she was champion 3-year-old, some of her best races have come here, the Lake Placid, the two Ballston Spas," Pletcher said. "She's run great here and we know she likes Santa Anita so we're excited about the Yellow Ribbon and maybe the Breeders' Cup if all goes well. That could be it, chances are this will be her last year."





Mare's win brings blue skies to Albertrani

The dark cloud hanging over Trouble Maker dissipated Thursday as she drew into, then won, the \$83,500 Old Red Stakes, giving trainer Tom Albertrani his first victory of the meet.

Tough luck had followed the 5-yearold of late; her last start ended with

a bob-of-the-head defeat to Carriage Trail in the De La Rose. Prior to that, she endured a three-wide trip over the Belmont Park lawn to finish third, by a neck, in the Caress.

But when Chestoria scratched and Trouble Maker drew in off the alsoeligible list for Thursday's 1-mile turf stakes, the worm began to turn.

Bred by Albert and Randy Cohen and owned by Hickory Plains Farm, the daughter of Labeeb avoided trouble and tough luck to score her first win since July 2007. Eibar Coa placed Trouble Maker nicely along the back-

stretch just a few lengths off the leaders. On the turn, the jockey made a threewide move, and drove home to win by a half-length over hard-charging Lady Carlock (Robby Albarado), with Final Refrain (Channing Hill) third.

Albertrani enjoyed himself Thursday, exiting both the AE list and the duck (winless) list.


"Oh, it made my luck change a little bit," the trainer said. "Last time was a tough loss. When I saw she got in I thought maybe the luck is changing."

Last time, Trouble Maker ran huge, but the nose of Carriage Trail claimed top honors in the De La Rose. Albertrani made the decision to bring his mare back because of the way she looked af-

"She came out of the last race training well enough to come back in just three weeks. She held her form well and she deserved to win," he said. "A mile is her limit; I think between seven-eighths and 1 mile is best for her."

Coa, who notched a hat trick Thursday, piloted Trouble Maker to her hardfought second in the De La Rose, and was out to settle scores as well.

"We got a little redemption today. Last time was a very, very tough beat. I felt so bad for all the connections," Coa said. "When a horse tries that hard and doesn't win, it's tough. I knew that she was going to come back and I was hoping for a good trip. And let me tell you, I had a perfect trip out there. I didn't have the best post but the horses inside of me had speed, so I knew they would clear and then I could get over. In the lane when I asked her, she really responded with the way she was supposed to. She really gave me a good run. I knew after last time, when she tried so hard, that she was going to come back and run her race today. I knew if she came back and ran her race it was going to be just fine."

Just Lovely

Sheppard, Pape, Hodson and horse enjoy Saratoga Springs

The Price Of Love came north looking for attention. Jonathan Sheppard came to Saratoga looking to add to his Hall of Fame resume. Bill Pape traveled looking for an excuse to stay through the Grade I New York Turf Writers Cup Aug. 28.

Danielle Hodsdon made sure everybody got their wish.

Hodsdon gave Pape's The Price Of Love a perfectly timed ride – for the second time this meet – and the Sheppard trainee did the rest, holding off a late charge from favored Dynaski to take the \$70,000 Mickey Walsh Stakes by a measured neck.

"He's the type of horse that loves attention and I think he's thrived up here because of it," Hodsdon said. "Up here with a nine-horse string, instead of at the farm with 50, they get a lot of personalized attention and I think he really, really thrives on that."


The Price Of Love broke running in the 2 3/8-mile contest and Hodsdon was able to negotiate a ground-saving

trip behind early leader Red Letter Day, who set a measured pace up front. Wellbacked Seer (Xavier Aizpuru) traveled in tandem, to the outside of The Price Of Love while Dynaski (Padge Whelan) was content to track in behind on the hedge.

Red Letter Day took the field by the stands for the final time and the procession continued to the clubhouse turn. And then a race broke out. Aizpuru moved Seer up on the outside of Hodsdon and The Price Of Love as the leaders hit the turn. The cadence quickened on the backstretch and Red Letter Day reasserted himself on the lead. Seer and The Price Of Love sharpened their knives behind the leader as Dynaski began revving up in fourth.

Hodsdon eased the Price Of Love outside turning for home and the 5-year-old stuck a head in front of Red Letter Day, with Seer following that move to the outside. Whelan began urging Dynaski behind the trio and as the field straightened away in the lane the decision remained undecided. The Price

Of Love flew the last while Seer almost went to his knees. Dynaski lost momentum over the final hurdle and The Price Of Love drew clear in mid-stretch. Dynaski got going late, making a last-ditch attempt at the winner only to fall short by a neck, the same margin he carried over Seer.

The win was the second of the meet for Hodsdon and The Price Of Love, who she guided to another ground-saving score in the Jonathan Kiser novice July 31.

"We fell into a pretty trip out there and it worked out perfectly. My horse tends to be very keen and there looked to be a few speed horses in there, so I figured I would try and hold mine in behind," Hodsdon said. "I was really lucky

that the pack was happy to go steady and I was able to let Red Letter Day open up a little bit. My horse really relaxed out there today and he jumped 100 percent better than he did last time, when he was in tight quarters."

Prior to the Kiser score, the homebred ran a distant third to Be Certain and Planets Aligned in the Grade II National Hunt Cup at Radner May 17. Sheppard backet

nor May 17. Sheppard backed off and gave The Price Of Love a training flat race at Open House July 20 before aiming for the Kiser, where his charge avenged his earlier defeat to Be Certain

"He likes being up here a lot, and the freshening has helped a lot. He had a couple of pretty hard races this spring; the race at Middleburg when he was second by a neck; he carried a lot of weight. Then he came back at Radnor and that was his first stake," Hodsdon said. "I think the freshening helped and then flat run (at the Open House) helped too. After that we just tuned him up and didn't have to do much with him before the last race. At Radnor he didn't handle the ground and that's been the only race that he's been beat a good distance. I just don't think he likes the softer ground; he wants to be on top of it on a firmer, faster surface."

Pape has won with The Price Of Love and Look At Him with Sheppard at Saratoga this summer. They entered the Spa season long on talent but short on accomplishments. Look At Him hadn't won since taking a maiden in October 2006. The Price Of Love had only a Camden maiden win, March 29, to his credit.

What a difference a summer in Saratoga can make. Look At Him took the George Sloan Aug. 14 and heads to the Turf Writers next Thursday. The Price Of Love now rates as a two-time stakes winner and one of the most exciting hurdle prospects for the fall.

"It's been a great summer and the horses have run great," Pape said. "We've got this one behind us and we're looking forward now to the Turf Writers. I think I'll hang around for it – I've got a good reason to."

• If you can't find Dominic Galluscio at the track, you're just not trying. The trainer's sartorial selections are as vibrant and varied as the rainbows that have graced the Saratoga sky this summer. And that's no coincidence.

"I've got all the colors in the rainbow," said Galluscio in the winner's circle Thursday, resplendent in a red sports coat.

Robbins' Brooker D took the second, a \$25,000 claimer, over Game Of Skill (Jose Espinoza) and Tenacious Star (Rudy Rodriguez).

Eibar Coa gunned the 4-year-old to the lead and they instantly shook free, clocking a quarter mile in 22.76 seconds, rolling through a half in 45.94 and increasing their advantage under the line to coast home 3 1/2 lengths clear.

Galluscio entered the day just 1-for-24 but had seven seconds and four thirds to his credit. Thursday he gave credit to Coa, who ranks as one of the best gate riders on the circuit.

"When you have a good rider it makes all the difference. (The horse) broke sharp and Coa got him over and was able to get in front," Galluscio said. "Our horses have been running good, it's been frustrating. I've got all these seconds and some thirds. But the horses have been running good."

• Even though the main course isn't until Saturday afternoon Bill Casner wasn't averse to having a little appetizer Thursday. WinStar Farm's chairman and co-owner, who'll have Colonel John in the \$1 million Travers tomorrow, visited the winner's circle yesterday when Mickeless (Channing Hill) took the fourth race over Prominent (Rajiv Maragh) and Key Trip (Coa).

Bob Dunham trained the winner, a 3-year-old daughter of Cherokee Run who was winless in her first five starts. Hill bided his time in seventh while Caitie Boo set a quick half in 45.91. Tipping four-wide turning for home Mickeless rallied down the center of the track to win by 2 1/2 lengths at better than 17-1.

"Hopefully this is the start to a good weekend. It's the perfect way to get it going, that's for sure," Casner said. "This filly was nice surprise today. She's been training well and Bob's done a nice job with her. She's been a hard-luck filly; she's been a bit green and had some tough trips. We have four horses with Bob and it's great to see him win up here, he's a class guy."

• Invisible Ink finished second in the 2001 Kentucky Derby, and Peachtree Stable's John Fort is still proud of him. So much so that Fort went out looking for sons of Invisible Ink to add to his stable. The result was Beckham Bend, winner of Thursday's fifth; the getting there was difficult.

"I put a little ad out looking for some Invisible Inks," Fort said, "so I wind up going down to Florida. This lady had two mares, and some oak trees and a field, but not a blade of grass. This is a place where they don't really deal with people; she'd send someone out to get her cigarettes or whatever. She didn't get out much. When they get up in the morning they'd just get to work with what they had on. So this lady puts on her coat, with her nightgown on underneath. She's got curlers in her hair. Her lead is just a rope with a clip at the end. We can't catch (Beckham Bend). She finally gets him and the colt takes off and starts dragging this lady for five or ten yards, curlers in her hair, nightgown on, until she finally lets go. So I say 'OK, I'll buy that one,' since I've already put this lady through all that. But we still can't get him. So I say, 'Can we shoot him with a tranquilizer gun?' So we shot him with the tranquilizer dart."

Fort's purchase and unique experience paid off when Beckham Bend (Alan Garcia) split horses in midstretch and edged clear to win the \$45,000 maiden claimer by 1 3/4 lengths. Propensity (Sebastian Morales) finished second and Handsome Sport (Jose Espinoza) finished third. The triple paid a ridiculously large \$6,197, while the superfecta paid a stupendous \$102,977.



Eoin Harty stood outside of the walking ring at his barn Thursday morning

and asked Colonel John a question he knew the steely bay couldn't possibly answer.

"So, can you handle the dirt?"

Predictably, Colonel John stood there and then went about enjoying a scenic morning on the Saratoga backstretch while offering little in the form of a response. Not that Harty needed one.

"The dirt is no concern for me," Harty said. "The other people seem worried about, it but I'm not."

Normally based in California, Colonel John hit the Saratoga main track for the first time Thursday morning and galloped 1 1/2 miles, using each giant stride to further remove himself from the label of

synthetic-track specialist. WinStar Farm's 3-year-old enters Saturday's \$1 million Travers Stakes as a major contender, and Harty saw nothing in his morning gallop to make him think otherwise.

"He's being very wellbehaved," Casner remarked as Harty peered

intently at Colonel John's fluid gallop. Colonel John continued around the far turn and through the stretch before reaching the clubhouse turn for the second time. As his horse motored through

Colonel John walked onto the track at 9:04 with exercise rider Carl Aulsup in the irons and slowly traveled the wrong way to the frontstretch while accompanied by a stable pony. He reversed direction and gathered momentum as he hit the clubhouse turn for the first time. Harty and WinStar's Bill Casner watched from the backstretch as Colonel John went past.

marked to Casner: "He's giving this kid all he can handle, I knew he'd pick it up the second time around." Colonel John continued to the far

turn and gradually slowed as he went through the stretch.

The strapping son of Tiznow exited the track through the backstretch gap and Harty and Casner kept a watchful eye as Colonel John was led back to the barn.

"He seemed to handle it well out there. He was very sensible and I was happy with the way he went. It didn't look like he had any trouble with the surface at all," Harty said. "There are always some anxious moments anytime

you bring a good horse onto the track but he looked great this morning."

Colonel John rose to the top of several Kentucky Derby polls last winter based on his fast-closing second in the Grade I CashCall Futurity over Hollywood Park's Cushion Track. He started his 3-year-old campaign with a hardfought win in the Grade III Sham over Santa Anita's synthetic surface March 1 and expanded his reputation when he closed with a rush to win the Grade I Santa Anita Derby April 5. The win sent Colonel John to Kentucky as one of the main challengers to favorite Big Brown. The son of Tiznow also went to Kentucky looking to test conventional dirt for the first time.

A 5-furlong workout in a quick 57.80 seconds April 27, left little doubt to the horse's ability to handle the main track. He started in the Derby as the second choice behind Big Brown and ran well to finish sixth while mired in traffic. Saturday he gets another chance to show he's capable of handling a conventional racing surface in the afternoon.

Harty watched as Colonel John cooled out after his gallop. Stopping to pose for pictures, the California invader seemed quite at home at Saratoga.

"Look at him, he's just a big ham," Harty said. "He's from California and everyone wants to be a movie star out there – even the horses."

A Travers win would go a long way toward securing a leading role.


How do you balance family and work when you have to spend so much time at the barn and you have a young child at home? — Las Vegas, Nevada





Father knows best

Ramon Dominguez hung up on his

He tried to end the conversation gracefully. His biggest critic kept criticizing his ride aboard Deal Making in the Hall of Fame Stakes Aug. 4.

Yeah, Dominguez was frustrated with his slow start to the meet and he was even more frustrated by his ride on Deal Making. Dominguez allowed Javier Castellano aboard eventual winner, Wesley, to get first run on the turn while getting hemmed behind a wall of horses. Deal Making never had a chance.

"My dad follows my career closely. He can be pretty critical at times, he's pretty objective, but he doesn't sugarcoat things," Dominguez said. "When I finish the day's races, I talk to him. We don't always talk about horses but sometimes he'll be like, 'You know, I think you're doing this, you're doing that.' Sometimes he can get to me. But what bothers me the most, a lot of times he's right."

Dominguez feels like Deal Making was the best horse in the turf stakes. He chose to wait while Castellano decided to move and then nothing happened. The wall of horses in front never opened. Dominguez knows his decisions cost him the race.

"He should have won and it didn't happen. I could have handled it differently. I should have come out earlier, I should have anticipated," Dominguez said. "My dad got to me. It was the most critical he's ever been, of any ride I've ever given a horse. At the end, it's my dad, he really worries about me and he wants the best for me, but I hung up on him. Yeah, actually, I hung up on him. I called him back and we talked about it."

Deal Making was only part of the frustration as Dominguez endured a glacial start to the meet. He began 1-for-38. Yeah, that's frustrating.

"I don't want to think that I was riding the best horse and getting them beat. I don't want to say I was just riding bad horses, period, and I had nothing to do with it. But I'd be lying to you if I said I wasn't worried, that I knew it would pick up," Dominguez said. "You just try to continue to do the same things and not make any drastic changes. I really feel like I handled it pretty well, try and stay focused and do what I feel like has brought me here. I'm here because, hopefully, I've done things right in the past."

Maybe it was the phone call or simply timing or luck, but Dominguez began to

right the ship somewhere after that slow beginning. With 10 cards remaining, he has clawed to sixth in the standings. With 20 wins, he lies seven back of leader John Velazquez. No, the 31-year-old Venezuelan probably won't be leading rider but he's certainly a long way from that woeful start.

"Things started falling into place, I didn't feel like, 'Wow, I'm really rolling now,' but at one point I stopped and looked and said, 'My God, I've really moved up in the standings.' I try to take it day by day," Dominguez said. "At the same time I was trying not to overreact and be like, 'Oh my God, what am I doing?' If this happened seven years ago, I'd have been a nervous wreck. You're always under so much pressure, you feel like you're supposed to show that you can do it. But it's not always up to you. I'm glad I didn't overreact."

Dominguez landed the riding title at the Aqueduct winter meet and rides the rest of the year at Delaware Park. Actually riding is an understatement. He dominates the jockey colony at Delaware. He's been away for a month and he's still 35 wins and nearly \$1 million ahead of his closest pursuer. Dominguez has made the same move in the past, but moving tack from Delaware to Saratoga takes adjustment.

"I don't ride the favorite nine out of 10 times here like I do at Delaware and because of that it makes it a little more challenging. You can't afford to make mistakes like you can at Delaware," Dominguez said. "Overall it makes you a better rider. Definitely, you learn new things every day here, you're riding against the best riders in the world. Horse racing at a different level. I like it. I don't like getting beat, especially when you're used to winning two or three a day. Now, looking back, I feel like it's really doing something for my career."

"Ginger Punch is the best filly in the country," Dominguez said. "We'll see, I wouldn't trade horses."




