

# Stable Tour:

with Tony Dutrow



Tony Dutrow is enjoying an excellent meet at Saratoga Race Course. Heading into Saturday's card he's saddled 14 starters and 13 have finished first, second or third. Five of the 14 starters are winners, none bigger than Embellish The Lace's front-running score in the Grade 1 Alabama Stakes last Saturday. She's already shipped out and back to Dutrow's base at the Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland, but he's still got plenty of possible runners in his barns just inside the Union Avenue gate on the Oklahoma Training Track.

When asked if he'd be interested in hosting a stable tour, Dutrow said, "drop by any time." The Special's Brandon Valvo showed up two days after the Alabama and Dutrow squeezed 20 minutes out of his day to go stall-to-stall.

The Big Beast: "He's in the Forego Saturday. He's doing great. He won the King's Bishop here last year and he just got beat in the Vanderbilt. He's doing terrific. We've given him two workouts and he's been sensational in both of them. Just getting him to race four weeks later is really just hoping everything goes well. It's not like he needed any preparation. We're just cruising along with him."

I Spent It: "He won the Saratoga Special here last year as a 2-year-old. He's had a break. He had a small injury, no big deal. He's almost ready to run. He won't run at Saratoga, but he's almost ready and we're really looking forward to him. He's a very good horse."

Mo For The Money: "This is an unraced 2-year-old by Uncle Mo. I consider him a very good colt. I've got three of them (Uncle Mo colts). All three of them are runners. I see lots of other Uncle Mos doing fantastic. He's a very good stallion. He's going to be six weeks (from a start)."



**Set The Trappe:** "Another good colt, by Trappe Shot. He ran up here in his first start and finished second (Aug. 8). He ran a very, very good race and I do hope to run him back here at Saratoga on the 5th. Very happy with him. You hope that they come out of the race well mentally. You hope that they get better. Not all of them do. This boy has led us to believe that he's getting better."

**Big World:** "Big World is a 2-year-old. She's run twice. She finished third at Belmont. Then she came to Saratoga and finished third to Rachel Alexandra's daughter (Rachel's Valentina Aug. 2). We really like this filly. She is (pretty laid back). She's a nice horse to have in the barn. We hope to run her again up here on the 6th."

**Get Jets:** "This is another very good 2-year-old (by Scat Daddy). He did run here one time and he won (Aug. 19). He came from last and won very easily and I think you have to be a good colt to do that. We're just preparing him for the Belmont fall meet. Very good colt, appears to have a very good future."

**Play Big:** "He's a 2-year-old colt that has not run yet. He's probably three weeks away. He'll run at Belmont. Leads me to believe he's a very good colt. He's by Twirling Candy. We bought him at the OBS March 2-year-old in training sale (for \$500,000). The owner Alex Lieblong picked him out."

**The Big Mo:** "He's also a son of Uncle Mo. He's probably six weeks from the races. We feel super about him. Alex Lieblong picked him out (and bought him for \$275,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida) 2-year-olds in training sale."

**Kibble:** "Kibble is a 3-year-old filly that broke her maiden in a claiming race last winter at Aqueduct and she's preparing for her 3-year-old debut. She had an injury, but it's a safe injury and she's completely healed. She's going to be a while. She had a condylar fracture in her right hind. She's had plenty of time and she's all good."

**Burndines:** "He raced here at Saratoga early in the meet and he won (maiden claiming, Aug. 9). There's a race for him Closing Day. We're excited about him, very

good horse that's improving. He's got plenty of energy, but he's a good boy about everything. Still learning, lots of energy, has a good time."

**Bankers Holiday:** "He's a 3-year-old (by Harlan's Holiday) that has not raced yet. We're trying to get him there. He is probably 75 percent there. We think that, if everything goes the way it is now, we like the horse. He can run. One thing after another. Little stuff. This happens, that happens. Time consuming, but he seems matured now and through all of it. Hopefully all that stuff is behind him."

Main Road: "This is an Alex and Jo Ann Lieblong 2-year-old that they bought up here (for \$350,000 at last year's Saratoga yearling sale). He's a talented 2-year-old son of Quality Road. Not ready, going to be a little bit, but we like him. I like everything about him. You'd never know he was around. He does everything right. Good boy all the way."

**Pep The Champ:** "He ran up here at Saratoga one time. He finished third (in \$50,000 claiming race on the grass). He ran a very good race. We hope to run him back on the 7th. Once they've run up here you're just on cruise control to run them again. Just maintenance workouts. Just hopefully things go well for them and they continue to do well."

**Tap Less:** "Nice 2-year-old filly by Tapit. She's going very good, very close to being ready to run. I don't know if she'll get to run here or not, but she's almost ready to run. Big Tapit filly. That's why I haven't run her. She's not a turf horse and they just haven't given us any distance races here on the dirt."

"I freshened Onion up, he was running pretty steady in Florida and early in New York. We put him away, we were getting him ready to run on the second day of the meeting, they used to start on Monday. He had been a slow mile, in :35 at Belmont, he could do that all the time. Go the distance of the race and then sharpen them up, that's what I always thought. We came up from New York Sunday morning, he went a half in :47 on Sunday, then blew

out an eighth of a mile on Tuesday morning, he broke the track record going six and a half on Tuesday afternoon. Pretty good bunch of horses he beat. Vasquez's agent asked me where I was running him back, I said, the Whitney. He laughed. I've made enough mistakes to know if they're going to ever pull off anything, they have to be doing exceptionally well at the time. He was really on his game and the

other horse wasn't. It was just one of those things that happen every once in a while."

# 3 Deep

# Old pals King Kreesa, Kharafa, Lubash clash

Hey, hey, the gang's all here. If it's a New Yorkbred turf stakes, there's a good chance Kharafa, King Kreesa and Lubash will be there. They clash - again - in today's \$150,000 West Point.

Combined, they've won 33 races and earned a little more than \$3 million. They can run in open company, but set off plenty of fireworks when they turn up in the same race. Today, King Kreesa is the 2-1 favorite just ahead of 5-2 Lubash and 4-1 Kharafa in a field of eight (plus two main-trackonly entrants).

"They're good horses in open company, not just good new York-breds," said David Donk, who



trains King Kreesa. "It's fun to be part of it. Better to be one of the three than not, though one or two of them could stay home once in a while."

Donk brings King Kreesa back 13 days after finishing fourth in the Grade 2 Fourstardave. The 6-year-old King Cugat gelding, who races for Gerald and Susan Kresa, was beaten just a length by Grand Arch for the win after setting a contested pace.

"It was a great field of horses and a big effort," Donk said. "The owners asked me what I thought about running back in the West Point. I like to run back, obviously, if they're doing well and he's come out of it well. Sometimes they fool you because he's a good-feeling horse, but he seems good. He's pretty consistent and we're ready."

King Kreesa galloped in a set of draw reins Thursday morning, looking cool and composed while seeking his second consecutive West Point score. The 2014 race was his first of the year, and first start for Donk, and came at the expense of Lubash. King Kreesa lost his next four (including two this year), but rebounded to take the Grade 3 Poker and the ungraded Forbidden Apple at Belmont leading into the Fourstardave.

Lubash makes his 43rd career start for owner/breeder Leonard Pivnick. The 8-year-old rides a two-race wining streak – including a score over Kharafa and King Kreesa in the Kingston May 25 – and is a big part of the surging barn of trainer Christophe Clement.

"He's one of my favorites," Clement said early this week. "I've got a tremendous amount of respect for the horse. It's amazing how hard he tries. If you had a barn of 20 Lubashes, you'd be doing great."

Last month at Belmont Park, Lubash got loose during morning training and missed two weeks while recovering from bumps and bruises which were feared to be much worse. He worked at Belmont Aug. 16 and at Saratoga Sunday. The son of Freud eyes his 15th win and his third on the inner turf at Saratoga. Lubash won the 2012 West Point, finished fourth in 2013 and second to King Kreesa (by a head) last year.

"He's probably a better horse, but it's very difficult to pass on the New York-bred races," Clement said. "He's one of the most consistent horses in the program. He won a Grade 3 at the end of last year and I will probably do the same this year. He's 8 and one of the reasons he's lasted is because we took care of him."

Regular jockey Junior Alvarado takes the return call.

Monmouth Park-based trainer Tim Hills will head north with the third slugger in this lineup, Kharafa. The 6-year-old son of Kitalpha finished third in the 2013 race but did not make the trip last year. He's won twice in four starts this year, and beat Lubash and King Kreesa in last year's Mohawk at Belmont. Javier Castellano takes the riding assignment for owners Paul Brayerman and Timothy Pinch.

Like everyone else, Donk sees the race going through the top three.

"It's a different set-up every time – post positions, different pace scenarios, they all have their styles," he said. "They've all run up close and off the pace, so I think it becomes a jockey's race to some degree. It's great for the sport. It's Saratoga on top of it. They're just really solid horses and fun to watch."



# Ace mare Discreet Marq casts long, classy shadow

David Donk is joking, but he's got a bit of a problem with the entries for today's Yaddo Stakes, part of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders' Saratoga Showcase Day.

"I think (Christophe Clement) read the condition book wrong because he's supposed to be running in the Ballston Spa on Saturday," said Donk with a jab at 4-5 favorite Discreet Marg and her trainer. Owned by Moyglare Stud Farm, after a big purchase last fall, Discreet Marq regularly tackles graded stakes competition and towers over today's nine foes with eight wins and \$1.2 million in career earnings. She wouldn't look out of place at all in Saturday's Ballston Spa, a Grade 2 worth \$400,000 and headed by Tepin and Coffee Clique.

Donk runs three in the Yaddo anyway - Lady Kreesa,

Selenite and Chrysolite – and will hope for the best on a big day for the state's breeding and racing program.

Selenite finished third to Discreet Marq in the Ticonderoga last year and won an open-company optional claimer at Belmont Park in July by disqualification. Owned by Bill Punk and Phillip DiLeo, the 8-1 third choice will be ridden by leading jockey Irad Ortiz Jr.

"He rides her well and she's a pretty competitive filly so don't let somebody slip up or she'll be there," Donk said. "I had her entered in the Waya earlier in the meet and that came up crazy tough so we elected to run here instead, hoping Discreet Marq would run in the Ballston Spa."

Lady Kreesa is a half-sister to New York-bred male turf star King Kreesa and has won two of five starts this year for Gerald and Susan Kresa. Jose Ortiz rides the daughter of Stonesider at 15-1. Chrysolite also races for Punk and DiLeo and seeks her fourth career win at 20-1 with Manuel Franco.

"Mine are all doing well," Donk said. "I'm happy with them. They're taking a shot for black type. They're nice horses, but they're not Discreet Marq."

As for the favorite, Clement did indeed read the condition book properly and hopes to use today as a launching pad for bigger things.


The 5-year-old Discreet Cat mare finished third in the Grade 1 Diana here last year for her breeder Patricia Generazio and was second to Dayatthespa in the 2014 Yaddo. At the Fasig-Tipton November Sale last year, Moyglare spent \$2.4 million to buy the gray mare and returned her to Clement.

The trainer was thrilled to have her back and she opened the year with a Grade 3 win in the Beaugay in May. She backed up that effort with a third in the Grade 1 Just A Game in June.

"She's been running with the topclass fillies in the country for two years now," he said. "She might not be the best, but she's right there with the best. She brings her A game, has a lot of natural speed."

Clement also knows the possibilities a Yaddo win might hold.

"Last year, Dayatthespa won the Yaddo before she won the Breeders' Cup."

old son of Flatter vaults from a win in the New York Derby at Finger Lakes July 3. The dark bay colt traveled from Finger Lakes to Saratoga to prepare for the \$250,000 stakes, breezing four times since his 2-length win, including two bullets over the main track.

Force broke his maiden at Santa Anita in February, before shipping to Kentucky to prepare a spring/summer campaign. Casse added blinkers for his two most recent starts, a third at Churchill Downs and a solid score at Finger Lakes.

"We were pretty confident, he had trained at Churchill real well all spring," Casse said. "He had always shown a lot of ability, even early on as

over the track," Casse said. "He likes the racetrack, I'm excited to see him run. The racetrack seems to be playing fair, so even if he's not up close early, I don't think it's a disadvantage any more."

Repole Stable's One Sided won earlier in the meet, taking a 9-furlong restricted allowance race. The son of Quality Road returns in 18 days from that score. Javier Castellano has the call.

"First time at a mile and an eighth, first time around two turns, he handled it well, he's an interesting horse in that he's improved his Beyer figure every start of his life, probably needs to do that again to pull this off," Pletcher said. "It's back in 18 days, it isn't ideal but he seems to have handled it well. We decided not to breeze him, he's a leggy horse who's fairly narrow and doesn't carry a lot of weight, I fig-

ured that mile and an eighth race has him plenty fit enough."

Pletcher bolsters his hand with Gary Barber's Bullheaded Boy, winner of his two most recent starts against allowance foes over the Belmont turf. A three-time winner, the son of Bullsbay won his debut over a sloppy track here last summer. Irad Ortiz returns.

"Just no 3-year-old New Yorkbred turf opportunities and you don't want to step up into the older horses division," Pletcher said when asked about the move back to the main track. "He's got some form on the dirt, he's been training well so we figured we'd give this a try."

Chad Brown tries to avenge a loss in the New York Derby with Battle Of Evermore. Doubledown Stable's son of Scat Daddy finished 2 lengths behind Force in the New York Derby, before finishing seventh on the turf here July 29.

Good Luck Gus, fourth in the New York Derby, breaks from the rail for Rudy Rodriguez. Bellamy Way, second to One Sided in the allowance race, breaks from post 4 for Dave Cannizzo.

Two-time winner Fleeting completes the field for Leah Gyarmati.



She's All Ready slipped through the cracks a little when she went through the ring in Timonium, Md., earlier this spring.

The New York-bred daughter of Girolamo sold for \$45,000, exactly on the median and well below the sale's average price of \$88,859, despite coming from a consignment with a successful record at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May 2-year-olds in training sale and strong eighth-mile breeze in 10.40.

She's All Ready didn't go unnoticed less than three months later when she debuted in a field of nine at 2-1 and won in a gallop. Now the chestnut filly is even-money on the morning line for her second start in today's

\$200,000 Seeking The Ante Stakes at Saratoga.

"That was nice," Jim Ryerson, who trains the filly for Nirvana Stables, said while he watched training Thursday morning on the turn at the Oklahoma Training Track. "She had worked pretty good at Belmont on the training track and here one day on the main track. She was no secret."

She's All Ready's sparkling debut came in a 5 ½-furlong maiden special weight Aug. 7. She didn't break on top but showed good speed early and didn't take long to get to the lead. Kendrick Carmouche, who rides

again today, put her on the lead around the turn and through the opening quarter-mile in :22.28.

She's All Ready was just off the rail, opened up her lead a little more turning for home and sailed past the half-mile mark in :45.87. Carmouche gave her a couple taps on the shoulder, she responded and opened up by  $5\frac{1}{2}$  at the eighth pole before winning by  $8\frac{1}{4}$  lengths geared down.

Ryerson wasn't surprised in the slightest by the filly listed at 8-1 on the program for her debut.

"She came out of the Timonium sale, was very forward, very precocious," he said. "Barry Eisaman had her and I asked him if she needed some time off after the sale and he said, 'no, she's really ready to go.' I've known Barry for a while, have done business with him in the past, so he must have thought highly of her and she hasn't disappointed."

Carmouche breezed She's All Ready 5 furlongs

in a bullet 1:00.44 on the Oklahoma last Thursday, touting her fitness. Now there's only a couple things left for Ryerson to worry about.

"She came out of her race real well," he said. "She breezed a good five-eighths here with Kendrick last week. Now we're hoping she can get the distance. She's going to face tougher, but she was very impressive and we'll see."

Six others are entered in the Seeking The Ante, including 7-2 second choice Lemon Liqueur and 5-1 third choice Super Surprise.

Lemon Liqueur scored by 2 ½ lengths in her debut Opening Day for trainer Rick Violette, who saddled Upstart to victory in last year's Funny Cide in the inaugural Saratoga Showcase. Bettors picked up on the daughter of Exchange Rate's talent and Violette's ability with firsters and also sent her off as the 2-1 favorite for her debut.

Repole Stable's Super Surprise, a homebred daughter of Giant Surprise, was 6-5 for her debut and finished a close third behind fellow Seeking The Ante entrant Backwood Bay Aug. 15. Super

Surprise is trained by Todd Pletcher.

"I thought she might win first time out, but she missed the break and had to do a rush job to get there and I think she just got a little bit late," Pletcher said. "It's not exactly what you always do with a maiden but Mike owns Giant Surprise and we're trying to promote him as a stallion, get him off to a good start, having a couple of his offspring running in stakes will go a long way to making him a stallion.


"She's a big, hearty filly who carries pretty good condition, we felt like she bounced out her race well enough to take an unorthodox approach."



# Rematch

Dr. Shane, Manipulated meet again in 2YO stakes

Nick Esler was shopping for a better spot earlier this month when he opted to scratch Dr. Shane from an open-company sprint stakes on the grass in favor of today's \$200,000 Funny Cide Stakes against fellow New York-breds.

Chances are he was hoping to avoid Manipulated, who beat Dr. Shane and didn't look like a first-time starter winning his debut in the Rockville Centre Stakes at Belmont Park the Saturday before racing got underway at Saratoga Race Course.

"Obviously Jimmy Jerkens' horse (Manipulated) is a very nice horse and he'll probably be showing up in open company and graded stakes next time out," Esler said, thinking that the Malibu Moon colt might land in the Grade 1 Hopeful closing day or something else down the road.

Turns out that won't happen, at least not in the 6 ½-furlong stakes that kicks off the second annual Saratoga Showcase program. Manipulated is one of five entered in the stakes named for the 2003 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner, who made an appearance at Saratoga Thursday after flying up from his home at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington with Triple Crown winner American Pharoah Wednesday.

To make mattes even tougher, Dr. Shane will also face the Todd Pletcher-trained debut winner and slight 7-5 favorite Sudden Surprise in the Funny Cide. The others entered are Aug. 10 maiden winner No Entiendo for Rudy Rodriguez and two-start maiden Guaranteed for Russell Cash.

The Funny Cide will be Dr. Shane's fourth career

start. He won his debut going 5 furlongs May 29 at Belmont then came back a week later to try open company in the Tremont Stakes going 5 ½ furlongs the day before the Belmont Stakes.

"He's very professional little colt," Esler said. "He jumped up, got the job done first time without a whole lot of foundation under him breeze wise. Then there was going to be seven weeks to the Rockville Centre. I thought he was a little short going into his first race, thought he got a lot out of it and then gave him a shot in the Tremont."

Dr. Shane lost all chance after getting caught in a messy start in the Tremont that compromised several horses. He finished last of seven, beaten 11 ¼ lengths after racing fairly close early.

"He was stepped on right out of the gate," Esler said. "So yes, a rough trip for a 2-year-old, but he was probably in over his head as well."

Six weeks later Dr. Shane ran into Manipulated

in the Rockville Centre. He battled for the lead, put away his early rival but couldn't fend off Manipulated and Lucky Laurie.

Sudden Surprise got the favorite's nod off his 2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-length victory over one of the few sloppy tracks at the meet, a July 30 state-bred maiden going 5 ½ furlongs. A homebred for Mike Repole's Repole Stable, Sudden Surprise will be ridden again by John Velazquez.

Pletcher described the colt's workouts prior to his debut as "somewhat inconsistent," but he was still good enough to overcome the off track and a three-wide trip into the stretch.

"We saw some (works) that would suggest he was good enough to win first time out and I saw a few that made me unsure," Pletcher said. "He's a good gate horse, some of his best works were from the gate, when it rained and he got a big start, that helped. We'll see as we step up in his races."


"In the race that she won prior to my purchase, Clement had a horse in there that he really liked, and this filly beat her," said Dobson of his reason-

ing behind the private purchase. "Brad Weisbord brokered the horse and we thought it would be a good purchase. Sent her off to Clement to see how much fun we could have with her up here, and sure enough."

Sure enough, Stormy Regatta delivered Thursday, taking the \$100,000 Riskaverse Stakes under Irad Ortiz Jr. for Dobson's Cheyenne Stables and Clement.

"Those that know me know that I enjoy the morning more than I do anything else," said Dobson, who frequents the backstretch during training hours. "But winning stakes races at Saratoga is awfully, awfully special. I'm very, very happy for the team. The filly just ran great. I didn't think she had the greatest trip into the first turn. She got position after that. Irad just rode her great after that. I couldn't be more pleased."

Dobson has enjoyed stakes success at Saratoga in the past. He owned Caleb's Posse in a partnership with McNeil Stables and the son of Posse won the Grade 1 King's Bishop in 2011. The Riskaverse was the first stakes victory in Saratoga for Cheyenne Stables as a sole owner, making the win all the more special.

Stormy Regatta stalked 1 ½ lengths off pace-set-

ting Greywalls in the early stages of the 1-mile turf race while carried wide into the first turn by Bugle. Despite the trouble, Stormy Regatta settled nicely, racing just off the pace and in the clear up the back-stretch through a half-mile of :49.20.

Around the far turn, Ortiz angled Stormy Regatta three-wide and ranged up to confront the leaders through 6 furlongs in 1:13.92. In the stretch, Stormy Regatta hooked up with fast-closing Partisan Politics, holding off the post-time favorite by a nose to take the Riskaverse in 1:37.73. Partisan Politics was second while Eriluis Vaz guided Lola Beaux up the inside to finish third.

"The filly coming on the outside probably helped us a little bit," Clement said. "I always believe that you get this little momentum when a horse comes on the outside of you. We just got to the wire in front. She's very game, very game. Irad gave her a great trip. Very game filly. I'm delighted for Mr. Dobson. Life is good."

"She was ready," said Ortiz, who registered his 50th winner of the meet. "She gave me everything she had turning for home."

Stormy Regatta's Riskaverse win is the second straight stakes victory for the 3-year-old daughter of Midshipman. She took the \$60,000 Little Silver Stakes July 26 at Monmouth Park.

"We were all in agreement; Monmouth seemed logical," Dobson said. "She was stakes placed and we wanted to make her a stakes winner. We did that. Now we're a winner at Saratoga. We were

pointing to this race (the Riskaverse) even before the race at Monmouth. They were spaced well, timing wise. We were thinking this would be the next logical spot."

Although Dobson said he hopes there are "bigger and better things to come" with Stormy Regatta, Clement wasn't ready to commit to the filly's next race.

"Let's just enjoy this for a few days and then I will come up with a plan," he said.

# Bob Le Beau wins spill-marred Grade 1

Off a powerhouse flat win at Parx, Bob Le Beau looked live in the Grade 1 A.P. Smithwick Memorial steeplechase here Aug. 6 and finished a middling fourth without making much headway in the stretch.

Three weeks later, going 2 1/2 furlongs farther, he dominated Thursday's Grade 1 New York Turf Writers Cup for The Fields Stable and Elizabeth Voss. The Irish-bred rated ninth of 10 early for Jack Doyle, rallied leaving the backside and outran Schoodic over the final quarter-mile to score by 7 1/4 lengths. Longshot Charminster rallied for third at 35-1 while race favorite, 2014 Eclipse Award winner Demonstrative, was pulled up in a race marred by the death of 2013 Eclipse winner Divine Fortune in a fall at the last fence.

"You can't enjoy it, it's hard on everybody," said Voss, who lost Makari in a similar fall in the 2014 Turf Writers. "We were standing there last year like they are this year."

Voss credited the step up in distance for Bob Le Beau's improved effort Thursday.

"He won at Radnor (in May) which is the exact same distance," Voss said. "His Smithwick wasn't very good, but we thought he'd like the longer distance. I know he's little and you think he should be sharper, but I think the little longer trip is better for him."

It sure looked like it Thursday.

Divine Fortune bounced to his customary spot on the lead, Syros tracked him in second, All Together and Schoodic found sweet spots in third and fourth. Favorite Demonstrative established a comfortable peg in fifth. Doyle placed Bob Le Beau near the back and outside, with just British import Hinterland behind him.

With a circuit to go, Divine Fortune continued to lope on the lead as Demonstrative lost another position and slid back to last. Bob Le Beau drafted behind the peloton, continuing to make positive ground.

Leaving the backside, Divine Fortune led a stacked quartet of Syros, All Together, Schoodic and Alajmal. With a choice of slinging outside past four rivals or taking a shot along the cones,

Doyle aimed Bob Le Beau for a sliver inside a tiring All Together. Turning for home, and saving ground, Bob Le Beau took aim at Divine Fortune while Schoodic tried to muster a rally.

Barging through the inside of All Together and squaring up to the outside of Divine Fortune, Bob Le Beau reached even terms with Divine Fortune, slammed in a short stride at the last and landed with the race firmly in his grasp. He skipped clear to a comfortable win over Schoodic and Charminster.

"I actually was happy enough, he switched off a lot better today, we thought he didn't really liked being crowded and in behind horses, but it worked out in the end," said Doyle. "Ideally, I didn't want to be that far back, but I was happy enough to stay there and let them go on and race in front. I turned in, with loads of horses, I couldn't believe how well he was going, he missed the last a little bit, it made no difference whether the horse stayed up, I was going by him."

Voss credited Doyle with the idea of outfitting Bob Le Beau with a hood for his races. Essentially a head cover, though not the new-fangled titanium numbers some horses wear, the black hood includes covers over the horse's ears, which minimizes noise and has a calming effect.


"He's always been a nervous horse and he

doesn't like you anywhere near his ears so you can't stick earplugs in him," she said. "Jack thought we should try this hood on him. On racedays we put it on him a couple hours before and it totally calms him. The sound and the pressure on their face is supposed to help them too. Whatever it is, we'll use it."

Bob Le Beau won for the second time over jumps in the United States, to go with six flat wins and two hurdle wins in Ireland. The \$90,000 payday raised his career bankroll to \$433,457 with stops in Ireland, Dubai and the U.S.

Voss couldn't help but think about her father, and his longtime client Betty Merck, afterward. Tom Voss died in January 2014, a few months after contemplating the purchase of Bob Le Beau for Merck's The Fields Stable. The horse's name came back around Elizabeth Voss' husband Gary Murray's list. Merck went for it, like she did throughout her life, and saw him run a few times last year. At 95, she died in April – leaving the horses to her son Laddie.

"How about this? Of course I'm thinking about Mom," he said in the winner's circle Thursday. "Of course, afterward people asked me about where we might run next. I'm just enjoying this. Mom's smiling somewhere, with Tom. You know it. She loved the racing and we said we were going to try to keep the stable going. We've got a bunch of homebreds coming along, too."





# Back to Back

Roman Reign makes it two in a row since return to trainer Pugh

Peter Pugh got to know Roman Reign pretty well last summer and into the fall before she went to another trainer with designs on a few more starts to round out the year.


Roman Reign raced two more times in November and December, returned to Pugh in the spring when he returned from Florida and made it back to the races with a win in a July 1 state-bred maiden claiming race. The 4-year-old daughter of Roman

Last fall, I went for a ride with Divine Fortune. With Keri Brion aboard, he sauntered out of the barn, stepping with a leggy reach that said, "Hey let's go train." He was 11, coming off a rough fall at Belmont Park a month earlier, and it was the attitude that struck me.

He led the set. He carried his chestnut head high. He slapped his front feet out when we started to trot and reluctantly slowed to a walk when we turned left to walk down a lane toward the galloping field at trainer Jonathan Sheppard's Pennsylvania farm. I was on a semi-retired racehorse, and mostly holding on, but I could feel Divine Fortune. He was happy to be there. Walking along, he put on a show, the Thoroughbred at its best.

We galloped up a steep hill in a field, mostly just something to do as his race was four days away and the serious training was finished. He started slowly, hammered his hind legs for power to get up the incline, then floated over the top. Slowing to a walk, he drew great breaths of air and stared far into the distance. He couldn't have known I was there to write an article, couldn't have known his seven-years-younger stablemate All The Way Jose cost him his life Thursday. Battling for the lead in es. Divine Fortune could have been retired. He also needed a role model, couldn't have known that he looked like a horse in a movie.

Walking back to the barn, Divine Fortune made Brion smile with a silly head-shaking, neck-snapping maneuver that still proves difficult to explain.

In October, I put it like this but it's not quite right either: Part twitch, part habit and all "Hey look at Probably reckless too. But that's how he did it. Dime!" the 11-year-old cranks his head all the way to the left – while walking straight ahead – holds it for a beat, then zips it back in one, swift pull. Then he goes back to walking. Then he does it all again. And again. And again.

The point of my visit was to see if he still had any-nobody knows why. thing left. He'd won an Eclipse Award (at 10) the year before, won a Grade 1 in May, but pulled up as the heavy favorite at Saratoga in July and fell like some- scrambled to his feet and jumped a fence past the



Park in September.

I left knowthe old man had it. Four days af-Grand National. A month later, he won Colonial Cup.

That's the Fortune was -

the New York Turf Writers Cup, his fifth start in the race and his 43rd in a jump race, he fell at the last fence and broke his shoulder. It was one of those falls. You kind of knew. You didn't want to know. But you did.

He was surely tired. He was definitely brave. vine Fortune didn't chip in at the last fence, Divine Fortune went for it, flew at it, fired with whatever he had for Sheppard, Brion, owner Bill Pape, anyone horse. else who ever appreciated a brave Thoroughbred.

I saw the fall and felt it, especially when he didn't get up right away. In 2012, he fell at the same spot,

pushed wire without a jockey just to show everyone he him off a ledge could do it. Thursday, he stayed down. Veterinari-Belmont ans, jockey Darren Nagle, Sheppard, Brion and others were there in seconds and Divine Fortune eventually stood up and walked on to the ambulance but the damage was done. He was euthanized because ing that, yes, you can't fix broken shoulders, not in horses.

When it happens, people want to know why or how. They wonder how jump racing can be so dangerous, but still exist. I struggle for an answer. It's ter my visit, not that dangerous, it's just magnified here, I say. Divine Fortune Horses have been competing in jump races for 260finished second some years. There are people who think flat racing in the Grade 1 is too dangerous. They don't watch it and don't participate.

There are no easy answers.

I wrote a similar column after Makari died doing the Grade 1 the same thing at the same spot in the same race last year. When falls happen, jump racing is bad. But I don't think it's cruel or barbaric. I think the horses Divine like it, I know they like the life they get. I know it's a delicate, fragile balance for the humans involved all in - and it - just as it is for people responsible for flat horscould have died in one of those earlier falls. 
