Abby Adsit is always on the go. She talks fast, walks fast and it's easy to see she likes the action of the racetrack.

A majority of the horses in Adsit's barn on the Saratoga Race Course backstretch near the three-quarter pole are claimers, along with her personal favorite and turf allowance mare Flamingo Lane.

Adsit and her owners, who include Matthew Schera, Blue Stork Stable and Drawing Away Stable, have been busy at the claim box at the meet. She's hoping for a few more claims and some additional wins before heading back downstate to Belmont Park for the fall.

Adsit took out her license in April 2013 after a stint as an assistant with Linda Rice.

A local who went to Saratoga Springs High and graduated from Union College, Adsit didn't win a race her first year at Saratoga with just four starters. She won once last year, from six starters, and she's won three races this year from 24 starters (including \$92.50 winner Macher Monday).

Adsit wrapped up training early Saturday – along with everyone else because the track closed at 8 a.m. for Travers Day – and went down the shedrow with The Special's Annise Montplaisir.

Ave's Halo: "She was my first win at the meet (Aug. 6 in \$25,000 claimer) and I had added blinkers and cut her back, I was sprinting her on the grass. And she was my first win with Joel Rosario, ran very nicely." *Finished third Monday in a* \$25,000 claimer.

Lightning Buzz: "He's going to be a first-time starter, probably claiming



ranks. He's a 3-year-old by Stephen Got Even, and he's just a funny, funny, cool personality horse. He's kind of like a barn pet. Everyone loves him. He's pretty cute."

Finding Candy: "He's a horse that I claimed for Blue Stork, my owner Rick Brenko, and we claimed him for \$50,000 going a mile-and-an-eighth (Aug. 10). But he was going a little bit longer, I think he needs to be cut back."

Uncle Gio: "He's a Gio Ponti 2-yearold who is going to be long on the grass all day. He's this big colt and had to grow into himself, so hopefully I can get him on the grass (in the fall) before we don't have any more (grass races for the year) in New York."

Lady Daphne: "This is a filly I claimed for Matt Schera off of Chad Brown. She's a New York-bred, put her in for maiden 40 and I claimed her. She won and ran at a respectable number. So I look forward to getting her to the track.

I think she's going to be a nice Aqueduct horse, you know, when a lot of the horses shift (south for the winter). She might be a claiming-level horse, but I think she's got that edge to at least win her one x, a New York-bred one x allowance. And she is by Harlan's Holiday. It's his last crop this year, so for me I think there's a little bit of an edge. I like that they run different surfaces, different distances."

Here Sir: "I'm going to break his maiden, he's going to run at the end of the meet in a claiming race. We've dabbled at higher levels and he runs good. It's so tough here, it's not like you can get away with anything. The name of the game is to win."

Congenial: "He's a horse I claimed for \$32,000 off of Rudy Rodriguez. Super nice, great owners." *Finished third Monday in \$40,000 claiming race.*

Jersey Jules: "I just claimed her (for \$40,000 Aug. 21). She's a 3-year-old filly. She actually ran second to Tony Dutrow's

big filly Embellish The Lace that won the Alabama. Granted, she got trounced on, but she still ran a big number and was second. So that's her little claim to fame."

Jeter: "He's a hard-knocking New York-bred. He's been in the claiming, New York-bred levels. He's just a warrior."

Flamingo Lane: "This is my princess. I pretty much owe a lot of where I am now to her, she was one of my first original horses when I had eight horses. And we made a surface change from dirt to turf, and took off on the grass and she's won over 250 grand now. She took me to the Claiming Crown. And she came back and she ran third in her one x, and then came back and won it at Belmont, and then she just ran third in a two x here (Sunday). She's my one nice allowance horse. She's so special to me. Every time you bring her over there you know she's trying, and you can't say that about every horse. She never cheats you. She never ever cheats you. It's just the best feeling, you almost get emotional when you talk about it, because horses will run good, or horses will have good days or bad days. But even if you don't win, you know she's running her eyeballs out. Few and far between, horses like that."

Desert Bliss: "She's a New Yorkbred filly I claimed for \$25,000 for Blue Stork Stables off the dirt that I plan to run on the grass."

Last Dance

Ohio's Next Shares tackles Gr. 2 stakes before barn change

Over in Bill Mott's barn at the harness track Tuesday morning, one horse gets ready to train. The dark bay 2-year-old gelding looks a picture – white blinkers with orange trim, white saddle pad with an orange C inside of a black circle, four white polos, sheepskin cover on the yoke, attentive, upright ears.

And a Saratoga rookie in a black Cincinnati Reds hat on the shank.

Ohio-based trainer Doug Cowans makes his Saratoga debut with Next Shares in today's With Anticipation Stakes. The son of Archarcharch

was meant to run in a maiden race Sunday, but wound up on the also-eligible list, so Cowans goes to Plan B though it will be the last time he saddles the horse.

Next Shares finished second by a half-length in his debut at Ellis Park Aug. 1 for Cowans and owner Mike Foster, but caught the attention of some high-profile connections and races for Brous Stable, Gary Barber and Wachtel Stable today. The Fasig-Tipton October graduate moves to Mott's care after the race.

"It's bittersweet, for sure, but it's a business," Cowans said Tuesday while watching Next Shares gallop at Clare Court. "I know it will mean my owner (Foster) will go to the sale and we'll try to buy some more good horses. He could go on and be a nice horse. He could have won the race at Ellis if he'd settled a little bit more."

Joel Rosario rides the 10-1 shot in a field of six going 1 1/16 miles on the Mellon Turf Course as the third race. The Mott-trained Site Read is favored at 2-1, just under Monster Bea at 5-2 from Mark Casse's barn and Unbridled Daddy at 7-2 for Todd Pletcher. No horse in the race has run more than twice and Next Shares is not the only maiden with Azar also in the race for Pletcher.

Next Shares has been in Saratoga for about

a week, in the care of Cowans' assistant Brian Waltz. Tuesday, he played around while galloping at Clare Court – making an extra circle when equine traffic prevented a proper pull-up and exit. Despite a "first-time gelding" note in the past performances, he's been a gelding since last year. In the debut, he battled for the lead going a mile and yielded late to lose by a half-length.

"The horse was a little keen in the race," Cowans said. "I'd like to see him settle a touch more (today). He'll have to improve slightly, but the horse has moved forward off the first race. So he should fit in the race."

Next Shares is the first graded stakes starter for Cowans, who normally races at Belterra Park (former River Downs) in Cincinnati and Thistledown in Cleveland. He won 50 races last year and is 23-for-90 this year.

Site Read is the deserving 2-1 favorite off his 4 ½-length debut victory the first Saturday of the meeting for Mott. He was listed as the owner when the Tizdejavu colt won and he's entered in the With Anticipation with Jake Ballis and former NBA star Rashard Lewis also on the owner line. Site Read wound up in Mott's barn after his son Riley and Phil Hagard picked out the colt at the Keeneland September yearling sale.

"The two of them did it. They were at the sale last year looking at horses," Mott said. "They called me about this horse and said they liked him. So I gave them a budget, and they got him for less than what the budget was. He was within the budget. So he's turned out pretty well. I guess to win first out and be in a stake in his second start you know is pretty remarkable for any of them."

Eighth and well back early, Site Read raced a little wide around both turns before closing to win under Jose Lezcano, who rides back today.

"It was a little bit of a jaw-dropper, really," Mott said of the debut. "He was very impressive, he was way back, he split horses, he finished up with good energy. Good energy and good speed. He ran a credible time."

Barber also owns Monster Bea, another recent acquisition that might start for new connections in the With Anticipation. The Hat Trick gelding broke his maiden Aug. 8 at Saratoga for owner and trainer Adam Rice but was subsequently sold to Barber and transferred to Casse.

Monster Bea breezed 5 furlongs last Wednesday on the grass for Casse.

Casse was familiar with Monster Bea because he sent out Conquest Windycity to finish second in that Aug. 8 maiden race going 1 1/16 miles on the grass. The trainer liked how Monster Bea won and was even more impressed with the gelding's gallop out after his front-running 1 ¼-length victory.

"We ran second to him when he won and we really like the horse we ran," Casse said. "When I


saw him run, I was impressed because I thought he ran really green. What impressed me more than anything about him is after the race he took off like he hadn't ran. And that's kind of what he is, he's a big, unassuming, big tall string bean. That's what he looks like. There's nothing pretty about him except he can run."

Pletcher entered the duo of Unbridled Daddy and Azar, one-two in an Aug. 16 maiden race at the With Anticipation distance.

If both start it will be the third consecutive start that they've run in the same race, dating to a July 19 maiden race going 6 furlongs on the turf and a 1 1/16-mile turf maiden here Aug. 16.

Runaway King, a winner going 7 ½ furlongs on the grass at Delaware Park for Tim Ice, completes the field.



Castellano sets mark with 5th Travers win

Javier Castellano got a historic two-fer when he won the Travers last Saturday.

Not only did he beat Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, adding another name to the list of Triple Crown winners to come to Saratoga and lose, but Castellano also became the first jockey to win Saratoga's biggest race five times.

"It's very prestigious," he said Monday. "It's kind of hard to do, plus American Pharoah was in that competition. But thank God I did it. I'm very fortunate to be a part of it."

With the win, Castellano moved ahead of Braulio Baeza, Pat Day and Eddie Arcaro, who all won the Travers four times.



Going into the race, Castellano was aware that he'd set a new record if he won, but tried not to think about it.

"You go to the race and you focus yourself," he said. "You try to forget about everything else, so that you're more focused on winning the race than anything else. On paper, American Pharoah looked unbeatable. I thought nobody could beat him, especially because my horse comes from behind, and his horse is on the lead, which would make it more difficult to catch up to him."

Castellano's previous Travers wins came in 2006 with Bernardini, 2010 with Afleet Express, 2011 with Stay Thirsty, and 2014 with V. E. Day. Two, Bernardini and Stay Thirsty, were favored; those two were also father and son, making Castellano the answer to yet another racing trivia question.

Castellano's agent Matt Muzikar grew up in Saratoga and has been with Castellano for his last four Travers wins.

"To win one Travers is great," said Muzikar. "When we won two, it was tremendous. Three, amazing. And now to beat American Pharoah, and to have him break the record is a great thing."

Castellano said that former jockey Richie Migliore also pointed out that Castellano is the first jockey to win the Alabama, the Whitney, and the Travers in the same Saratoga season.

And with six days left in the meet and eight graded stakes races to go, Castellano's probably not finished, and has a chance to do something he's never done.

"Maybe we can win the Hopeful, too," said Muzikar.

Tepin's Near-Misses

Less than a length separates the Casse barn from three stakes wins at Saratoga this summer.

Instead, Mark Casse and his son and assistant Norm had to watch last week as their fillies suffered two more excruciating losses, bringing their runner-up finishes at the meet to six. Friday, Conquest Superstep lost the Fleet Indian for New Yorkbreds by a head. Saturday, it got even tougher.

"I don't know if we've ever had two worse beats, to be honest," said Norm, referring to Tepin's losses in graded stakes here this summer, the Grade 1 Diana by a nose July 25 and the Grade 2 Ballston Spa by a head Saturday.

"At the eighth pole you're almost saying, 'Oh, my God, we're going to win a Grade 1 at Saratoga,' and then out of nowhere you get nailed right on the wire."

Monday morning, Tepin stood placidly in her stall, eager to meet a visitor, lipping a jacket, nuzzling a hip, almost trying to provide that she is, as Norm puts it, "the sweetest horse to be around."

But on the racetrack, she's nearly ferocious, win or lose.

"She comes back exhausted," Casse said. "She is the epitome of a horse that tries, and she lays it all on the line for you."

She's got three wins in her five starts this year and is a neck away from being undefeated.

"She's the Heartbreak Kid," said Casse of the horse who looked like anything but, happy and social in her stall. "I think she was depressed [after her losses]. I do."

Winless and often not competitive last year, she's transformed, said Casse, after being teamed with jockey Julien Leparoux.

"She's been a whole different animal," he said. "He's really a big part of the equation."

On the year, the Casses have 94 wins and 88 seconds, but in the last month they've finished second so many times – about 25 – that they're good-naturedly throwing up their hands.

"We had such a good spring, and a good winter, too," said Norm, "that we knew at some point there was going to be a little lull."

Rosario, Bourbon Courage on mend

Joel Rosario continued to recover after Saturday's incident in which he was tossed from Bourbon Courage in the Forego. He was off his mounts Monday, but agent Ron Anderson hoped that he'd be back in the saddle today.

"We're lucky that he didn't get hurt worse," said Anderson.

As for what caused the incident, Anderson laughed when asked for details.

"That's the multi-million dollar question," he said.

Available camera angles show Bourbon Courage running toward the back of the field, then cut to a view right after the incident. Anderson said he thinks Rosario and Bourbon Courage clipped heels with Eric Cancel and Takajo, then Bourbon Courage's back foot grabbed his front, causing the horse to somersault.

Bourbon Courage's trainer Graham Motion doubts the incident was that extreme.

"He'd have been covered in dirt if he'd somersaulted," said Motion. "He does have a nasty laceration on grabbing himself, though."

Bourbon Courage is back at Motion's Fair Hill base, enjoying the benefits of the saltwater spa and hyperbaric chamber. Motion thinks the horse will recover in short order from one of the stranger incidents the trainer has experienced.

"I never saw what happened," he said. "But Bourbon Courage will be fine."

So Long

High Noon Rider leads throughout in upset for Weaver

George Weaver finished the post-race formalities after his fourth trip to the winner's circle in two days Monday, glanced over his shoulder as the replay of the \$100,000 Better Talk Now wound down and summed up what he saw in one word.

"Bye," Weaver said, the slight twang of his Louisville upbringing easy to pick out as he watched High Noon Rider pull away late for the second time to win the 1-mile turf stakes at Saratoga Race Course.

Weaver and owner Randy Hill watched the first time from their box just up from the winner's circle, pumping their arms, snapping their fingers, cheering enthusiastically and finally embracing as High Noon Rider said so long to the field as the longest price on the board at nearly 12-1. The Distorted Humor colt won by 3 1/2 lengths over 6-5 favorite A Lot to score for the first time since April at Gulfstream Park and get his first stakes score.

"The last two days have been a lot of fun," Weaver said, celebrating his second win Monday after also doubling Sunday. "It's good because I'm tired as hell. Thank goodness for the adrenaline rush."

High Noon Rider helped provide that needed push right from the start of the Better Talk Now.

Ninth last time in the Grade 2 National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame Stakes Aug. 7 in his

first start since a fever in early July knocked him out of the Manila Stakes, High Noon Rider and Luis Saez took the initiative early and didn't give it up. Weaver and Hill were able to say their goodbyes after High Noon Rider, given a chance against some of the East's top 3-year-olds in dirt stakes in South Florida this winter, got away with an easy early pace.

High Noon Rider clicked off early splits of :25.02 and :50.04, giving Hill and Weaver plenty of confidence, before coming home in splits of :23.26 and :22.36 to win in 1:35.66.

"This colt will try, try, try," Hill said. "I was interested in putting him on the lead today. I was talking to George and noticed that when Irad (Ortiz Jr.) won with him he won on the lead. George

said to Luis in the paddock, 'look, he's got natural speed, let him break, go.' When I saw :25 and :50 I was like, whew."

Weaver said he asked Saez to try and make the lead, but added that he wasn't going to hold the rider to those instructions if circumstances didn't allow it.

"Randy said he wanted to go to the front," said Weaver, who won with Play Unified and Wake Up In Malibu Sunday and with Saratoga Wildcat Monday. "We went to Luis, we didn't force him to do it but we told him, 'warm the horse up good away from the pony and make an attempt to make the lead. If you don't get it we won't be mad at you."

Saez followed instructions and High Noon Rider didn't give any reasons for anyone to be even the slightest bit miffed.

"Today, we warmed up good and the plan was to put him on the lead or be close second," Saez said. "He broke so sharp and we were comfortable. When I asked him coming to the stretch, he took off. He keeps running. You don't have to use the whip or nothing. He keeps going."

The only other time High Noon Rider raced on the lead was the race Hill mentioned, when Ortiz rode him to a maiden-breaking victory going 1 mile in an off-the-turf race last November at Aqueduct. He tried three straight main-track stakes after that, finishing third in the Springboard Mile at Remington Park and getting pulled up in the Grade 2 Holy Bull and fourth via disqualification in the Islamorada Stakes, both at Gulfstream.

Weaver went back to the turf before shipping the colt north to Saratoga, where he keeps the main part of his string from the spring through

fall on the Oklahoma Training Track. High Noon Rider responded with a second in the Cutler Bay Stakes and a win in an optional-claimer, both at Gulfstream.

After a sixth in the Grade 3 Penn Mile, Weaver pointed High Noon Rider to the July 12 Manila but was force to sit it out. Missing that race put High Noon Rider a bit behind for the Hall of Fame, where he finished 5 ½ lengths behind Takeover Target.

"He was going to be one of the choices for the Manila at Belmont but

we had to scratch him. He had a fever," Weaver said. "We went into the Hall of Fame maybe not 100 percent back to action, but we wanted to try it.

"He's a nice horse and you've got to take your opportunities running against straight 3-year-olds while you can. I wanted to see what he'd do at a mile-and-a-sixteenth, it looked like he was doing well enough, but on top of that whatever he did we would get the fitness out of the race that would lead

us into this one."

Bred in Kentucky by the Niarchos Family's Flaxman Holdings and purchased by Hill for \$400,000 at the 2013 Keeneland September yearling sale, High Noon Rider is the fourth foal produced by the A.P. Indy mare Modesty Blaise. She's a full-sister to stakes winner and producer Tomisue's Indy and a half-sister to champion sprinter Aldebaran, Grade 1-winning turf horse Good Journey and Grade 3 turf stakes winner Sea Of Showers.

"I bought him at Keeneland, for a lot of money. It's coming back a little bit," Hill said. "It's a thrill. You don't get to come down here too many times when you're one of the little guys. I'm not Chad (Brown), I'm not Todd (Pletcher), you know?"

Reminded that not too many "little guys" wind up with \$400,000 yearlings by one of the leading sires of this decade out of one of the best families in the stud book, Hill continued to keep it light before heading off to Siro's to celebrate.

"Well, I just raised my hand," he said with a laugh and a final few words.

Yes, you guessed it. "Bye now."

Doubling Up

Bona Venture Stables adds Monday victory to Sunday win

Another day, another victory at Saratoga Race Course for the owner-trainer team of Bona Venture Stables and George Weaver.

Saratoga Wildcat was Bona Venture's second win in as many days in the second race Monday at Saratoga and wound up as the third of four winners over the Sunday-Monday stretch for Weaver.

The 3-year-old D'wildcat gelding broke on the lead of the 6-furlong maiden special weight, repelled a challenge from Choir Director around the far turn and responded to a few left-handed cracks from Manuel Franco in the stretch to break his maiden in his fourth start.

"We were a little disappointed in his attitude last year because he just didn't want to play," said Dan Collins of Bona Venture Stables, which bought the gelding for \$110,000 at the 2014 OBS March sale of selected 2-year-olds in training.

Saratoga Wildcat added to a good run for Bona Venture, which also won the sixth race Sunday at Saratoga with Play Unified and a maiden special weight Tuesday at Finger Lakes with Bonaventure Magic.

Saratoga Wildcat was making his first start since a fifth on the inner track at Aqueduct in mid-December.

"It wasn't so much a concern off the layoff as much as it was first-time gelding. He was a handful last year," Collins said. "He had some really good breezes. We were confident he was pretty fast and he showed it He's a different horse now."

Weaver doubled up later in the card when High Noon Rider recorded a front-running victory in the \$100,000 Better Talk Now Stakes. Weaver won two races Sunday with Wake Up In Malibu and Bona Venture's Play Unified.

Proven Commodity broke on top and established a clear lead up the backstretch, posting fractions of :22.77 and :45.07. Despite the wall of pursuers, Proven Commodity dug in and held them all off, winning by 1 1/2 lengths.

"We were expecting another big performance today actually," Albertrani said. "He ran exactly what we were looking for. He showed a lot of determination. Turning for home, they looked like they were getting to him and once he felt them coming to him, he just took off again."

Although he expected a strong showing from Proven Commodity, Albertrani was nervous when the field turned for home.

"I was a little worried he was may-


aged.



New Dimension

Lady Shipman rates behind pace, speeds to new 5 1/2-furlong mark

You wouldn't guess Lady Shipman just set a course record in Sunday's \$100,000 Smart N Fancy Stakes – or that she had even run – if not for the sweat marks from her saddle. The 3-year-old filly appeared barely winded as she stood quietly in the commotion of the winner's circle. She didn't move a muscle as her connections gathered around and photographers snapped away. A valet pulled

off her saddle and she sauntered lazily to the hose to be sprayed off.

Moments before, Lady Shipman blazed through 5 1/2 furlongs on the turf in 1:00.46, shaving .13 seconds off the previous course record set by Fiddlers Patriot in 2010.


The bombardment of reporters after Lady Shipman's wins is old hat to trainer Kathleen O'Connell, as she's

visited the winner's circle six times this year with the Midshipman filly. Her most recent victory before the Smart N Fancy was also at Saratoga, where she dominated the Coronation Cup by 3 ½ lengths Aug. 3.

"Her best asset's always been her mind," said O'Connell, who trains Lady Shipman for Randall Lowe's Ranlo Investments. "I mean if you look at her beginning races she went to six different places to run. Her demeanor's so good, and yet when the game's on, the game face comes on and she's running. So it's wonderful, very rarely do you find that and very rarely in a 3-year-old filly. And like I say, she's just been wonderful to be around."

Lady Shipman broke a step ahead of her older rivals before Tahnee bounded past for the early lead and an opening quarter-mile of :21.82. Lady Shipman rated patiently under Irad Ortiz Jr. before closing the gap between her and Tahnee as they rounded the far turn. Last year's Smart N Fancy winner Free As A Bird raced three wide as she attempted a late closing charge.

Lady Shipman dug in and floated to the front, leaving Tahnee and Free As A Bird to battle it out for the runner-up spot. Free As A Bird won that race and was 2 3/4 lengths behind the winner.

"She's fast and (O'Connell) told me whatever you want to do with her, she's sweet," Ortiz said. "So I break out of there and I got speed on the inside, so I don't want to chase them to much so I sit right there and relaxed really good and when we turned for home, and I asked her, she kicked off and won it easy."

O'Connell was not surprised that Lady Shipman rated rather than taking the lead from the start.

"I asked him to use his own judgment," O'Connell said about Ortiz's ride. "I mean he's a good rider, she stayed off the pace at OBS (in the OBS Sprint Stakes), so it's not like she has to be in front. Nobody's really abused her or gotten into her the last part. Irad didn't today. I reminded him, because if he doesn't need her there's no sense squeezing the lemon."

Lowe, who bred the filly in Kentucky out of his Mutakddim mare Sumthingtotalkabt, made the trip again from his home in Los Angeles to watch Lady Shipman.

"This one, she takes the cake," Lowe said as he watched the replay in the winner's circle. "This is by far the best horse I've ever owned. I mean look at her, there she goes. And (Free As A Bird) figures they're going to go right on by, and they don't understand that she's got three gears on her, and when the closers come to her, she can come home just as fast as they can. If you look, she's holding them off the whole way. And then he's like 'wait, this is not supposed to happen, I'm supposed to be the closer. She's holding me off.' "

Lowe hopes to run Lady Shipman in the Breeder's Cup Turf Sprint this fall. He recently sold Lady Shipman's 2-yearold full-sister, Just Talkin, to Michael Dubb.

"I didn't know she had broken the track record until I actually looked up. I just saw her open up on the field. And from where we were sitting I just said 'now, now,' and then she just drew away in a hand ride.

"This puts away the fact that a lot of the people in the press say that she's a bona-fide frontrunner. She's not a bona-fide frontrunner. She can rate and I knew she could rate. She rated good at OBS, she rated in Maryland at Pimlico and here she is again."

"CB" stitching, was saddled without incident, but became increasingly difficult to lead as he made has way around the walking ring and out onto the track.

"He can be a little challenging to work around," Brown said. "But he does have some talent. We'll just continue to work with the horse."

Despite the pre-race antics, Verger's talent was on display when the starting gate opened. The 3-year-old Pulpit colt broke well and rode the hedge in midpack around the first of two turns in the 1-mile maiden claimer as Vitiate set ambitious fractions of :23.83, :48.20 and 1:12.63.

Turning for home, a spent Vitiate drifted wide and opened the rail for Verger to charge through. He took the lead outside the furlong marker and drew off to win by 3 1/4 lengths under a hand ride by Javier Castellano, The final time was 1:35.27.

The victory came in Verger's first start since Sept. 20, 2014 at Belmont Park. That race produced next-out winner and future Grade 1 winner Frosted, while Verger sprinted 6 furlongs on the dirt and finished 10th of 11. Sunday, Brown stretched Verger out and opted for a surface change.

"He won nicely," Brown said. "He's had some minor issues and took his time to get along. He just as an older horse started showing me signs that he was looking to get on the grass longer, so we gave it a shot and it worked."

The Hall of Fame jockey allowed Runhappy to gradually reach the lead from the outside post, it could have taken strides but Prado doled it out over 2 furlongs. Runhappy opened up 2 lengths on the turn, but Prado still sat like a bee was buzzing around his ear. Straightening into the stretch, Prado began to pump, rhythmical, steady, elbows low like always, weight deep in his heels, butt down, a commercial for core strength. Prado waved his whip right-handed, smacked the longshot twice and handrode him to the wire. At the wire, Prado stood up, no pump, no celebration, just another notch on his belt, another line on his Hall of Fame plaque.

The race took 1:21.54. The walk back to the jocks' room took much longer.

Pristine and clean in red, white and blue silks, Prado walked, next to a Pinkerton. The crowd cheered, like raindrops off an umbrella. "Edgarrrrrr." Prado stopped for an autograph, scribbling across the 11 line on the King's Bishop page of a program. Prado walked a step, then stopped. "Great ride, Edgar." He posed with a man in a baseball hat holding a can of Heineken. "How about Edgar winning a Grade 1." Prado leaned down and put his arm around a kid in a Red Sox jersey. "Edgar. Edgar. Edgar." A skinny blond in cut off shorts told him she loved him. He said, simply, "Thank you." He posed in a photo, "for Tasha." A guy tried to take a photo and had the phone shooting the wrong way, Prado waited. "Edgar, you're the best, you made me a lot of money in my day, you really did." Prado smiled. "Edgar, you made a lot of money for yourself." Prado walked a step, then stopped, walked two steps and stopped. "Love you buddy." A teenager, with a backward baseball hat and an Abercrombie & Fitch T-shirt shook his hand and smiled, a boy to a man. Brothposed awkwardly, but proudly. God Bless America rang through the speakers.

It took Prado 11 minutes to walk from the grandstand to the apron of the jocks' room, finally signing his last autograph across American Pharoah's photo on the front of the Travers Day program. Prado walked into the covered aisle of the jocks' room and that's when the honors got higher – from Prado's peers, from his comrades. Spanish, Irish and American valets high-fived him on their way to saddle horses for the Forego. Then the jockeys for the Forego answered clerk of scales Tim Kelly's order to leave the jocks' room, meeting Prado at the door. The breadth of Prado's achievement, his career, resonated loud and clear. There is nothing like peer approval. California-based Martin Pedroza shoulder bumped Prado. New York-based John Velazquez bear-hugged him. Eighteen-year-old Eric Cancel him. French-born Julien Leparoux spoke English. spect, but you have to earn the respect, too."

Jose Lezcano spoke Spanish. Panamanian Cornelio Velasquez combined the two. Twelve jockeys walked out of the room and 12 jockeys congratulated Prado.

He took a deep breath.

"It feels great. I've been blessed so many times in my career, to come back here and win a Grade 1 here, it's another great experience, another blessing in my career," Prado said. "I rode a lot of great horses, met a lot of great people here, to come back and win a Grade 1 for new connections, it's special."

Prado dominated Maryland racing from 1991 to 1998, before venturing to Saratoga in 1999. He won three Saratoga riding titles (2002, 2005, 2006) to go along with titles at Belmont and Aqueduct. He won the Whitney, Travers, Alabama, Ballerina, Vanderbilt, Adirondack, Ballston Spa, Diana, Forego, Glens Falls, Jim Dandy, King's Bishop, Lake George, Lake Placid, Saratoga Special, Test, Woodward...you get the drift.

And then he didn't. Prado's business dwindled. It was a long walk - Saratoga's version of the He left the New York circuit to ride on the Florida circuit year round.

"It's like taking a fish out of the water, a bird without a wing, I totally miss it a lot but it is what it is," Prado said. "I don't accept it, you don't accept something being taken away, something you love so much, but you've got to go with the flow, if I accepted it, I couldn't come here. I still can ride, I can still deliver the job. I need the horse to do it."

Runhappy was the horse, leaping out of an allowance race at Ellis Park to win a Grade 1 stakes at Saratoga. Just like old times, Prado was back at the top.

"I tried to just ride him past the wire," Prado said, "Then I had a great feeling in my heart, just blessed again."

Blessed for the win and blessed by the response to his return to Saratoga.

"It feels great, to have friends, it's such a competitive game, it's nice to have friends care about you," ers Irad and Jose Ortiz fist bumped and high-fived Prado said. "You have to treat this game with re-
