

Golden Ticket, Alpha share Grade 1 heroics

Walking down the stairs from the box seats, Kiaran McLaughlin looked across the track to the big screen in the infield. He uttered one word that summed up the 143rd Travers Stakes.

"Tight."

The replay ran again, the crowd rising to a crescendo as McLaughlin's Alpha and Ken McPeek's Golden Ticket dropped their noses on the line.

"Too close to call," McLaughlin said.

On the landing between the flights of stairs, the two trainers met. Like lights coming on at the end of a sixth-grade dance, they stood, staring, mumbling, bumbling.

"Not bad for two Lexington boys," McPeek said.

"I'll take a dead heat," McLaughlin said.

The two trainers stared at the infield screen – RACE 12 in white bulbs, top left. PHOTO, blinking in red on the right. SPLIT TIMES, stacked on the bottom right. Nothing on the left side.

McPeek repeated the number 3 in his head. McLaughlin, repeated the number 6, trying to will the outcome as anybody who's ever waited for a photo does

"3. 3. 3. 3. 3. 3. 3. 3."

"6. 6. 6. 6. 6. 6. 6. 6. "

Family, friends and owners stacked up, a woman lost her shoe and nearly toppled down the stairs,

NBC rolled its cameras, photo-finish readers tossed out their opinions like they mattered. Still, two trainers watched, an inch away from agony, an inch away from ecstasy.

Boom – 3, 6, 11, 7 slid across the board. McPeek thrust both fists in the air, unleashing the

"My dad is a 5th generation trainer and my mom managed the farm. I was 14 when she started New Vocations. A trailer arrived to drop off a horse at our farm and it had several nice Thoroughbreds on board. My mom asked the shipper where the others were going. 
number which he had been silently reciting. McLaughlin stood silent, unflinching. Seconds ticked. Then, McLaughlin screamed, "Dead heat."

And there it was, DEAD HEAT in red bulbs next to the numbers.

McPeek and McLaughlin clutched, clawed, hugged, slapped each other and anybody as the realization that there would be no losers resonated on the trainers and the massive Travers Day crowd.

"That's wonderful," McPeek said.

"We'll take it," McLaughlin said.

Lightning bolts flashed in the distance. No kidding. Magic City Thoroughbreds' Golden Ticket received the blanket of red carnations first, Cohen throwing the flowers in the air as the dark bay colt walked into the winner's circle. Neal McLaughlin stood in the center of the dirt, watching Alpha and Ramon Dominguez, "That was huge. That was huge," McLaughlin repeated as the blanket of carnations was draped over Alpha's neck. Dominguez looked at the sky, acknowl-

edging a higher being that certainly seemed viable. On paper, the Travers lacked star power. On the track, it had the galaxy.

From the rail, longshot Speightscity broke cleanly and outran Stealcase into the first turn as Cohen eased longshot Golden Ticket back between the leaders. Dominguez guided Alpha, the favorite, into a comfortable spot in third, outside and stalking the leaders. Through a quarter mile in 23.51 seconds, Speightscity led with Stealcase on his flank, Alpha sat outside in third, Golden Ticket relaxed in fourth. Neck n' Neck lost ground around the first turn but found a spot in fifth. Nonios, Five Sixteen, Street Life and Atigun made up the next phalanx. Liaison and Fast Falcon lagged well off the lead.

After a half in 48.06 and three quarters in 1:12.62, Stealcase engaged Speightscity, Alpha swung into gear on the outside, Golden Ticket waited on the rail and Neck 'n Neck, Nonios and Atigun made big moves on the outside. Passing the quarter pole, Alpha took over four wide as Cohen made the move of the race, sliding Golden Ticket through on the rail, like a credit card down a lock, cutting the corner and instantly gaining an advantage on Alpha. The longshot rolled past the eighth pole with a length lead over the Jim Dandy winner. The rest were floundering except for Fast Falcon who blew past the tiring pretenders, but had a lot to do to catch the leaders.

Dominguez rapped Alpha right handed as Cohen implored Golden Ticket with right-handed smacks. At the sixteenth pole, Golden Ticket still maintained his advantage as Alpha appeared to stall. Fast Falcon



loomed from the outside, finally getting past Atigun and getting into the peripheral vision of Alpha who surged in the final strides. The 33-1 longshot on the rail, attempting to win his second career race and the 2-1 favorite going for the Jim Dandy/Travers double on the outside.

Cohen buried his head in Golden Ticket's mane, pushing like he was trying to drown an enemy. Dominguez stayed high above Alpha's mane, pumping like he was trying to walk on water. The two jockeys certain of the effort, uncertain of the outcome.

"I had my head buried, trying to push the horse's head to the ground if I had to. On the gallop out,

there's Ramon right next to me, Alpha, I knew he wasn't far away," Cohen said. "Ramon asked me, 'Do you think you got it?' When you get a question like that from a guy that knows the wire so well, you think to yourself, 'Hold on a second, maybe it's a little closer than I thought.' When they announced it as a dead heat, me and Ramon just took it in stride. I accept a dead heat in a 10 claimer, let alone, a million-dollar race, the Travers."

Dominguez wouldn't have changed a thing either.

"I thought I got up, I really did," Dominguez said. "I'm three wide the whole time, if I had to do it all over again, I'd do it the same way, but he cut the corner nicely and opened up on me. By the eighth pole, I said, 'Man, I don't know if I'm going to be able to get him.' I kept after him and he kept coming. I didn't know Fast Falcon was coming. At the wire, I heard Alvarado scream. I said, 'thank you,' I think that helped that last little bit."

Golden Ticket took six tries to break his maiden, finally graduating in an offthe-turf maiden at Gulfstream in February. He returned to finish second in the Tampa Bay Derby, fifth in the Lexington in April at Keeneland and second in a first-level allowance at Churchill Downs in early May. McPeek looked for a first-level allowance, then tried an overnight stakes Friday. Neither filled so he took his third option and entered him in the Travers.


"His only bad races are when I ran him short, turf and Poly. If you look at his dirt form, he's never done anything wrong. I'm thrilled," McPeek said. "David gave him a fantastic ride, we had been working on it all week, talking about what he needed to do and he nailed it."


While McPeek searched for an allowance spot for Golden Ticket, McLaughlin had two races on his mind. After a disappointing run in the Derby and a missed assignment in the Belmont when coming up with a fever, Alpha shipped to Saratoga with the Jim Dandy and Travers on his docket. The Jim Dandy was checked off with a front-running tally over a sloppy surface, there wasn't an anxious moment. The Travers, well, the Travers came down to the last inch, the last head bob.

"At first, I thought it was 3, and it was OK, then I saw the dead heat, so it's great. Just great," McLaughlin said. "I liked our trip, but when that other horse squirted away from us at the three-sixteenths pole, I was concerned, I didn't think we were going to get there. The Travers is up there with the best of them and to win it like that, in a dead heat..."

McLaughlin's voiced tailed off. In the distance, Cohen rode out for the last on a pick-up ride. McPeek walked back to the jocks' room for a press conference and Dominguez pulled off Godolphin's silks and took a gulp from a bottle of water.

Four men, two horses, one result.

Claim to Fame

Willy Beamin adds Gr. 1 to growing list of feats

Claiming 101, now in session. Your professor, owner Jim Riccio from New Jersey. He's been going to the races forever, handicapping, studying, watching, listening. He's owned horses good and not so, in partnerships and alone, for years.

And then he spent \$25,000 on New York-bred maiden winner Willy Beamin.

"You spend \$25,000, you're hoping he can win the allowance race," Riccio said. "Be real. That's all you're looking for. We were just looking for a horse. For \$25,000, he's a horse."


Make that THE Horse.

Five months after that claim, and just three days after winning the Albany here for New York-breds, Willy Beamin upset the Foxwoods King's Bishop. The \$500,000 Grade 1, known for producing stallions, went to a gelding. Owned by Riccio, trained by Rick Dutrow and ridden by Alan Garcia, the son of Suave ran away from the stars to win by a half-length over Fort Loudon in 1:22.02 for 7 furlongs with Unbri-See *KING'S BISHOP* page 14 ▶



dled's Note a nose back in third. The winner improved to 7-for-11 lifetime and nearly doubled his career earnings with the \$300,000 first-place check.

The moment was not lost on the owner.

"Back in the day you had to go to the track every day so I used to go every day," he said while walking to the trustees room. "I'd take Saratoga off, take a break, go down to Wildwood Crest, take the family. I'd watch the Saratoga races when they were on, but I never thought of this. Winning a Grade 1 in Saratoga? It's unbelievable."

The story would be, if it weren't

Bred by Patricia Staskowski Purdy of Ivy League Farm in Ithaca, Willy Beamin sold at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky sale as a yearling in October 2010 for \$16,000. He made his debut in October 2011 at Belmont, and lost by 15 lengths in state-bred company. Two starts later, at Aqueduct in November, he graduated the maiden ranks by a head. He lost a state-bred stakes by a dozen lengths to close 2011, then opened 2012 with a 16-length loss in New York-bred allowance company. Then came the drop to a \$25,000 open claimer March 23. It was his last start for MeB Racing Stable and trainer Dominick Schettino.

The bay gelding won at less than 2-1, got claimed and added five more

wins – rising up the improbability ladder through state-bred allowance in May, state-bred optional claimer June 20, the state-bred Mike Lee Stakes four days later, the Albany here Wednesday and now the King's Bishop.

Entries closed for the Grade 1 on the same day as the Albany. Willy Beamin drew the rail in a field of 10, won the Albany with ease and went back to Dutrow's barn on the Oklahoma side in the care of assistant and brother Chip. Saturday, the horse went back to the starting gate at better than 11-1 against a tough group. Currency Swap was unbeaten over the track. Trinniberg started in the Kentucky Derby, won a Grade 2 and was 3-for-4 at the distance. The field included the first six finishers from the Grade 2 Amsterdam here July 29.

Nobody bothered to tell Willy Bea-

He allowed the others to tackle the pace chores. Trinniberg led by a length after a quarter-mile in 22.28 seconds and a half in 45.13. Doctor Chit and Currency Swap stalked the leader, followed by Fort Loudon and Unbridled's Note. Garcia let Willy Beamin find his stride early, pushed him to keep a spot inside Laurie's Rocket, came around a tiring Gun Boat, then slid four wide at the top of the stretch to launch a bid. In front of him, Doctor Chit, Trinniberg, Currency Swap, Fort Loudon and Unbridled's Note slugged it out to the eighth pole. One by one, they yielded, and the New York-bred swept past late

with ground devouring strides.

"I was so comfortable turning for home when I asked my horse to get running, he took off and got in the bridle," Garcia said. "I said, 'I'm going to be in the money.' Then, I was like, 'Wow, I can win this race,' and I put my head down and kept riding to the wire. It was a totally different race (than the Albany), but this horse can run anything, he came from behind this time, last time he had an easy lead and was galloping."

The inside post actually worked perfectly on the turn back to 7 furlongs from 9. Willy Beamin led throughout in the two-turn Albany, never made the front until the final stages in the one-turn King's Bish-

"We probably didn't want the one hole but after I watched it we probably did want the one hole," said Riccio, whose son Jim Jr. is Garcia's agent. "He stayed away from the speed, saved the ground and came with a run. My son really liked this race. He was the one talking about the cut back."

In the trustees room, Riccio talked to Dutrow on the phone – answering with an exclamatory "Wow," and took calls from friends at the OTB in Bayonne and a string of well-wishers. His shirt was sweatsoaked, the right arm of his suit jacket smeared in mud. Between phone calls, text messages, the looping replay on the screen on the wall, he tried to make dinner plans and kept shaking his head, laughing at

"I had a good feeling, I really did, I just thought he'd show up," Riccio said. "When you claim a horse with Rick, it's not like you're expecting this but it's not a pipe dream either. You take some and they work out, you take some and they don't. Then, you take one and it really works out."

Baffert filly streaks home to take Grade 1

Jimmy Barnes stood at the quarter-pole gap on the main track, waiting for New York-bred Brigand to finish his last major exercise before he made his Saratoga debut in Saturday's first. Barnes' boss, Bob Baffert bedded down six horses in John Terranova's barn at Saratoga this summer. Four were due to run on Travers Day. Brigand was a lock in the first, Contested looked strong in the Test, Gun Boat had a chance in the King's Bishop and Liaison was one of a handful of horses who were live in the Travers.

Two out of four will do.

Brigand won the first and, most importantly, Contested won the Test.

Owned by Baffert's wife, Jill, Contested showed no ramifications from her last-place finish in the Grade 1 Mother Goose in June. That loss snapped a four race winning streak which included romps in the Eight Belles at Churchill Downs and the Grade 1 Acorn at Belmont Park. Stretched to 1 1/16 miles in the Mother Goose, Contested led ear-

ly before fading badly to last. Barnes blamed the track, listed as good but more like grandmom's stew.

"She was exhausted, that's not her. In hindsight we should have scratched," Barnes said. "I didn't handle it too well. She was fine with it."

Baffert sent the daughter of Ghostzapper back to his Del Mar base, primed her with five solid breezes and came back to avenge her last New York flop.

Contested buckled for a couple of strides out of the gate, spotting a quick gap to Ullapool and Gypsy Robin, crossing the chute in fifth as the leaders ripped through the first quarter-mile in 21.49 seconds. Bejarano asked Contested to keep her position, clearing Well Kept and Beautiful But Blue to her inside. Once past those two, Contested took a deep breath, nearly 6 lengths off Ullapool and 3 lengths behind Gypsy Robin through a half in 44.09. Out of

the turn, Ullapool succumbed to Gypsy Robin as Contested swept three wide, ready to pounce. Like a tom cat, she roared past Gypsy Robin and kept to the task to win by 2 lengths over Gypsy Robin who held off Beautiful But Blue by a half-length. Contested finished 7 furlongs in 1:22.47.

In her four previous victories, Contested has done it both ways, stalking for two wins and streaking for two wins. Barnes expected what she gave.

"She doesn't need to be sent, she can break and sit just off the leaders, you have to leave it up to Rafael, play the break, if you happen to catch a flyer, so be it, if you don't, just be patient and give her a chance to win," Barnes said Friday morning. "The outside post helps, if you're down on the inside, you have to play your hand, being on the outside, I like that a lot.'

Bejarano loved it. Aboard for the first time, he didn't gun nor did he defend, allowing Contested to pick her way through the 7-furlong stakes like a proper even-money shot, keeping her in the clear throughout.

"After the break, I saw those two horses, they ran away from the gate, I tried to save my position, just stay right behind them and hoped she would come running," Bejarano said. "The way it turned out, it benefitted me when she broke like that, it was good for me when those two horses ran away like that, I was in a perfect position, save a little bit and I assume

French Toast

Zagora sets course record in Grade 2 score

French bloodstock agent Michel Zerolo was on the phone, but he might have heard Martin Schwartz in Paris anyway.

"One-thirty-nine. Flat! Can you believe it?" Schwartz bellowed while bounding from the boxes to the winner's circle after the Ballston Spa Stakes Saturday. "A new track record, Michel. She blew them away. She's going on."

Schwartz owns Zagora, bought her from Zerolo, and the 5-year-old mare did in fact set a track record in the 1 1/16-mile Ballston Spa – blasting past Summer Soiree in the stretch to win by 1 1/2 lengths over Hungry Island in 1:39.07. Summer Soiree held third in the \$250,000 Grade 2.

Zagora won for the fourth time in six starts this year and once again made a believer out of Brown.

"She had put in two breezes that I would term excellent and I'm a stickler for giving out grades on my horses that work," said the trainer. "Her last two

since the Diana I graded excellent. I expected her to run really well. Can you ever predict a horse is going to break a track record? No, never, but she was spectacular."

The French-bred daughter of Green Tune came into the race off a third behind Winter Memories and Dream Peace in the Diana here July 28. Trying to repeat her score in the Grade 1, Zagora didn't show quite as much late punch as she normally does in the defeat thanks in part to a 10-week layoff with a splint, some soft (ish) turf and salty competition.

Everything went better Saturday.

Zagora settled off the pace of Summer Soiree, who blazed through early fractions of 23.70 seconds for a quarter-mile, 46.35 for the half and 1:09.44 for 6 furlongs. She led by 3 lengths early, followed by Tapitsfly, Thundering

Emilia and Zagora to the inside. Ramon Dominguez didn't ask for anything until late on the final turn and she responded. Off the corner, Zagora leveled off and went after the leader – taking over in mid-stretch, stopping the clock at 1:33.13 for the mile (which would have been a record), and turning aside Hungry Island's late rally.

"The race set up good, it always helps when Winter Memories is not in the race, but she did everything great, when I went for her, she finished up really nice for me," said Dominguez. "I was confident, you never know how they're really going to respond the last part but if I had to guess just judging by how well she was taking me, I was very happy how she was handling the opening the two fillies had on me, on firm ground, they were close to each other, I figured they had to be going quick."

The final time broke the mark of 1:39.92, set by Leroidesanimaux (whom Brown worked with while in Bobby Frankel's barn) in 2005.

Zagora opened 2012 with back-toback wins at Tampa Bay Downs and was fifth in the Grade 1 Jenny Wiley at Keeneland. She came back to win the Gallorette at Pimlico on Preakness Day and briefly went to the sidelines.

"She had a splint and lost some time," said Schwartz. "She only had four breezes and she was a little flat in the Diana. I'm very proud of her and happy for her because I had to listen last time that she'd lost a step. She hasn't lost a step."

Brown lauded the mare's power in the stretch, and was happy to see it return.

"In hindsight it's easy to see now and for what it's worth the two fillies that finished ahead of her in the Diana are pretty damn good," said the trainer. "But she's like a keg of dynamite. When she's right, she packs a powerful punch."

Dominguez rode Zagora twice in 2011, both narrow defeats, and was aboard for the Diana. The jockey appreciated getting into the win column.

"She always ran well for me but not good enough to win, so it feels good," Dominguez said. "After I rode her in Tampa (a neck defeat in March 2011), I wished I waited a little bit longer, she might have made the lead briefly and it seemed like she wandered around a little bit. She really has matured, I saw her win at Pimlico and her win at Tampa with Javier (this year). I knew she didn't stop. I wasn't really concerned about that any more. That day, I looked back and said, 'I wish I waited.' The other times, not."

Hey Chad Brown, what's Zagora's best distance?

"People ask me about the Breeders' Cup (filly and mare turf). I don't think so. The mile-and-a-quarter paces her out too much and she can't use that burst. A mile and a sixteenth, a mile and an eighth is her."







As for snapping his personal slide, Weaver smiled and said, "It feels good and I've only got one running, so I won't get beat today."

• After eight career starts without a win dating to last September, Alarmed Ndangerous can now walk confidently back to the barn as the winner of two straight at the Spa.

In fact, he can boast all he wants after winning the seventh, a New Yorkbred allowance, at 25-1. Not a shabby showing this month for a 3-year-old trainer Linda Rice says still has progress to make.

"He's been a lot of fun to be with," Rice said. "He's got a very kind and gentle mind and he's learning to run and be a real competitor."

• Optimizer's win in the eighth was so satisfying to D. Wayne Lukas that the trainer was willing to share it with anyone who'd come along for the ride. The Hall of Famer grabbed a pair of youngsters out of the crowd to greet the colt in the winner's circle after his first win since breaking his maiden here last summer.

It wasn't so much the win that surprised Lukas as it was the way the 3 year-old won it: wire-to-wire.

"It wasn't the kind of race I expected from him," he said, "but a lot of times we over-coach. I was real pleased that Joel (Rosario) just let him run."

The son of English Channel was impressive after breaking sharply out of the gate. Leading the whole way, he increased his advantage as they turned for home and won the 1 3/16-mile turf race by 2 ½ lengths.

"He's been on the wrong surface all spring," Lukas conceded. "He's a grass horse and he's got a great future."

Owned and bred by Bluegrass Hall, Optimizer ran in all three Triple Crown races this spring, plus four other dirt stakes to start the year.

- The last race of the day had little chance of matching the race that preceded it, but winning trainer Charlie Lopresti was ecstatic nonetheless, especially after his first attempt to run Kris Royal here.
- "I messed up and had the wrong shoes on him, so they scratched him," Lopresti said, "but I don't think he'd have beat the winner that day anyway."

Lopresti said the 4-year-old had been training well since then and that he was

"He really kicked at the end," Lopresti said. "When he got to rolling, he got to rolling pretty good."

• Rigby picked up his second straight win for owner Mark Lewis and trainer Steve Asmussen in the fifth, a 7-furlong allowance on the main track.

As he watched the replay in the clubhouse, the trainer said he was more impressed with the 5-year-old this time out because of the field he beat.

"He overcame more today," Asmussen said. "He just ran really well."

Rigby began to make a move as pacesetter Ascauga started to fade, moving from fifth to first in the 13-horse field at the stretch.

He won it in by 2 ½ lengths over Reload in 1:22.04 to get Ramon Dominguez his second straight win.

"You know real well the second time," Asmussen said as he re-watched the last 50 yards. "It's funny, when you watch a race live and you're in front you always feel like you're getting caught, but he had it and I'd say he's never been better."

Royal Delta meets It's Tricky in Grade 1 showdown

All meet, she's stopped traffic – heading from Barn 78 (not 80) to the Oklahoma track, strolling on the walking ring, crossing Union Avenue for a visit to the main track, staring down visitors while getting a bath, paddock schooling in the afternoon, leaning on the reins attached to the old-school snake bit – and today she shows why.

Champion Royal Delta runs in the Grade 1 Personal Ensign, looking to continue to cement her glowing reputation, and build on a career that already includes victories in the Black Eyed Susan, Alabama, Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic, Fleur de Lis and Delaware Handicap. Besilu Stable's 4-5 shot breaks from post four in a field of six that also includes Grade 1 winner It's Tricky.

Trainer Bill Mott has trained plenty of good horses, and realizes Royal Delta is reaching rare air.

"It makes it exciting, and it's nice to have a horse that they're following," he said early in the meet. "The excitement builds for one like this. You start to feel like 'Oh boy, I've got a responsibility.' She deserves it though."






That she does. Royal Delta ranks near the top of the barn area when it comes to followings thanks to seven career wins and more than \$2.2 million earned from a dozen starts. She's won in New York, Kentucky, Maryland and Delaware. The excitement ramped up here last summer when she won the Alabama, knocking off It's Tricky.

Royal Delta won her career debut and only start as juvenile in a 12-length laugher going a mile at Belmont in October 2010. Her 2011 campaign started in March at Tampa and built into a championship campaign with an allowance win at Keeneland, then

the Black Eyed Susan. Third to It's Tricky in the 9-furlong Coaching Club American Oaks here last summer, she avenged that defeat going an extra furlong in the Alabama – powering away late by 5 1/2 lengths. Older filly Havre de Grace took care of the upstart in the Beldame last fall, but Royal Delta rebounded with another huge effort to win the Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic.

Those achievements all came for her breeder Palides Investments, whose owner Prince Saud bin Khaled passed away in February 2011. Sold to Besilu at Keeneland for \$8.5 million, Royal Delta went back to Mott with eyes on a 2012 campaign. The Dubai World Cup was the goal and she started with a rough-trip second in the Sabin at Gulfstream Park in late February. Ninth in Dubai a month later, she returned with a vengeance - winning the Grade 2 Fleur de Lis with ease at Churchill Downs June 16. Next came a trip to Delaware Park, where Royal Delta worked hard to win the Grade 2 Delaware Handicap by a neck over today's rival Tiz Miz Sue. Heavily favored that day, she had to work with a wide trip on the far turn and a gutsy effort in the stretch.

"A lot of her wins she's won fairly easily and we weren't quite sure how she'd handle it if someone looked her in the eye," said Mott. "She handled it really well because they looked her in the eye. She withstood the challenge. She made a premature move, but Mike (Smith) had to go when he did. Jeremy

Rose took him to the seven path on the turn."

Since then, she's trained like Kara Goucher – putting in the miles at Oklahoma, entertaining the breakfast crowd on the main track at least once and working 5 furlongs twice and a halfmile once. The latter drew a bullet after 48 2/5 seconds over the Oklahoma track. She carries top weight of 124

pounds, one more than It's Tricky and up to 10 more than the others.

furlongs or stretch her out and take on Royal Delta going 9 furlongs.

The decision had already been made, but it was still fun to ponder.

In mid-conversation, It's Tricky broke into a canter, ears flicking, looking to the right, the daughter of Mineshaft sauntered into her tranquil exercise, leaving assistant Trish McLaughlin on the pony. Birds chirped, geese grazed, the only thing missing was James Herriot. A lap later, the eight-time winner had stretched into her efficient stride, sealing her final preparation before today's Grade 1 stakes.


"It was a jump ball," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin about choosing the Personal Ensign. "A tough decision, a really tough decision."

Favorite Turbulent Descent won the Ballerina but didn't overwhelm anyone while doing it. Seen and noted.

"After watching the race, I think Turbulent Descent waits when she gets to the lead, she might pull herself up," McLaughlin said. "You don't know how we would have done, but we would have been right there, it looked like. But, that's behind us, we'll go forward."

Whether she's in the right race or not can still be debated, her readiness cannot. Coming off a three-month layoff and riding a three-stakes win streak, It's Tricky tries to avenge two defeats to Royal Delta last year. by 2 1/2 lengths in the Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic.

The 3-year-old fillies handily defeated their elders and promised big things this year, though they've gone separate routes.

While Royal Delta was globetrotting to Dubai, It's Tricky was devouring the New York-based fillies and mares, taking the Top Flight, Distaff Handicap and Ogden Phipps. The latter occurred at the end of May. McLaughlin had a choice to go to the Delaware Handicap but opted to avoid shipping It's Tricky from her Saratoga base. Eddie Castro will try to navigate a spot from the rail, somehow avoiding a speed duel with front-runners Brushed By A Star and Love And Pride, drawn directly outside her, while finding a position in front of Royal Delta, breaking from post 4 under Mike Smith.

"The post position isn't great, having speed right outside us, I hope Eddie can work out a good trip," McLaughlin said. "We hope we can get a jump on Royal Delta. We have a lot of respect for her, but hopefully we're better than her on the day. She's doing great, we missed a race because there wasn't a race in between, except the Delaware Handicap which was tough to do with her, we just decided not to do that and come here, she's doing fabulous."

• Fans darted through Saratoga's front side Saturday morning. Some ran, some jogged, some had one shoe, some had no shoes, some stood confused and others sat and recorded the spectacle on their phones. As the commotion roared for Travers Day, stall 1 of Eoin Harty's barn on the backside was empty. The occupant, Tiz Miz Sue, was in a trailer stall instead with her trainer Steve Hobby behind the wheel for the four-hour hike from Monmouth Park, N.J.

Her last start in the Delaware Handicap against Royal Delta left viewers hanging to the edge of their seats, one eye open, one eye squinted. Tiz Miz Sue rumbled down the lane like a freight train to try and catch the heavy favorite. Jockey Joe Rocco Jr. tried, Tiz Miz Sue tried, but Royal Delta was the relentless victor by a neck.

"She had a great trip, she was in a great spot the whole way," said Hobby. "Joe rode a perfect race. The other filly just wouldn't let us by. You know she got to her but Royal Delta just dug right back in at the end.'

The 5-year-old daughter of Tiznow has only won two races in the past two years, but shows game efforts against the division's elite. Owned and bred by CresRan LLC, Tiz Miz Sue has never crossed the finish line worse than third

"I think she's as good as she's ever been right now," said Hobby, who twice shipped into Saratoga and won the Grade 1 Sword Dancer with Telling. "The biggest thing was getting her to relax earlier in the races, it's always been a problem with her. She's sometimes a little rank early. If she relaxes early, she always has a lot better finish. The other day she settled right in and relaxed, had a nice finish. Joe knows her well, he's very confident in her."

Hobby hopes his mare can grab a good position early and relax throughout.

"There's three in there with pretty good speed, hopefully they go and we can tuck in early, get behind horses early because she'll relax better that way," said Hobby. "I imagine that Royal Delta will probably be ahead of us, we'll probably sit next or next to last and hopefully it just goes a lot like the last one when Royal Delta goes ahead of us and we try to wrestle her at the end."

Tiz Miz Sue enters the race as third choice at 6-1 and breaks from the outside.





John Velazquez and Todd Pletcher continued their successful spree, teaming up to win the Ballerina Friday with recent purchase Turbulent Descent. The Special caught up with the Hall of Fame jockey about the Grade 1 score.

The Special: What was your plan?

Velazquez: "We were looking to win that was the main thing, I think she waits a little when she gets there. I wanted to get the lead past the quarter pole, even to the three sixteenths pole, I was on the lead at the quarter pole, not the way I wanted it, but she ran great anyway."

The Special: What did you learn when you breezed her?

Velazquez: "Two horses were breezing from the gate, they came inside me and, boy, was she running off. There was nothing I could do, I had two horses inside and my company on my outside. It was supposed to be an easy half and we went way too fast the first quarter, then I let her gallop down the lane, I did it the opposite way, fast the first part and easy the second part. Then I breezed her on the training track. The last time she breezed, Todd didn't tell me she was breezing."

The Special: What did you learn from the race?

Velazquez: "I've been working her in the mornings so I know her a little bit, she doesn't break very good and then she wants to be a little aggressive in the middle of the pack. Just try to get her nice and relaxed without taking too much hold of her, let her do her own thing, got to the three eighths pole and we bumped with Ramon a couple of times, she got into the bridle a little too soon. It was probably my fault, I know she gets aggressive, I probably should have kept her away from him, she would have been a little more relaxed."

The Special: How important is it to have Todd Pletcher's confidence? **Velazquez:** "I've been blessed for the people I work with, for him to give me the opportunity, to trust me, I knew I was going to ride her before I had even ridden at the meet yet. I came back and started working a couple of horses for Todd, she was probably the third or fourth horse I worked. To have that trust, I'm very thankful that he trusts me that much. He has to trust me."
