

Havre de Grace follows plan, downs boys in Grade I

Larry Jones picked up a shank, shook jockey Ramon Dominguez's hand and walked toward Havre de Grace as the field began to assemble for riders up in the paddock.

"The only thing I can tell you, Ramon, is when you turn for home, light out, don't let these boys think they have a shot."

Dominguez nodded, went out, and did exactly that.

And, indeed, the boys didn't have a shot.

Fox Hill Farm's Havre de Grace won the Grade I Woodward Stakes by 1 1/4 lengths over Flat Out and Rule.


Jones watched the race from the same clubhouse TV he watched Proud Spell win the 2008 Alabama, bracing on a trash can for the first part and bouncing off his feet for the second.

At the three-eighths pole, as Havre de

her career and first against the boys. Jones' confidence was vindicated.

"I ain't never seen where boys are good at something and there wasn't some smart ass girl that thinks she can do it better," Jones cackled.

Havre de Grace followed Rachel Alexandra's lead, giving fillies victories in two of the past three runnings of the 58-year-old stakes.

Havre de Grace broke alertly from the 6 stall, Dominguez pressed her lightly to get a position early in the 9-furlong stakes as Rule shot to the lead. Convocation stayed close in second with Rule's stablemate Mission Impazible third and Havre de Grace outside in fourth.

After a quarter mile in 23.93, Rule enjoyed a clear lead as Mission Impazible and Convocation switched spots and Havre de Grace still lobbed along in the clear in fourth. Mambo Meister came next on the outside with Flat Out and Giant Oak inside, completing the compact field of seven. Ice Box trailed.

Rule posted a half in 48.09 as Mission Impazible tracked in second and Havre de Grace stalked menacingly on the outside. Flat Out made up ground quickly to get on the heels of Havre de Grace – and provoke Jones' plea to Dominguez. After three quarters in 1:11.95, Rule still led but Havre de Grace rolled to him as Mission Impazible came under pressure and Flat Out entered the fray.

Turning for home, Rule clung to his lead as Dominguez quickly switched his whip to his left hand and gave the filly a quick call, collaring Rule in a flash. Passing the eighth pole, Havre de Grace gained the lead for good as Flat Out stayed to the task, getting past Rule late to complete his second game second at Saratoga. Havre de Grace finished 9 furlongs in 1:49.18.

"She really did it the right way, she showed she's the real deal," Dominguez said. "I wanted to be very forwardly placed, that's what Larry and I talked about, I knew Rule would go and I wasn't too happy to be wide around the turn but at the same time I wasn't going to give up my position. She settled so nicely and covered so much ground, I was able to track them and she relaxed so much for me. It was a good feeling turning for home, she just keeps giving when you ask her."

In 13 career starts, the daughter of Saint Liam has never finished worse than third. She's won the Woodward, Cotillion, Azeri, Apple Blossom, Obeah and finished second in the Go For Wand, Delaware Oaks, Alabama and Delaware Handicap.

The latter was tough to swallow as Havre de Grace finished behind 3-year-old filly champion Blind Luck for the fourth time, third time in a photo. Blind Luck beat her by a nose in the Delaware Oaks, a neck in the Alabama and a nose in the Delaware Handicap where Havre de Grace battled Blind Luck the length of the stretch and lost a heartbreaker. After the loss, Jones and Porter watched Blind Luck's every move, if she came back for the Personal Ensign, that's where they would go. If she stayed away from Saratoga, they would try the Woodward.

"After getting beat in the Delaware Handicap, we had to start thinking we need to get back in front of the division," Jones said. "We were afraid Blind Luck was going to come run in the Personal Ensign. If she got on a plane to come here, I wanted Jerry (Hollen-

dorfer) to know, I'm loading and going because we're ready, don't think you're coming 3,000 miles and hook it easy. Apparently he decided he ought to rest her and get ready for the Breeders' Cup."

Jones and Fox Hill's Rick Porter put together a tour schedule at the beginning of the year, culminating in the Breeders' Cup. An easy first step in the Azeri at Oaklawn Park, check. The Grade I Apple Blossom, check. The Grade III Obeah back at home, check. Then the Delaware Handicap. Ouch. Once Blind Luck decided to say in California, Jones and Porter went on

a mission

"Early in the year, we went over a gameplan of what Rick wanted to accomplish. We wanted the Apple Blossom, we wanted the Delaware Handicap and we wanted to take on the boys somewhere," Jones said. "He wanted to put her in a situation where she could not only win a championship for the fillies but could be considered for Horse of the Year. We knew we had to beat the boys for that to be a consideration. I said let's look toward the Woodward. Early, this was our number one spot to attempt it and it all came together."

Havre de Grace is a nose away from being 5-for-5 on the year. The Woodward represented a big task – coming off a seven-week layoff and taking on seven rivals who had combined to win 35 races.

"It is relief," Jones said on his way to pick up his papers and silks after the race. "This was the race I was a little concerned with, the seven weeks, we counted backwards from the Breeders' Cup on what we wanted to do. If I had an iffy race, I was hoping she could overcome this, I'm tickled, relieved, it took off a lot of pressure, now it's just not goofing it up."

Jones left with a check for \$450,000 and an established plan to get to the November 5 Breeders' Cup. First the Beldame at Belmont Park Oct. 1, then ship to Keeneland to prepare for the clash of the year with Blind Luck or the boys or perhaps both.

Jones won't hesitate.

"Nobody, I'll be honest with you," Jones said when asked which one of his horses compared to Havre de Grace. "Maybe Eight Belles would have gotten to this level, she wasn't at the time. Hard Spun was fast but he really had to start to work after a mile. Proud Spell just didn't have the size to her. You can ship (Havre de Grace), she doesn't care. She's easy to gallop, she just lopes around, if you want it, you've got it, if you don't want it, they're happy not to. I've never had one like this, seriously, I just haven't."

Dominguez knew that long ago.

"He told me that three races back," he said. "She's the whole package."

Got It

Jackson Bend charges through late to claim
Grade I for Zito

Nick Zito bounded into the winner's circle after Saturday's Grade I Forego, slapped assistant trainer/ exercise rider Carlos Correa on the shoulder and bellowed, "We still got it, we still got it."

Jackson Bend made sure they never lost it.

Repeating his effort from a win in the seasonopening James Marvin Stakes at the same 7-furlong distance July 22, the 4-year-old charged from seventh in the nine-horse field to score by 3 1/4 lengths over Jersey Town with Aikenite a head back in third. The winner, owned by Bob LaPenta and Fred Brei, captured his second consecutive race after losing 12 in a row – all eight last year and his first four of 2011.

"He's got a big heart, a great big heart, a heart like

most won the Preakness, should have won the Preakness, last year. He's all right."


Saturday, he was better than that.

Jackson Bend broke a step behind the leaders from the rail, but responded to Corey Nakatani's early hustling to draft into a spot behind the pace set by Hamazing Destiny. Sidney's Candy ranged up from the leader's inside through a quarter-mile in 22.09 seconds, followed by longshot Escrow Kid. Jersey Town found his spot in fourth, followed by Regal Ransom and Rule By Night. Jackson Bend was seventh, on the rail, waiting.

Sidney's Candy led narrowly through a half-mile in 44.45, but quickly felt the pressure and weakened as Hamazing Destiny re-claimed the lead exiting the turn. Jersey Town swung out and made a play for the lead.

Escrow Kid tried to hang tough. Behind them, Jackson Bend passed horses on the turn and blasted through horses in the stretch to overwhelm Hamazing Destiny and roll away from Jersey Town. Aikenite, last of nine much of the way, rallied late to claim third. The final time was 1:22.08 and the winner returned \$8.90 as the second choice behind Sidney's Candy.

The result was the same as the Marvin, but the tactics were different as Jackson Bend wound up farther back in the field. Nakatani liked his horse's versatility.

"Today he settled, last time he was in the race more," said the jockey. "When he's fresh he sits close and when he's run a big race like he did last time he sits off it a little more. I didn't want to change anything but I know what he's capable of after riding him. I just let him find that cruising speed, I asked him to start picking it up and he did. When I set him down he was there for me."

The winner came back covered in grit, soaked in sweat and with a shadow roll that used to be white. Nakatani looked the same and needed a rinse in the winner's circle before posing for photos.

"He's small, not very big at all, but he's tough," Nakatani said. "He ran though the dirt, really ran for me. He's got heart, that's what it takes. Racehorses come in all shapes and sizes. Look at Zenyatta, look at Jackson Bend. He's small, but he's a fighter."

Bred in Florida by Brei's Jacks Or Better Farm, the winner became a millionaire with the victory, his seventh in 20 starts. The son of Hear No Evil broke his maiden in his second start as a 2-year-old at Calder. He then won four consecutive stakes at Calder at 2 and found a spot in the early Triple Crown talk last year with seconds in the Holy Bull, Fountain of Youth and Wood Memorial. Twelfth in the Kentucky Derby, he wound up third in the Preakness – beaten less than a length by Lookin At Lucky.

Jackson Bend started 2011 with

trainer Stanley Gold in Florida, and ran well without winning in four stakes starts. Zito and Correa took over and the horse started working at Oklahoma in June. The time in Saratoga paid off with the James Marvin victory over three of Saturday's rivals and really paid off with the Grade I tally in the Forego.

"You know what gets me? The names of the races," Zito said. "The Forego, the Woodward, those are great races. To me, it's a big deal. Horses like Kelso, Forego, we always talk about that. You win that kind of race, it means something."

Ask The Moon wires second Grade I of the meet

Cormac McCarthy once wrote, "What he loved in horses, was what he loved in men, the blood and the heat of the blood that ran them. All his reverence and all his fondness and all the leaning of his life were for the ardent hearted and they would always be so and never be otherwise."

If bravery can be measured in furlongs, Ask The Moon was 10 furlongs brave in the Grade I Personal Ensign Saturday. The daughter of Malibu Moon was leg-weary, whole-body weary, weary enough to slide out into the middle of the racetrack in the stretch, looking, hoping, praying for the finish line. Javier Castellano had been there before: Ask The Moon did the same thing in the stretch of the Grade I Ruffian, and still found enough for the win.

"I don't know, she did it again today," the jockey said. "She drifts a little when she gets tired, nothing wrong."

"I think she was just very tired, very tired at the end," Marty Wolfson's assistant trainer Heather Irion said. "A mile and a quarter was hard for her, I don't think it's anything to be concerned about, she was just a little leg weary and she was looking for the finish line"

The 6-year-old broke on top as she did in the Grade

I Ruffian a month ago, leading the pack through fractions of 23.43 and 47.37 seconds. Castellano sat motionless, poised over her withers.

"She's not rank, just cruising along, she's quick out of the gate and people can't keep up with her," he said. "If they're going to chase her, they're going to kill themselves."

The rider took a peek under his arm in the backstretch and started winding up Ask The Moon coming into the far turn. By the time they sling-shotted out of the turn, Castellano was asking his filly in earnest, giving her a pop with the whip at the top of the stretch. She fought gamely clear, hit the eighth pole and wandered toward the grandstand, fatigue written all over her. Pachattack and Tiz Miz Sue loomed to her inside, but to no avail: Ask The Moon found more, and crossed the wire 2 3/4 lengths in front.

"It's beyond anything that we ever thought," Irion

said. "They claimed her for 75,000, they really liked her, they thought of course that she could win some stakes, to win two Grade I's in a row, I mean, we're just taking it day by day. Obviously, we're blown away."

Irion has been with Farnsworth Stables' filly all week, stuck in Saratoga after Hurricane Irene forced the Personal Ensign from last Sunday to Saturday. Adjustments were made, routines tweaked, confidence built.

"We got stuck here because of the hurricane, so on Tuesday we had to breeze her over the track," Irion said. "Javier breezed her a half a mile here. He rode her in the race but then he got to get on her in the morning, and she's very impressive in the morning, she gave him a lot of confidence for this race."

Irion glowed a bright spot in the midst of an empty winner's circle after the race. She gallops Ask The Moon, looks after her, occasionally acquiesces to her.

"She's a lot of fun, she's eager to train and happy about training, she's just all class," Irion said. "She's got a lot of personality, she's very headstrong, she's very aggressive. She's sweet, she wouldn't hurt anybody, but she definitely loves to train, she doesn't like to be held back. She's a typical female, she likes to have it her own way. She likes to stop and take a little picnic on the way back to the barn, eat grass. I don't really have an option, she just goes to the grass and you're just along for the ride. She's wonderful, she's been absolutely perfect."

Ask The Moon has only been in Wolfson's stable since July, and only began running in graded stakes races with that move.

The Maryland-bred filly made her debut in 2007 for trainer Ned Allard in Philadelphia. She won three times that year, including an overnight stakes in December. A two-time optional claiming winner at 3, she won the Lighthouse Stakes at Monmouth in 2009.

Winless in 2010, she seemed to be sliding off the radar, until Gary Contessa picked her out of a \$75,000 claimer at Belmont June 15. Contessa put her on the lead in the \$60,000 Sky Beauty at Belmont July 1 and Ask The Moon ran third.

She moved to Wolfson's barn the week after that effort, and the rest is history.

"Marty thinks that's the key with her, just to not fight her, let her use her speed," Irion said. "I think that's the key."

"I had more confidence, I knew her style, she likes to run, she doesn't want you to hold her or fight her," Castellano said. "It was easier than the last time, she ran huge, people thought she stole the race the last time, I don't think so. She showed up again today, she improved, she showed she belongs in that group. She's a really nice filly."

Two Grade I's at Saratoga and earnings more than \$750,000? Not bad for a claimer.

"I picked up the mount, I'm glad it worked out, two Grade I's on a pick-up ride," said Castellano, who got the Ruffian riding assignment the morning of the race.

"Saratoga's been great to us," Irion said, looking around the winner's circle. "I don't know if we want to leave."



Sugar Again holds off Deluxe to take stakes opener

Jonathan Sheppard didn't have to do a whole lot with Sugar Again to wind up in the winner's circle after Saturday's first race, the \$75,000 Paris Opera.

The 4-year-old Augustin homebred nailed the 1-mile inner turf contest from off a slow pace in her second start for Sheppard. Sugar Again began her career for MacDonald Benson, running seven times for four wins and two seconds. She ran second to Apple Charlotte in her first start for Sheppard July 29, her first race since a narrow miss in the \$150,000 Bessarbian Nov. 21.

"She was up in Canada and she had a fairly busy season and maybe she had a little wear and tear when she came back and she went to (owner) George Strawbridge's rehab farm and I think they decided to try to give her a little bit of time and clean up a few problems she had," Sheppard said. "She already had been kind of legged up at Fair Hill by some people associated with Mr. Strawbridge, so by the time I got her, all I had to do was train her a little bit and bring her to

Sugar Again broke cleanly under Rajiv Maragh and settled in sixth on the outside of Bet On The Blue. Leader Ultimate Class wheeled freely into the backstretch run, putting in a quarter of 24.61 seconds and a half in 48.14. By the eighth pole, Sugar Again

had swung wide and started to find her rhythm. The daughter of Syncline rolled past the leaders with Deluxe making up a lot of real estate on the outside. The regally bred Juddmonte 4-year-old couldn't catch Sugar Again, who prevailed by a head.

After catching such moderate fractions, Sheppard knew he got lucky with the directions he gave Maragh in the paddock.

"By chance, I had suggested to Rajiv that he didn't leave her with too much to do, because I don't see her being the type to make a huge burst," Sheppard said. "I was lucky because the way the second horse closed, we had a couple of lengths headstart on her, which we needed I think.'

Sugar Again boosted her career earnings to almost \$300,000.

"She was a very straight-forward horse, a very easy horse to be around, you wouldn't even know she's in the barn until you do something with her," Sheppard said. "She's very willing, easy to train. Rajiv said she made his job easy. She's classy, nothing flashy just workmanlike, sensible. And talented, you know, she can run. She's a nice filly.'

Sugar Again paid \$12.20 to win. The final time for the mile was 1.35.32.



Unbeaten Judy The Beauty adds Saratoga to itinerary

Three countries. Three wins. Now she tries Saratoga. Wesley Ward's worldtraveling Judy The Beauty hit Saratoga this week, in preparation for Sunday's Grade I Spinaway.

She's second choice on the morning line at 3-1 among a field of nine for the \$250,000 race, the 10th of 12 on the card, at 7 furlongs.

Saturday morning, Judy The Beauty circled the wood-chipped oval in front of Barn 18, blinkered, waiting for the pony – a thick, tawny horse who appears and leads her over.

There are only 10, maybe 15 horses on the track immediately after the harrowing break, and the pair joins them, moves down the backstretch against the faster inner rail flow, staying close to the outside, pausing, watching horses move past, moving down through the turn and across the stretch, turning, moving inside, faster, and there, just before the turn, Judy The Beauty, with Lindsey Molina up, leaves the pony and moves past, quietly compared with the other horses that thunder past, softly, easily, fluidly

They are a spot down in the far turn, a green dot that is Molina's pullover, then growing, moving closer and past again, meeting the pony toward the end of the backstretch, and moving off the

track. The daughter of Ghostzapper goes back to the woodchips, drinking from a green bucket as she passes.

It's a different sound here at the track as the horses move past, not just the sound of the people talking there in front of the Morning Line Kitchen, it's the sound of the track itself.

"Aqueduct has more cushion, more fluff. There is not as much give here," Molina said of the track.


Judy the Beauty likes the track, likes the work, likes to run.

"You just sit there. She does her own thing, trains herself," Molina said. "Intelligent? Too intelligent."

There was a chance that this filly, who was born on Saint Patrick's Day 2009, would take on the colts in Monday's Hopeful, but it was the threat of rain, not of the competition, that ultimately made the decision to stay in the Spinaway. It's that confidence, the confidence to look ahead to her next race, to nominate her to the Breeders' Cup, that is like the track here at Saratoga, solid and firm.

The \$20,000 Keeneland yearling purchase made her career debut at Keeneland, winning a 4 1/2-furlong maiden by nearly 2 lengths. Ward checked

his globe and sent her to Chantilly in France, where she won the Prix Caravelle by a neck. She returned to Aqueduct, trained there, and then ventured to Woodbine to notch the Shady Well Stakes. If you're keeping score, that's one win on the turf and two over synthetic surfaces. She makes her dirt debut today.

Todd Pletcher takes aim with Schuylerville winner Georgie's Angel for Sheffer Racing and Ron Stocks. Undefeated in two starts, the daughter of Bellamy Road returns from winning the first Saratoga stakes for 2-year-old fillies. This will be her third start in two months.

"I think she can handle it, we had a decision to make after her maiden race, whether to run her back on short rest into the Schuylerville or wait for the Adirondack and then decided if we did it the other way around, we could get two races here and the spacing moving forward from the Schuylerville, to the Spinaway, to the Frizette, should she be good enough to do all that, was better," Pletcher said. "I think we got away with the tough one. Now, we've had a good training schedule since that race up to this race, she's doing well physically, responding to the races well, she's gaining weight, getting stronger, she's showing us all the signs."

Bred for stamina, 2-1 favorite Georgie's Angel has progressed to where Pletcher thinks she'll improve with the added distance.

"We tried to give her a light time after the Schuylerville but needed to pick it up as we get closer, it's still six weeks in between races and going to a seven eighths and a Grade I, you can't back up too much," Pletcher said. "I thought when she first came back she was a little on the slight side and a little bit small but she keeps getting bigger and stronger and that's what you love to see, when they respond to the training, some of them shrivel up and some of them get stronger."

Trainer John Terranova produces Born Bullish, a 12-1 shot with a lopsided debut win and a fourth in Monmouth Park's Colleen Stakes on her form.

Saturday, she stood in ice boots, shifting her weight, lipping at wisps of hay and bumping her groom with her nose for attention. The 12-1 shot coasted home 9 lengths clear in her debut at 5 1/2 furlongs at Belmont. Then came the Colleen Aug. 7, no day at the beach for the daughter of Flashy Bull.

"She was a little bit of a misfire at Monmouth, but she didn't really handle the ship over that well, it got real hot that day and she kind of got upset in the paddock and didn't really handle the scene too well," Terranova said. "She ran OK, but obviously not that good. A little bit of a rough trip, but nothing she couldn't have overcome, she just wasn't herself going out there."

Terranova likes the longer distance and the likely fast pace and hopes to keep the strong, broad gray filly moving forward.

"She's going to appreciate a little more ground," Terranova said. "She's got good tactical speed, I think she'll

like the stretch out, once we even get beyond seven-eighths it'll be even better for her. She'll take dirt, she'll do anything. She sits off, it's just what she needs, she doesn't need to be getting sent, she needs to sit back, like she trains, real pushbutton." Born Bullish runs for Stephen Mack's Long Lake Stables, a new client for Terranova. The trainer has three Long Lake horses in training this year.

Tony's Two

Dutrow brings sharp duo in for grade I try

"I don't know who the President of the United States is, I don't know what Congress means, I don't understand the stock market. I've done horses all my life, and as you're working with these horses, you're trying to feed off what they have to say. In being around these two particular fillies, they had always very early led me to believe they were much better than average.'

Tony Dutrow stood on the rail at the Oklahoma on an overcast Saturday morning before the Grade I Spinaway. The first of his two very different entries, Grace Hall, jogged around the track tethered to the pony. A big raw filly by Empire Maker, Grace Hall is the lesser experienced of the two. A 3-length winner first out over 6 furlongs, the 2-yearold has drawn the outside post in the 7-furlong race and Dutrow hopes to find out what he's got.

"Grace Hall only had the one race and in that race she broke in front ran around in front and won, so in my opinion, she has almost no experience. Anybody when they break out of the gate and run around there, they can do that, but what did they learn?" Dutrow said. "She's really up against it. She may be a good enough horse to overcome it,

maybe. She may need the experience and still be a nice horse down the road. There are lots of questions she has to answer. I don't think she has to be judged by her performance in the race. I'm looking for information from her."

Back in the barn, True Feelings waited under tack for her turn to jog, mouthing a double-ended snap on her stall guard. Second to Georgie's Angel in the Schuylerville, the daughter of Latent Heat won her debut by better than 3 lengths. With the experience of two races from off the pace under her belt, Dutrow is quietly confident in her chances.

"Grace Hall, this is just another chapter in her life. With True Feelings, I'm hoping to win the Spinaway with her," Dutrow said. "She's a nice-sized filly and growing. She's not built as powerful as (Grace Hall), but she's filling out, she's very athletic. Not immature but growing right in front of you. Very kind, very easy on herself."

Grace Hall, who races for Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables and the Elkstone Group, finished her jog and headed home. She strolled around the tree-lined walking path in front of Dutrow's barn on a loose shank. She barely broke a

sweat in her jog and she distained a water bucket set on a grass-covered straw bale. True Feelings, who races for the same partners as well as Cash Is King Stable, stuck her nose out of the stall and watched the proceedings with interest. Dutrow hopes that the pace scenario will help the bay filly as she breaks from the 5 hole under Jeremy Rose.

"True Feelings will break great, like she does, then she'll fall out of there," Dutrow said. "There's a lot of speed in the race, there's going to be a lot of speed down the backside. I'm anticipating most of those being completely done at the eighth pole. Seven furlongs for a speed 2-year-old, damn near all of them aren't ready for that."

Grace Hall goes to post 8 under Ramon Dominguez.

"I do not think she's as fast as some of them in the race, but she has a great outside post, so she will not be under any pressure and I think she will fall into wherever Ramon is comfortable,' Dutrow said. "She's bred to go 1 1/8 miles on the turf. She's trained well over the dirt. I don't know what she is, I don't know. I don't know. She's just taking another step forward."

Dozen Doozies

Grade III Turf stakes lures balanced group of 3-year-olds

BY JOE CLANCY

Seal Cove looked ready to run last spring and trainer Shug McGaughey was looking for juvenile turf races at Belmont Park.

Then Mother Nature stepped in and said, by the trainer's description, "Whoa, whoa." Seal Cove chipped an ankle and never ran at 2. Stuart Janney's son of Strong Hope spent the rest of 2010 on the shelf and returned for his first career start at Gulfstream Park in March. The 3-year-old broke slowly, but came running from 11th early to win a \$75,000 maiden claimer going 1 1/16 miles on the turf. Since then, he's won twice more on the turf - including the restricted Gleaming Stakes here Aug. 8 – and enters today's Grade III Saranac as the 6-1 fourth choice in a competitive field of 12.

"He didn't surprise us when he broke his maiden, he'd worked decent on the grass at Gulfstream," said McGaughey. "But he's not the same horse. If you'd have told me after he won that day that he was going to be one of the picks for the Saranac at the end of Saratoga I would have questioned that a little bit.


I couldn't have said he was going to go on like he has.'

After the maiden-breaker, Seal Cove finished a troubled fourth on Polytrack at Keeneland, beat older horses in a first-level allowance at Belmont and then took the Gleaming with a sweeping acceleration around the final turn and through the stretch to defeat today's rivals Canaveral and Sky Blazer. Unbeaten in three starts together, Seal Cove and Javier Castellano break from


The Saranac's field comes from all sources and includes Kentucky Derby



Seal Cove comes off a late-running win in the Gleaming Stakes at Saratoga.



ite from post 5 for John Velazquez. King Congie won the Tropical Park Derby on turf at Calder in January, got disqualified from a win in the Hallandale Beach on turf in February and just missed in the Blue Grass. He exits a sixth in the Virginia Derby, behind Seal Cove's stablemate Air Support, at Colonial Downs. Rajiv Maragh gets back aboard at 5-1 from post 8.

Trainer Neil Howard brings Don Adam's Perregaux out of the Grade II Hall of Fame Stakes here Aug. 12. The son of Distorted Humor finished second behind Big Blue Kitten that day while making up ground late. He gets another half-furlong while looking for his third career win.

The dark bay started twice here on the turf last year, and broke his maiden on Polytrack at Keeneland in October. He backed up that effort with a frontrunning allowance win going a mile on the turf at Fair Grounds in December and has placed in two graded stakes since returning in May.

"His last race was his best by far, but he's been real consistent and he's ready for the next step I think," said Howard. "He's doing good, he's a nice horse. He's not a real, real big horse. His mother (Sweet Talker) was small, but a very good horse. He's always been a pretty nice horse to train, not like he had a long way to go to mature, but his last race was his best race by far."

Breaking from the inside for Julien Leparoux, Perregaux brings the tactical speed to sit close to the pace or back off and wait.

"He has been close on an occasion or two but I think now that he's on more of a steady program his best race is from off the pace a little bit," Howard said. "I don't think they're going to come from too far back in that race. You never know. These good horses close off slow paces. That's why I'm so thrilled to have Julien because he can sense that and make a

decision."

Todd Pletcher entered two in the Saranac.

Melnyk Racing sent homebred Clement Rock to Pletcher about a month ago, in hopes of making this race. The son of Strong Hope won three in a row at Woodbine while trained by Mark Casse.

"I watched his races at Woodbine, he's been impressive. He's pretty straightforward kind of horse, we haven't had the opportunity to breeze him on the turf, just seemed like every time we were getting ready to, the weather wasn't cooperative, so all his training was done on the dirt," Pletcher said. "He's clearly a turf horse, working him on the dirt maybe hasn't given us the best line on him, he's been satisfactory in his dirt works. He's been pretty straightforward, but I'm not 100 percent sure what to expect."

Queen'splatekitten bolsters Pletcher's attack. Mill House's Ontario-bred colt finished second in the Palm Beach on the turf at Gulfstream before finishing seventh in the Blue Grass. Pletcher sent him north to win the Marine Stakes by 3 lengths and set sights on the Queen's Plate. He finished fifth that day.

"It was frustrating because his Marine Stakes was exceptional and I felt like going into the Queen's Plate, he was potentially the type horse who could win it," Pletcher said. "It didn't unfold exactly the way we wanted it to, he got bottled up between horses, he ran OK, but he didn't run his A race. For a horse like that, his one big payday is the Queen's Plate, you hate not to fire his best shot."

Queen'splatekitten breezed four times since the Queen's Plate, twice on the turf and twice on the dirt.


'We regrouped after that, we were thinking about the Breeders' Stakes, he wasn't quite ready for that so here we are a month later, he seems to be rounding back into form," Pletcher said. "The mile and a quarter didn't seem to take much out of him, synthetic is a little bit like turf where you can run further without being as grueling as dirt. He's a real nice horse, real easy horse to train. He's pretty patented kind of horse, settle and make one run."

Canaveral (second in the Gleaming), Chinglish (a stakes winner on Preakness Day at Pimlico), Moonhanger (third in the Jersey Derby), Sky Blazer (fourth in the Gleaming), Live In Joy (a stakes winner at Penn National last time) and Pass The Dice (unbeaten in two starts at Churchill Downs this spring) complete the field for the day's ninth race.



Favorite J C's Pride leads way to 7 furlongs, Grade I

Bobby Barbara stood in front of his barn Saturday morning and, much like he had done at Timonium in May, looked at J C's Pride. The trainer brought the 2-year-old home for \$200,000 and runs him in the Grade I Hopeful over 7 furlongs on Monday.

"I kept watching him, he was right at the front of Hartley/De Renzo and for two days, I would always see him and he'd just be standing in front and there was so much action around him, and he never moved a muscle," Barbara said. "He just stood there and watched everything go by. I must have seen him a hundred times because that was the area we had to pass by, and he was always right there. So I bought him."

The strapping chestnut colt oozed athleticism under bucketfuls of soapy water Saturday. For the short time he has been in Barbara's care, he has been the kind of horse that trainers say "does everything right."

HOPEFUL STAKES *PREVIEW*

"He's kind of a laid back horse, he does everything real easily," Barbara said. "He just runs."

The son of Henny Hughes will make his third start in the Hopeful, and enters with some of the best credentials in the race. He ran into Todd Pletcher's Grade II Sanford winner Overdriven in his first start and finished second by 3 1/2 lengths. He validated that horse's form by winning by 3 1/4 lengths next out, running a 101 Beyer in the process. Barbara barely had time to catch his breath.

"I only had him a month, I had only bought him in May," Barbara said. "He just went straight forward from the sale from Timonium, worked him three-eighths, and then again three-eighths and before I knew it, we broke him from the gate a few times and he was ready to run. He ran really well in his

'We knew he was very talented but he took me by surprise a little bit that he won first time out," Brown said. "I thought he'd need a race because he's not a real sharp-acting horse. He's just a steady, classy horse, I don't see an explosive turn of foot, then in the race I saw him laying up close, I didn't really expect that, and then he won. For him to do that when I don't feel I had him fully trained, I have to believe there's more in the tank.'

Brown likes the son of Congrats, but expects the Hopeful to be a challenge.

"He deserves a shot in the field, I don't have a lot of options of where to run him," Brown said. "He's run well over the track. There are some things I like going on, but I don't know if I'm going in there expecting to win. Real classy horse, good mind on him. Trains like a 3-year-old. He's a real easy-going, quiet horse. I think he wants to go a bit further."

Brown named Eddie Castro to ride. Clip The Coupons will break from post 5 while coupled with Aug. 6 Saratoga maiden winner Currency Swap (Rajiv Maragh) from the Monmouth barn of Terri Pompay. The entry is 3-1 on the morning line.

Trainer Todd Pletcher won't have Overdriven for the Hopeful, but does bring in two summer maiden victors.

"Hunt Crossing has trained really well all summer, we were pleased with his first effort, not pleased with the 1 post but that's where he is," Pletcher said. "We were thinking this way as long as he continued to train the way he did leading into his maiden win and

he has."

Pletcher gets a chance to put the saddle on Big Blue Nation in the afternoon as the 10-1 shot makes his first start since switching from the barn of trainer Rusty Arnold. The son of Bluegrass Cat won going 6 furlongs at Churchill Downs in July. Ramon Dominguez rides from post 6.

"He's been very straightforward and professional, trains well, I would think he would continue to like added ground, just looking at him, the way he gets over the ground, the way he trains, the way he looks," Pletcher said. "A lot of us are in the same boat, going from that maiden win to a Grade I."

California shipper I'll Have Another steps in off a maiden win at Hollywood Park July 3 and a second in stakes company Aug. 7 for Paul Reddam and trainer Doug O'Neill. Julien Leparoux takes the ride at 8-1. Trainer Neil Howard's Power World chased Overdriven home second in the Sanford and makes his fourth career start. Edgar Prado takes the riding call at 6-1 from post 4. Vexor, from the barn of John Kimmel, returns from a win here Aug. 10. David Cohen rides at 12-1 from post 2. Laurie's Rocket won here going 5 1/2 furlongs for trainer Dallas Stewart. The son of Bluegrass Cat is 20-1 with Kent Desormeaux named. Trinniberg won at Calder in July and finished a well-beaten fifth in the Saratoga Special here Aug. 15. Cornelio Velasquez rides at 20-1.



Paging through Rokeby, past

he year I was born, 1987, Paul Mellon won the Travers with a horse called Java Gold, the horse Mack Miller called the best horse he ever trained.

One of only three owners to win the Travers five times, Mellon returned six years later with the winner of the Kentucky Derby, Sea Hero. Today, his statue stands in the paddock, and the plinth bears the words: Upperville, Virginia.

When I got to know Upperville, I was galloping horses for Doug Fout and I thought the best thing about the town was the mac and cheese at the Hunter's Head.

I foxhunted the Rokeby estate once and we had great sport. I grew up knowing Paul Mellon was a Virginian. You take those things for granted.

I'm smarter now. The Old Dominion, the blues and greens and grays of the Blue Ridge, Grafton Farm, Mill Reef mean something to me now. The day before this year's Travers, someone put the Rokeby pedigree books, 1988 through 1995, in my hands.

They are slim volumes, 10 pages, you could put them in your pocket. Good stiff paper, printed in plain black ink. To me they are gold. They mean something.

The year is 1988. Glowing Tribute went to Danzig that year. Listed under Yearling Colts in America is a bay colt, born 31 March, by Roberto, out of Arabia (Damascus-Christmas Wind). In 1989, the same colt is found under the Two Year Olds in America list – named Red Ransom. He breaks a track record for 5 furlongs at Saratoga.

The year is 1990. Red Ransom is considered a leading contender for the Kentucky Derby, but he injures himself. His racing career is over. Glowing Tribute produces a Polish Navy colt, the colt whose statue stands in the paddock.

The year is 1992. The year of the dispersal. There's no book – was there ever one? But Glowing Tribute's Polish Navy colt wins the Champagne. A year later he wins the Kentucky Derby and the Travers.

The day before the Woodward, a race Mellon won with Arts And Letters and Key To The Mint, I sat in Neil Howard's tack room and asked him about Rokeby. Howard worked for Mack Miller during his first year of training for Mellon. He remembers Glowing Tribute – that means something too.

"Big filly," Howard said. "She was a big, long filly. She was fantastic."

Races run in the background, 6 furlongs on the dirt, but the volume is turned down and there is respect in Howard's voice for men he remembers as Mr. Mellon and Mr. Mack.

"Mr. Mellon would come to the barns sometimes when he'd come to the races. He was very soft-spoken, always dressed to the nines, a perfect gentleman," Howard said. "Very dedicated to the industry in a lot of different ways. He was the most fabulous man. It was funny, I can't describe it, but whenever he would come around, he cast a big shadow. He was very poised, a real gentleman.

"That's the way they were then, those owners, they were different. He was such a great man. That's why they were so successful. I think a lot of it was his rapport with Preston Burch, Elliott's father, then Mr. Burch, then Mr. Miller," Howard said. "The

people that trained for him and worked for him, they were like him. Those were the only kind of people he would be around."

Howard is half-apologetic, as if he thinks he is sounding corny or cliché, when he calls Mr. Mellon's racing a sport.

He talks about an era when there was Mr. Mellon and his trainer, constructing an empire, partly built on the touch for horses – whatever "the touch" is – and partly built on trust.

"Those horses, especially the good horses, the plans were made for those horses each year and the plans were stuck to and there wasn't any question that those horses that didn't train right, no matter what price they were, no matter what race it was, they wouldn't run," Howard said. "The end of November before we went to South Carolina, every claiming horse we had, Mack would sell to Pancho Martin. Every fall, we would just lead them over to his barn. Pancho wouldn't even have to look at them. It was a trust thing."

Think it doesn't mean anything?

Flatter. Congrats. Rachel Alexandra. Elusive Quality. Black Caviar.

Somewhere in all of those horses, the Rokeby names surface, building blocks in a pedigree, an indelible reminder that quality is not a discrete entity and ought never to be taken for granted. Mr. Mellon didn't have the monopoly on quality and neither does the past – but there is a lasting dignity in excellence, and that deserves remembering.

The visitors arrive this time of year – fans, collectors, staffers, some gamblers. They walk in at the end of the meet to thank us, find us, introduce themselves, ask for small favors, bring us gifts, hand us business advice or story ideas.

Nostalgia comes through in their voices.

They talk about the early days, try to tell us we used to not publish daily. Funny. They talk about collections they have. They talk about individual races like we remember all 350-something of them each year. They claim to read the paper over the winter when the snow piles up 9 feet high.

They wax poetically about Saratoga magic, about the ghosts that haunt the grandstand and clubhouse, about the way Havre de Grace looked at them in the paddock, about the way Todd Pletcher wears a certain tie when he thinks he's going to win, about the time Grandma took them to the races, let them see the horses up close. six weeks (more like seven now I guess) and you get beat up. The schedule grinds like a pencil sharpener. Wrrrrrrwrrrrhwrrrh. Brain cells, personal lives, exercise regimes, best-laid plans get chewed up by the schedule whether you're a horse trainer, a steward, a bartender, a journalist, anything.

On Travers Day, trainer Donnie Von Hemel won the King's Bishop and talked about missing time with his 12-year-old daughter. He shrugged, adjusted his cowboy hat, thought about Tess, caught himself before it got too personal and went to get Caleb's Posse's papers from Horse ID. He left the next day, on a horse van.

This week, somebody talked about his wife running kids to sports practices and back-to-school shopping while he finished out the meet at Saratoga. He needed to get home, he said, to get back to normal before Belmont starts. He leaves today, I think.

Like them, I want to go home. I want to take care of stuff. I want to go to the bus stop. I want to attend a cross-country meet. I want to take my wife to lunch.

I want to stop worrying about the checklist, I want to stop trying to glean Worth Repeatings and numbers and license plates (saw Picked 6 today) and T-shirts. I want to stop wondering what we're going to put on those empty pages in the back of the paper. I want to stop putting newspapers in my car, taking newspapers out of my car, putting newspapers in a golf cart, taking newspapers out of a golf cart, putting newspapers in a rack. I just read Sean's number of 14,000 papers. Tomorrow's load on Cart 18 for the frontside will put me over 34,000, I think. I'm the older brother.


But like the guests at 517 Broadway (Suite 206), I get nostalgic too.


I think about that interview with Von Hemel, I think

I marvel at the enthusiasm of Javier Castellano after a win, the timing of Ramon Dominguez, the confident smile of Mike Hushion, the polished professionalism of another Pletcher winner, the morning energy of Memo and Eliseo at Graham Motion's barn.

I think of this unlikely mix of people, horses, history, money and mountain air. I think of somehow pulling off 11 years of newspapers. And then it's time to go.
