

# Ready hoys? Two-year-old colts advance to try turf stakes

he Grade III With Anticipation attracted a full field of juveniles. With that full field comes a full field of

Lou Brissie and Sensational Slam own stakes wins; neither on turf. Typhoon Slew, Powhatan County, Air Support and Silver Medallion have wins on the turf; none of them past the maiden ranks. Grigio, Manchurian High and Soldat are still maidens. Kid Curry won a maiden claimer and makes his turf de-

Neil Howard opted out of the dirt stakes division with Dogwood Stable's Lou Brissie and introduces turf to the Grade III stakes winner.

The son of Limehouse won his first two starts including the Grade III Kentucky Juvenile at Churchill Downs. He slammed into Kantharos in his next start, when a well-beaten second in the Grade III Bashford Manor, and then finished fourth in the Grade II Sanford opening weekend. Lou Brissie makes his much anticipated first start around two turns. Alan Garcia picks up the ride from the injured Robby Albarado.

Todd Pletcher attempts the turf for the first time with the undefeated Sensa-

tional Sam. Owned by Bobby Flay, the son of Grand Slam has capitalized on his Ontario-breeding eligibility by winning the Clarendon and the Vandal over Woodbine's Polytrack surface. Sensational Slam breezed 5 furlongs in 1:01 over the Oklahoma turf in preparation for this assignment. John Velazquez rides for the first time.

Silver Medallion, Air Support and Powhatan County graduated over the Saratoga turf this summer.

Chad Brown sent out TYB Stable's Silver Medallion to a game win on the turf earlier in the meet. The son of Badge Of Silver tracked the leaders before winning a fight - bumping included - with Forum. Garrett Gomez steps in for Velazquez who rides Sensational Slam for his main client Todd Pletcher.

"I'm looking for him to move forward a bit, he needs to come forward," Brown said. "I liked his maiden win and if he moves forward a bit, he'll be competitive. Most of my horses develop as we go along and he acts like the type that will cooperate and do that."

Brown entered Silver Medallion confidently in his debut and then quickly began to lose confidence in the paddock as Silver Medallion succumbed to the pressure.

"I was a little worried about him in the paddock, he was coming unglued a bit, and I didn't see that coming from him," Brown said. "I was worried he had burned too much energy in the paddock, he had a bad post, we got hung out there in the first turn, I was thinking, 'Man, this day is not going right

for this horse.' When he still won, I was impressed, I know the time wasn't real fast, but considering everything that happened to him, he could have run much better than that."

Silver Medallion bumped and battled Forum to a nose decision. The latter re-

turned to break his maiden later in the meet.

"He could have packed it in down the lane but he fought on and beat that horse, I like the horse quite a bit, he's sound and doing well," Brown said. "I wanted to run him in the Pilgrim but it's too far to train him up to, so I figured we'd run him in here."

Powhatan County made his debut at Keeneland before trainer George Weaver put him away for his turf debut at Saratoga which he duly won. Owned by Richlyn Farm, the son of Fusaichi Pegasus shipped to Monmouth 17 days later for the Continental Mile and was upset as the favorite. He finished fourth but was moved up to third after bumping late in the stretch. Weaver brushes that off and wheels him back in 19 days. Javier Castellano, aboard for the maiden win, reunites with Powhatan County.

How does Weaver know that race didn't take too much out of him?

"I don't. I don't know. He's a nifty horse, he's doing really well, I hope that race didn't take a toll out of him, he doesn't act like it did in the morning," Weaver said. "We were the favorite in the race and I thought he was doing well, sometimes it's easier to run them than train them, we thought about waiting for this race and that's how a lot of trainers do it these days, I just felt like he was doing great, he's going to be the favorite in a \$100,000 stake, let's run here and worry about the With Anticipation when it comes up."

Shug McGaughey thought about the With Anticipation as soon as Air Support broke his maiden Aug. 13. The Stuart Janney homebred made his debut on the dirt at Belmont, finished a deceptively good fifth and then pounced when switched to the turf. He stalked after a quarter in 22 3/5 seconds and a half in 45 4/5. The son of Smart Strike hit the lead and withstood a late rally from With Anticipation starter Grigio.

"He came out of his last race good. He was a little green, chased a pretty hot pace, we'll see where he fits in this scheme of things. I think he can step it up, he had a real good work the other day. For him to learn how to run, he's got to run," McGaughey said. "I've liked him all along, I was hoping he would be farther along than this, he shed his frogs at Belmont, I lost a little time with him. Obviously, I hope he wins, but hopefully it'll move him closer to where I want him to be. The race helped him a lot physically, he's starting to shape up. Instead of being a dumpy 2-year-old, he's starting to look like I thought he would look."

Typhoon Slew represents owner Joseph LaCombe and trainer Mike Maker. The Stormy Atlantic colt crushed maidens at Ellis Park in his most recent start. Julien Leparoux rides.

Don Adam's Grigio nearly ran down Air Support in his turf debut but fell a nose short for trainer Jim Baker and jockey Calvin Borel.

Trainer Will Phipps, who upset the sister stakes (the P.G. Johnson) with a maiden, entered Bluegrass Empire Stable's Manchurian High. He finished a distant third in Kantharos' runaway Saratoga Special victory. Freddie Lenclud has the call.

Stan Hough introduces Kid Curry to the turf. Owned by the trainer and Robert Sahn, the son of Posse took an off-the-turf maiden claimer opening week. Cornelio Velasquez has the return call.

Kiaran McLaughlin entered maiden Soldat for owners Harvey Clarke and Craig Robertson. Second twice on the dirt, he makes his turf debut under Alan Garcia

# On Target

#### Pugh, Big Brownie aim for N.Y.-bred stakes

Due to equal parts timing and circumstance, it has been a slower than normal meet for trainer Peter Pugh. With only a long Labor Day weekend left in the 40-day meet, his horses have run six times.

Today, he'll saddle Big Brownie in the \$70,000 Saratoga Dew for New York-bred fillies going 9 furlongs on the main track. A win would more than make up for the summer doldrums.

"You're not kidding. You couldn't put more emphasis on that than you are, that's for sure," Pugh said. "In the beginning of the meet, when the horses were all healthy, the races weren't filling. I ended up having to run in open company just to get a race. New York-bred races on the turf sprinting weren't filling, even the long ones; either that, or they weren't using them. So we sat on horses and sat on horses, and now one of them is hurt. I had a filly in the other day and I had to scratch her because she got to coughing. We've had some bad luck incidents along the way. Welcome to racing, right? It happens, especially with young horses."

The 4-year-old chestnut daughter of Wheelaway, owned by Pugh and Wide Rill Farm, has run second in her last two starts, sprinting, since winning a 1-mile allowance at Belmont Park May 2. She stretches out in the Saratoga Dew, which Pugh sees as an advantage.

"We've been limited in our opportunities so far this meet, and I've had to run her seven-eighths of a mile the last two times she's run," Pugh said. "I can't get any long races to go. I think a mile and an eighth fits her nicely. Whether she's good enough to beat a couple of those fillies in there, I don't know. But, if a mile and an eighth moves her up, which I'm hoping it does, you never know.'

Pugh would like to see a Saratoga Dew victory for Big Brownie, who has two wins and two seconds in five starts this year, and has earned \$91,384 lifetime.

"It would be nice if we could leave out of here winning that, that's for sure," said Pugh, 3-for-15 with his small stable this year. "Besides that, I like the filly a lot. She's a real trouper. I always think about them first. It would be nice for her, too. She's been pretty consistent. How much quality she has is up in the air, but it doesn't seem to matter where I run her; it doesn't seem to bother her. She always shows up."

Trainer Kate Feron hopes for a little divine intervention for My Dinah. The 5-year-old mare bred by the late John Hettinger and owned by Akindale Farm rallied to win the Fleet Indian by a head at Saratoga July 30.

In last year's Saratoga Dew, My Dinah was clear in midstretch before being caught near the wire and finishing third, beaten two heads.

'Oh my God, that was close," Feron said. "She was 2 1/2 [lengths] in front at the end and she just got hit at the wire. That was a heartbreaker. You have to have some luck come your way sometimes, and hopefully John's looking down on us and is going to bring us some luck. She's so honest and true, and just a pleasure to be around."

Akindale nearly parted company with the daughter of Victory Gallop.

"She was nominated to the weanling sale in 2005, and she got ringworm from head to toe," said Feron. "I remember going down and looking at her, and she looks a lot like Lady D'Accord, who is her mother's full-sister. I'm thinking, 'How am I going to present it to Mr. Hettinger? How am I going to tell him the horse was going to have to be scratched out of the sale?' I told him that Lady D'Accord was scratched out of a sale, too, because she got a laceration on her leg, and maybe it was a good omen, because Lady D'Accord turned out to be such a great horse."

In her last race, My Dinah ran last of 11, beaten 14 lengths, in the \$100,000 Yaddo for state-breds going 9 furlongs on the turf, where she is 0-for-6 lifetime.

"She was doing so great, I had to do something," Feron said. "I either had to breeze her, or I had to run her. I figured she's feeling so good, maybe I'll just give her a try on the grass because the very first race she ran in her life was on the grass, and she was closing. I was just kidding myself. But, I'm happy with it now because she did get another race up here and it wasn't a bad experience. She just doesn't like it."

In the Fleet Indian, My Dinah edged Meese Rocks for the win; Meese Rocks came back to win the \$75,000 Union Avenue Aug. 23. My Dinah ran fifth to Rightly So in the Grade III Bed o' Roses in July, and second to her last fall at Aqueduct; Rightly So captured the Grade I Ballerina Aug. 28.

"She's been running with some really tough fillies," Feron said, "but she's a tough filly, too."

Wicked Diva has never run farther than a mile in five starts, but owner-trainer Mike Hushion doesn't see distance as an issue. First or second in her first four races, she was last of five in an optional claimer in the slop Aug. 23.

Ramon Dominguez, up for all of her races, will be back aboard.

"We're going under the assumption that the last race was a throw-out because of the track," Hushion said. "That was Ramon's feedback, as well. He said two jumps out of the gate, he knew she wasn't handling the surface. We thought it was to our advantage. We had no idea she wouldn't handle the wet like that. I'm anxious to run her. I think we can throw the last one out, and we should go in there in good shape."

Banker's Buy is the most expensive horse in the race, purchased as a yearling for \$450,000 at Keeneland September in 2007. Trained by Nick Zito for Edward Cox Jr., the 4-year-old Distorted Humor filly has been off since winning an entrylevel allowance at Belmont July 8.

"We're just trying to win a race," Zito said. "She ran good last time, and hopefully she'll do the same. She was in opening week and had to be scratched, and we just waited for this race. She's a nice filly, and she's well-bred."

The others are Don't Forget Gil, winner of the Grade III Florida Oaks who ran second by a neck to Funny Moon in the Coaching Club American Oaks last year; and Landlash, a 1-mile allowance winner at Belmont in June who was sixth in the Lake Luzerne at Saratoga Aug.

# Awesome Maria handles turf try

lready a Grade II stakes winner and Grade I placed when she joined trainer Todd Pletcher's stable three months ago Awesome Maria needed a spot for her 2010 debut.

The 3-year-old filly could have tried the Grade I Alabama here Aug. 21. She would not have looked out of place in the Grade III Victory Ride on Travers Day.

Day.

"You want to get a good comeback race and you want to feel like you have a chance to win it too," Pletcher said.

"We were looking for a place to bring a filly back that's already won a Grade II stakes and we were like 'Well, we don't want to run her in the Victory Ride, it's a little too short for her, and the Alabama is a little too long."

At a mile on the turf, Thursday's \$70,000 Riskaverse was just right.

Owned by E. Paul Robsham Stable, which moved its horses to Pletcher this year, Awesome Maria made a stylish turf debut – stalking the early pace of longshot Shirley She Can and holding off Snow Top Mountain by a half-length with In Te Domine a troubled third.

Ridden by John Velazquez, the winner covered the mile in 1:35.06 while paying 4.70 as the favorite.

Shirley She Can went right to the

front in the stakes, which was split into two divisions, and set fractions of 23.79 and 47.67 seconds. In her first start since October, Awesome Maria found a comfort zone in second with In Te Domine and Tidal Pool third and fourth through the early stages. Snow Top Mountain settled farther back in 6fth

Shirley She Can couldn't maintain the tempo in the stretch after 6 furlongs in 1:11.39, and the pack swooped in like early birds at a yard sale. Awesome Maria won the mini-race, getting first run on Snow Top Mountain, who ranged alongside but couldn't get past. In Te Domine checked behind horses at the eighth pole and rallied once clear to take third.

Velazquez, aboard for the first time in a race, left impressed.

"Oh yeah, that's a nice filly," he said. "First time on grass, it set up perfect for her. We worked her on the grass and she worked pretty good, but raceday is different sometimes. She was a little green, undecided and she started running a little bit spotty, looking at things, switching leads, not really paying attention to the things she needed to."

In the stretch, Velazquez asked Awesome Maria for more energy and she powered into gear – helped in part by the presence of Snow Top Mountain.

"Come on, Mama, we've got to work now," Velazquez told his filly. "Passing horses, the ears went up and she was just kind of waiting. The other horse came to her down the stretch, and that made her pick it up again."

Pletcher won his third stakes of the meet with the Robsham horses, who joined his barn from Stan Hough this year.


"She ran very well for Stan last year and we're lucky to have her," Pletcher said. "Baked cakes, you know?"

Skillfully prepared by both barns in her career, Awesome Maria improved to 3-for-5 with two seconds and \$313,000 earned. The homebred daughter of Maria's Mon and Discreetly Awesome (a half-sister to King's Bishop and Amsterdam winner Discreetly Mine) leaves Saratoga with options.

"It will depend on how she trains, but we could consider running her back on the turf and I wouldn't be afraid of looking at something like the Cotillion or the Beldame even," Pletcher said. "She's already a Grade II winner on the dirt and she's proven she can run on the turf now, so we've got a lot of places to go."

"You want to get a good comeback race and you want to feel like you have a chance to win it too. # Evil Queen

Proctor filly casts speedy spell on 'Lisa' and the rest in runaway

Dateline NBC's Keith Morrison waited outside the clubhouse bathroom for Tim Snyder, owner/trainer of the undefeated Lisa's Booby Trap before the second division of the Riskaverse. The cameras had followed Snyder to the bathroom door.

A fan walked over and asked Morrison a simple question.

"What if she loses?"

Morrison didn't have an answer.

Tom Proctor did.

Proctor answered with a runaway win by Queen Of The Creek, who wired nine rivals including the heralded Lisa's Booby Trap who never threatened and wound up last in the \$70,000 stakes. Owned by Tim Turney and Nathan Tinkler, Queen Of The Creek opened up by 5 lengths and won by 3 1/2 over Ultimate Class and Kittylicious, finishing the mile in 1:33.94.

After the race, Proctor walked down the steps of the clubhouse, NBC cameras were nowhere to be seen.

"There is no such thing as fairy tales in this business. Just remember that," Proctor said. "They build up all these

fairy tales, there is no such thing. This is not Disneyland. I'm sorry, I hate to ruin everybody's story but she's a flatout runner. She just went a mile 1:34."

Snyder and his one-horse stable of Lisa's Booby Trap took Saratoga by storm when she won the Loudonville, a restricted stakes, Aug. 6. The victory improved her career record to 4-for-4 (by a combined 42 3/4 lengths) and made Snyder a celebrity. He debated about where to run Lisa's Booby Trap and ultimately decided to switch her to the turf. She was sent off even money against proven turf fillies.

Julien Leparoux took a light hold of Queen Of The Creek as she broke sharply and sprinted to the lead in a matter of strides.

Kent Desormeaux settled Lisa's Booby Trap toward the inside in fourth. Queen Of The Creek opened 5 lengths after a quarter in 23.98 and a half in 46.76. With Leparoux's hands low and her head high, she skipped into the far turn with a commanding lead over Ultimate Class, Sea Road and Lisa's Booby

Trap. They were in deep water. Lisa's Booby Trap retreated in the middle of the turn and Queen Of The Creek cut the corner like she was late for dinner. Ultimate Class stuck to the chase but was no match for the winner. Kittylicious caught Doe Run for third.

Queen Of The Creek earned her second win at the meet and first career stakes score. Proctor brought Queen Of The Creek to Saratoga specifically to

win a two-other-than allowance race. That day, Proctor told Leparoux to drop her head.

"She's a wild-running horse. I told Julien, rock and roll. I tried to rate her twice, it didn't work," Proctor said. "She's not a run-off in the morning, she's not easy, but she's not like that. She's actually pretty good, it's amazing. Theat-

rical, they're weird horses. From what I know, you can't wrestle them, I tried to wrestle her at Arlington, I tried to wrestle her at Churchill, then said to hell with that."

Queen Of The Creek made her debut last fall at Keeneland when fourth going 6 furlongs. She won her turf debut a month later before Proctor put her away for the winter. She won her 3-year-old debut at Keeneland by nearly 5 lengths and then Proctor decided to change tactics. She finished third as the favorite in the American 1,000 Guineas at Arlington and 12th in the Regret at Churchill Downs. That would be the last time she was stifled.

Queen Of The Creek continued to contrib-

ute to a healthy Saratoga for Proctor who went winless in his two previous stints at Saratoga. This summer, his small stable has produced four wins, five seconds and two thirds from 19 starts. He finished second with Snow Top Mountain in the first division of the Riskaverse earlier on the card.

"Through the last couple of years, I had a bunch of seconds, so this year I brought some horses who I thought could win races, ones I could drop a notch. I didn't like not winning a race for two years," Proctor said. "When I was a kid, I was here with my dad (Willard) for two years and didn't win a race, he came here with a good stable and might have had a third in the Test, that was about it. I was here for four seasons without winning a race. That's why I never came here, when you see a guy who's a legend in your mind not win a race, it makes you wonder."

# She gets an A

Floating Alone moves to turf, graduates in style

n the same hot, humid afternoon that Lisa's Booby Trap failed her test going a route on the grass, Floating Alone passed hers.

Floating Alone's exam came in Thursday's fifth race and the Friends Lake filly trained by Tom Bush and ridden by Garrett Gomez had just enough to edge Skips Prospect by a neck. She covered the 1 1/16 miles on the Mellon Turf in 1:43.45. It was a huge improvement over her first race, a well-beaten fourth going short on the dirt starting from the rail.

Bush said he was pretty sure Thursday's race – for New York-bred 2-year-old fillies – would suit Floating Alone, even though she drew the inside again.

"Certainly stretching out and the female side of this filly's family has been all grass," Bush said. "She surprised me a little bit first time. Even though she had not a great post for a first-time starter, she got away real tardy. She looked all discombobulated, even after she leveled off in the lane and she just didn't seem to be going as good as what I thought she trained in the morning. I said, 'Let me get her on the grass right away and see if we've got something.' And maybe we do."

Skips Prospect was on the outside as the two ran through the stretch and Floating Alone showed grit to get the victory for owners and breeders Chester and Mary Broman.

"She really did," Bush said. "Garrett said she wasn't particularly confident where she was. She probably learned a whole lot today."

• In the sixth, Pearly Blue showed that going long, longer, longest was the ideal scenario. Jockey Kent Desormeaux got the job done in the 1 3/8-mile marathon by a half-length, despite being wide on two of three turns on the inner turf course.

Pearly Blue, a daughter of Empire Maker out of the Red Ransom mare Western Ransom, flirted with winning since her debut on the last day of the 2009 Saratoga season, but did not break her maiden until June at Belmont Park. She made it two victories in a row in the allowance/optional claimer for owner/breeder Dr. John Chandler.

"She's bred to go that far," trainer Bill Mott said. "She's got an extremely stout pedigree with a sire that has won going a mile and a half, he won the Belmont. She's got a lot of stamina in her pedigree. It's just not easy to find those races sometimes."


Pearly Blue – whose dam is a full-sister to Grade I steeplechase winner Red Letter Day – returned \$26.

• Apparently the lessons he received during a workout Sunday morning sunk in because Technique turned in a more seasoned performance winning the seventh, a sprint for 2-year-old maidens on the dirt. Under Edgar Prado, the Speightstown colt owned by Jack Jones Jr., and David Houchin, broke alertly from post nine, set the pace and held off Cane Garden Bay by a head.

In his first start, Aug. 3 at Delaware for trainer Graham Motion, the colt bobbled at the break, rushed into contention and weakened.

"I worked him the other day," Prado said, "and he was a little lazy to come out of the gate, so we put a little speed into him. Today, he broke good from an outside post, we took advantage of that and tried to get him into the race. Speed carries most of the time in these kind of races. He was moving along pretty good.

• No, owner Bill Pape and trainer Jonathan Sheppard did not sweep the five jump races at the Spa this summer.

Trainer Tom Voss and champion jockey Paddy Young took care of that matter in the first, an allowance/optional claiming hurdle. Young guided Dumbarton Farm's Easy Red to the lead at the top of the stretch and the 8-yearold Charismatic gelding won by 2 3/4 lengths over Pape and Sheppard's Lead Us Not with Saluda Sam third.

Voss said some extra care helped produce a better effort than the horse's two tries over the course this summer. He was beaten 22 lengths at the Open House and pulled up Aug. 12.

"The horse really ran well all summer (a second and a third before Saratoga). He got here and his back was sore," Voss said. "We did some chiropractic work on him and he got better in the last 10 days. He was just much happier and going better."

• Wascally Rabbit gave his connections something to cheer about with a three-quarter length victory in the second, a \$35,000 maiden claimer for 2-year-olds going 6 furlongs. In the first of his three starts at the meet July 24, the Imperialism colt was beaten 31 lengths by Wine Police. He improved to finish second in his next outing Aug. 13 and got the money third time out with a far more impressive performance for Gary Contessa and jockey Mike Luzzi.

"Actually, I've known him for a while now," Luzzi said. "I breezed him before he ever ran. In his first start he was real green. In his second start he was green. Still today, he was a tad green. He's gotten better each start. He's probably a little better than this because he's still fooling around in the stretch."

• In the finale, Theresmyeverything romped to a 6 3/4-length victory in a 1 1/16-mile maiden race for New York-bred 2-year-olds on the grass. Like Floating Alone, he loved the new surface.

Owned by Mark Dedomenico (of Blind Luck fame), the Star Dabbler colt made one start at Arlington Park, finishing third over the synthetic surface Aug. 14 before being shipped to Linda Rice. It didn't take her long to figure him out watching him gallop on the Oklahoma turf

"I just had a feeling when he arrived in my barn that he was going to love the grass," she said. "I took him over and tried him out and he loved it. I went right to the turf with him."




























# cupofcoffee Where to next?
