


#### **RUNNING FOR (NOT LIKE) HORSES**

What did you do Saturday morning? Go out to breakfast, play with the kids, take the dog for a walk? The Special, well some of us, went for a run – along with several other hardy souls from the racing community – at the sixth annual Run for the Horses 5K at Saratoga Spa State Park.

The event benefited Thoroughbred charities ACTT Naturally, Heading For Home, Old Friends of Cabin Creek, ReRun and the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, and hosted more than 300 runners.

Among the highlights:

- Owner Adam Newman (Tricky Zippy and Diplomat among others) finishing 10th overall and second in his age group in 21:08. The Newman family was also represented by age-group winners Josh and Sarah, plus Regina and Richard.
- The Special's Elizabeth Collins placing 16th overall, and first in her age group in 21.47
- The Special's Tom Law (Collins' husband and running understudy) placing 29th overall in 23:40.
  - The Special's Joe Clancy placing 42nd overall in 24:59.
- Ace veterinarian and @racinggratitude hostess Jennifer Durenberger finishing 43rd overall in 25:00.
  - The Special's Sean Clancy placing 59th overall in 26:08.
- Trainer Rick Schosberg (26:43), owner Michael Sternklar (27:02) and NYRA's Maggie Morley (30:14) were also in the field along with a smiling Theresa Behrendt and Valerie Clement, breeder Barry Ostrager, landlord extraordinarie Donna Vild, Diana Pikulski of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation and a host of others.
- David McCarthy won the whole thing in 17:23 while Hannah Davidson (17:59) led the women and finished third overall.

# Stable Tour with the Little Guys

In honor of the final edition of The Special for 2015, we bring you the "Little Guy" Stable Tour. We scoured the grounds, searching Horse Haven, Oklahoma, the main track, the harness track, the stakes barn and Gridley Street to bring you the trainers and horses who might not have made headlines this summer, but certainly earned recognition and respect. We even scaled a cyclone fence to track down a trainer flying below the radar. Unfortunately, we weren't able to find the likes of Desmond Farrell, Lars Becdelamotte, Bill Allyn, Bill Hickey, Bill Heffner, Eddie Miller and we only found Joe Parker's golf cart. Next year!

Peter Pugh (Vulcan's Forge): He's a 2-year-old Giant's Causeway out of a Seeking the Gold mare. He's big, 16.2, two-turn type of horse that should run at Belmont in September if we're lucky. He breezes on the grass Monday with one of Jimmy Jerkens' and if that goes well we'll be pretty close."

**Peter Pugh (Zoot Suit):** "He's by High Cotton out of a Yes It's True mare. He's ready to run, I put him in for a race Monday and the race didn't go. He's going to have to run at Belmont. He's quick, had a black-type work the other day, just real nice on the main track, went in :47. He also worked with one of Jimmy Jerkens' horses."

Glenn DiSanto (Where's Danny): "He tries all the time. We claimed him for 20 and he's made about 120 for us, he's a neat old horse, right Danny Boy? He almost died on us, he came in one day with an infection that went all the way up his leg. I took him to Stowe Burke's place, it's a miracle, he's coming back. We train for nice people who love their horses."

Richard Lugovich Jr. (Get Even Here): "She's a 3-year-old filly by Stephen Got Even out of Cherished Trick, she's a half to eight winners including Saytono Daytona, earner of almost a million dollars in Japan. I bred her and raised her on my farm right here near Saratoga Lake. We probably would have



sold her but she cut a big chunk of her foot off when she was a baby. She might run in a month. My father trains at Fair Hill, I've got all the mares and foals up here, she stayed with me, I thought I'd give it a go. It's the first one I've trained on my own. It's been a fun and educational summer. My main man, Rudy (Wolfendale) helps me, I've learned a lot."

Robbie Davis (Susie's A Cowgirl): "She's pretty rapid, she's a free runner. She could have been in the money the other day with a better trip, it's not what I wanted to see. I didn't get much sleep that night, I was pulling weight in my sleep, that's not a good a thing for a 54-year-old man, I was having flashbacks. You work so hard, she performed, she got beat 5 lengths, it wasn't what we were looking for, but we'll live to fight another day."

Mike Shevy (La Dama De Hierro): "She was fourth Thursday. That was her 20th start and she's finished third twice (and fourth five times). I'll try and find something for her later this month. The next three days I'll be shuffled over to the Oklahoma and then I'll start planning what we're going to do as far as running at Belmont."

Mike Shevy (Colonel Jessup): He just ran yesterday (Friday). He led quite a bit of the race, took off and led. Got tired, only beat a couple. He went 22, 46 and hung on for a mile, so if I could use my melon and put him in a 7-furlong race, or a mile race, guess what? He might get

a check. It sounds real simple to a lot of people. He's started 10 times and only gotten a third. Yesterday people said, 'he only beat a couple horses,' but if you saw the race he was brilliant for a little bit. It was my un-brilliance that didn't put him in the right race."

James Nicol (Principle Equation): She's in the last race of the meet, a-other-than on the turf. She hasn't run at the meet, ran at Belmont but that was a disaster. It's one of those things, you ship over from England and you've got that little window of opportunity when you first get here and I ran her after that and it didn't work out. Now it's taken a bit of time to get her back and get over that hump. She raced sort of level. She probably needs to be going further. It's a mile and three-sixteenths, but she probably needs to go mile and three-eighths."

Mike Lauer (Iced Over): "I wish he was in these next few days but we didn't get in. We tried a two other than New York-bred. There's a two-other-than at Belmont. He'll run there hopefully. He ran at Belmont, he's a Yorkie (New York-bred). He's been going good since he's been here. They all do good here. If they do bad here they need a vet."

Anthony Quartarolo (Autumn Squall): "Nice filly. She's run four times, has a win and two seconds. She runs on the dirt and she runs on the grass. Very useful. She was on the grass (Friday) and just got beat a (head). I'll try and run her back at Belmont on the 24th, there's

a race for her, I believe a starter. She's got a big heart."  $\,$ 

Anthony Quartarolo (Onecats Chance): "He ran here Wednesday, ran good, just starting to get good. He finished fourth, two-other-than New York-bred. He won here last year. He had a win and a third last year. This meet he ran twice, two fourths, but right close."

Eddie Barker (Lucky Lotto): "We claimed him for \$12,500 back in February. He's turned out OK. He won for \$32,000 and he's been second twice and third twice. We backed off him a little bit, didn't run him here, because he ran some really hard races. He's made \$75,000 or so for us."

Eddie Barker (Wantach Queen): "She just got beat (Wednesday) by that horse of Jimmy Bond's that paid \$40. She's a nice, hard-trying New York-bred filly. She ran a perfect race the other day, just got beat. She's sitting on a win."

**Eddie Barker (Run For Logistics):** "The owner wanted to run in the Forego (he finised 10th in the Grade 1), but he's going to run in an a-other-than back at Belmont. He'll run real good. He's a nice little horse."

Leon Blusiewicz (Admiral Blue): "He's a 2-year-old by Admiral Alex (a Saratoga winner and Travers starter in 2010). He's worked as good as anybody here on this racetrack, but he bucked shins. I was going to run him Travers Day but we're back to the drawing board a little bit. He'll be OK."

Leon Blusiewicz (unnamed 2-year-old): "He's by Giant's Causeway out of Madam Lagonza, a Kingmambo mare, so he's a half-brother to Admiral Alex, Woodlander, Miss Ocean City who had a winner the other day (Azar in the With Anticipation). It's a great family and he's a grand-looking horse. He just got a little behind schedule."

Peter Pugh (Gin Tiz): "He's going to be later, by Tizway. He's also a big, two-turn type of horse. He's going to be a bit later. He's out of a pretty nice mare, has some siblings that are stakes winners."

"When I used to let up on (Shine Again), she'd break out in bumps, which doesn't make any sense at all but I've watched it. Classy Mirage did that, too. You hate to waste a horse, say you weren't going to run for her another six weeks. You figure you're not going to keep drilling her, that's when she'd get the bumps. Years ago, when we used to back off a horse

we used to not feed them much grain. Maybe that's the trouble, we feed them the same. I don't, though. (Charlie) Whittingham told me, 'Nah, I give 'em the same, I want 'em to get built up.' Did you ever meet him? Some guy. Jimmy said he talked to him for 10 minutes and

he could realize why he was so great. Lazaro was no slouch either. Lazaro Barrera."

# **Big** Smooch

### Liam's Map sets pace, flies home in Grade 1

Vinnie Viola kissed Todd Pletcher, Tracy Pletcher, Hannah Pletcher and Payton Pletcher. He kissed his wife, Teresa. He kissed his son, John. He kissed Terry Finley and Anthony Bonomo. He kissed Richard Migliore. He kissed a man in a kilt.

Winning the Woodward is better than a kissing booth.

Along with the kisses, delivered on the right cheek, sometimes the neck, always close to the ear,



Viola hugged Pletcher at the top of the clubhouse box seats – an owner and his trainer, in universal celebration.

"I'm so happy for you," Pletcher said. "You deserve it."

"You don't know. You don't know," Viola said. "You don't know. You don't know."

Later, he tried to explain what it meant.

"I'm so happy for my wife, she picked the horse out. It's means everything in the world to me that it's her horse, my wife is my best friend and she's the horse person in the family," Viola said. "She believed in him from the beginning. The Whitney was so hard for him, for us, but he proved he's a really special horse today."

Liam's Map dominated the Woodward for his first Grade 1 stakes victory. He won by 4 ¾ lengths from stablemate Coach Inge, with Wicked Strong third after 9 furlongs in 1:47.44. Owned by Viola's wife, Teresa, trained by Pletcher and ridden by Javier Castellano, the son of Unbridled's Song earned redemption, satisfaction, reprieve after a grind-yourteeth loss in the Whitney, a month earlier. That day, the gray 4-year-old blistered on the lead, losing a neck decision to Honor Code in the final strides

Saturday, Liam's Map dawdled on the lead. And there was no Honor Code.

With Mike Smith aboard for the Whitney, Liam's Map posted fractions of :22.79, :46, 1:09.72 and a mile in 1:34.66 before being nabbed after 9 furlongs in 1:47.82. In the Woodward, with Castellano, Liam's Map posted fractions of :23.69, :47.49, 1:10.94 and a mile in 1:34.97 before strolling home in 1:47.44.

In the Whitney, Moreno pressured early, which elicited the sharp early tempo. In the Woodward, Bay Of Plenty hinted at pressure, then backed off and sat second, which allowed Liam's Map to saunter. It was over quickly.

Castellano, who had ridden Liam's Map to an allowance score in June and breezed him twice since the Whitney, knew what to do.

"The second quarter is the key,"

Castellano said before the race. "I'm not going to take anything away from him, I hope nobody chases me. Whoever chases me is not going to win the race, they'll blow their race. You're not going to go in :24, it's going to be :23. If everybody rides smart, they'll wait to put pressure on me."

They waited, then deflated.

Liam's Map broke cleanly from post 2, Castellano nudged for two strides and stayed low, draping over his withers, taking a long hold and allowing Liam's Map's natural speed to take control. Joel Rosario hopped and pumped for a couple of strides on Bay Of Plenty, then stayed wide into the first turn. John Velazquez placed Coach Inge to the inside in third. Wicked Strong stayed on the rail as Protonico sat outside him. Effinex came next. Commanding Curve and Mylute trailed.

Liam's Map loped down the backstretch, tepid fractions in the bank. Into the turn, Bay Of Plenty tried to apply the pressure Castellano expected, but it was like yelling at a passing car as Liam's Map rolled through 6 furlongs in 1:10.94.

Castellano chilled all the way around the turn, like it was one of the half-mile breezes between the Whitney and the Woodward. Passing the quarter pole, Castellano said he asked, but it was hard to see. If he asked, it was nothing more than a request. Straightening into the stretch, Castellano moved his hands for the first time, Liam's Map sailed past the eighth pole, widening his lead on Bay Of Plenty, Coach Inge and Wicked Strong.

Nothing else was materializing. Castellano stayed low, pumped like he was riding the Equicizer in the jocks' room and pocketed another Grade 1 stakes score at Saratoga. Liam's Map swapped to his left lead late but it had long been decided.

"He's a tough horse, if he takes off, nobody can stop him, you have to have finesse with him, you have to be patient, if you rush, he's gone. If you take a hold, you'll struggle too," Castellano said. "In the Whitney, there was more pace, he was inside, Moreno was next to him. This time, there wasn't as much speed. My horse, :47 and change is like :48 and change. If he relaxes that second quarter, he's gone. I learned a lot in the morning,

when you get on horses in the morning, it builds your confidence. I felt like King Kong."

Liam's Map made his debut here last summer, finishing second to Three Alarm Fire. After his debut, he finished the year with three consecutive wins, including the Harlan's Holiday at Gulfstream Park.

Freshened, he returned to win an allowance race at Belmont in June, then lost the heartbreaker in the Whitney. Liam's Map made the decision for Pletcher to run back in the Woodward.

"My first reaction was, that was a hard race on him. Two days after the race, we couldn't keep him on the tow ring. Sometimes hard races set horses back and sometimes they move them forward, maybe that one moved him forward," Pletcher said. "He looked unbelievable, his weight was good, his energy was good, good breezes. Let's not overthink this. Honor Code's not running. Tonalist's not running. We should. It's great to project what you're going to do three months from now, six months from now, but there's no time like right now.

Liam's Map jetted out of the Whitney, his second start of 2015. Pletcher tabbed Castellano, who had ridden Honor Code, and asked him to breeze Liam's Map Aug. 22 and again Aug. 29. The moves were nearly identical, the horse flourishing and

"I think Javier getting to know him a little bit better helped. He's got a little bit of a light mouth, a high cruising speed, you don't want to get in his way but you don't to go in :45 either," Pletcher said. "The key was when he got that clearance, when they threw up :47 I thought he would be tough, but I'm always concerned until they cross the wire. He'll make horses a little drunk running behind him. It's his natural style, he's a free-running horse, you don't want to get in a fight with him, you want to use it not abuse it."

# Star Daughter

### Rachel's Valentina states her case

You can almost hear anyone who has anything to do with Rachel's Valentina trying not to apply pressure. Treat her like herself, not her mother - champion, fan favorite and Saratoga heroine Rachel Alexandra.

Easier said than done after the 2-year-old filly eased away from five rivals to win the Grade 1 Spinaway Saturday for owner/breeder Stonestreet Stables and trainer Todd Pletcher. The daughter of Bernardini ran her short race record to 2-for-2, by settling behind sparring pacesetters Tonasah and Constellation early, rallying off the turn for John Velazquez and holding sway over Tap To It with Constallation third in 1:23.10 for 7 furlongs.

#### SPINAWAY STAKES RECAP

The Spinaway winner earned a ticket to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and further embellished the reputation of her dam. Fans Saturday cheered Rachel's Valentina in the paddock, held Stonestreet burgundy and gold signs aloft for the winner's circle photos and peppered owner Barbara Banke with questions about visiting the farm, giving Rachel Alexandra some love and the power of prayer.

"I don't think anyone counts on anything like this," said Banke. "She's awesome."

She was Saturday. The bay filly broke a little bit slow from post two,

and was fifth of six for the first few strides. She quickly advanced to third behind Tonasah and Constellation, then ran up into a pocket on the rail as the first quarter-mile went in :22.75. Velazquez glanced right, tapped the brakes and eased to a length back after a half-mile in :45.38.

"She was a little bit more aggressive the first part of the race than I wanted her to be," said Velazquez, who was aboard for her maiden win here Aug. 2. "She's not like that. I had to really get ahold of her and put her behind the other horses. I didn't want to overdo it and take too much hold of her and take away what she was doing easy. Once she got behind the other horses she settled well and was very good."

Just past the quarter pole, Rachel's Valentina angled outside, reeled in Constellation at the eighth pole and repelled Tap To It's long strides over the final sixteenth.

Second at the eighth pole after 1:10.09, Rachel's Valentina stayed on

late and won by a length. Velazquez was impressed, and proven right.

"I worked her from the gate and I worked her from the pole and she definitely looked like she was not going to be a lighting-fast horse," the jockey said. "I told Todd she was probably going to need a little distance. I didn't think five-eighths was going to be for her. So we went three-quarters and then seven (furlongs) today. She did it perfectly."

She's done a whole lot of things that way.

"When we raised her, she was in our top four fillies and she kept getting better and better and better," said Banke. "By the time she left, we thought she might be the best one, and we have some other really good ones."

Sent to Pletcher, Rachel's Valentina continued to ascend and answer questions.

"She stamped herself as really good to us early on, just as easy to prepare for anything as you would ever hope for, everything she did was totally uncomplicated, totally professional. My only concern first time out was just

if 6 furlongs was going to be enough ground," Pletcher said. "She did some things in the morning that over the years of coming to Saratoga, watching 2-year-olds breeze five-eighths, only some of them will go on and gallop out that next quarter. She did that. Super Saver, Devil May Care, only Grade 1 horses."

Pletcher aimed for a 6-furlong maiden race and she rallied from sixth of eight to win by 2 lengths. The Spinaway was the next step.

"I didn't want to overthink it," Pletcher said. "You've got a filly that breaks her maiden impressively going 6 and she's bred to go further and the Spinaway is good timing, let's not make this more complicated than it needs to be."

Pedigree counts for something in racing, or else much of an industry is wasting its time.

Bernardini raced just one season, but won the Preakness, Jim Dandy, Travers and Jockey Club Gold Cup. He finished second in the Breeders' Cup Classic and retired to Darley as a coveted stallion prospect. Horse of the Year in 2009, Rachel Alexandra won 13 of 19 starts (with five seconds), captured the Kentucky Oaks, Preakness, Mother Goose, Haskell and Woodward. She beat males in three Grade 1 stakes and rode a rare wave of popularity.

Rachel's Valentina is the second (and perhaps last) foal for Rachel Alexandra, who underwent surgery and a lengthy recovery process after being injured in the foaling process. The filly was raised by a nurse mare.

By a champion, out of a Horse of the Year, the Spinaway winner will get a chance to blaze her own trail.

"Let her be who she is," Velazquez said. "She has to earn it. Forget about who Mommy is. Mommy isn't here. It's not easy to earn it on the track. It's nice to be from good bloodlines and everything, but a lot of times they don't show up. Sometimes it doesn't mean anything. It's a matter of how much ability you have and what you can do not who your Mommy and Daddy are.

"She's showing all the potential to be a really good horse."

# Casse barn connects with World Approval

Norm Casse couldn't help but think, "are we going to get beat by a head again?" as he watched the stretch run of Saturday's \$300,000 Saranac Stakes, and with good reason.

No one has had worse luck in close stakes finishes this summer than the stable of trainer Mark Casse. Tepin lost two photo finishes in the Grade 1 Diana and then the Grade 2 Ballston Spa. The brutal beats continued in the Fleet Indian, which Conquest Superstep lost by a head.

Down to their last starter of the meet, luck finally went the way of the Casse stable as World Approval was up in time to collar Money Multiplier by a head the Grade 3 Saranac.

"It looked for a second like we were going to win and I wasn't going to let myself believe we were going to win because we were getting beat in a lot of races like this," said Norm Casse, assistant to his father. "Today was a good day for us."

World Approval broke evenly and was wrangled to the tail of the eight-horse field by rider Joel Rosario as Nonna's Boy gunned to the front. He posted a blistering opening quarter-mile of :22.30 before clicking off a half in :46.29. Up the backstretch, the field took closer order and World Approval picked up a few positions, skimming the hedge under Rosario's urging.

As Nonna's Boy weakened on the lead through 6 furlongs in 1:10.23, World Approval slid up the

inside and was soon on the heels of the leader. Nonna's Boy was quickly put away, but World Approval still had Money Multiplier to deal with. Rosario went to the stick left-handed, asking the Northern Afleet gelding for a strong run. He delivered, grinding out the narrow victory as an 8-1 outsider. Money Multiplier was second while Go Around finished 1 1/4 lengths back in third. World Approval ran the 9 furlongs in 1:45.39.

"You can't say enough about the ride, the ride made a big difference," Casse said. "This horse is a very tricky horse to figure out to ride. You can't give up on him; when you ask him, he'll go. We never gave up on him and it looked like he was confident with him the whole time. Like I said, he

(Rosario) made all the difference today. I can't describe enough how good the ride was."

Rosario got back aboard World Approval in the Saranac. He rode the gray gelding once before, finishing third over a sloppy track last November at Aqueduct when he was trained by Christophe Clement. He took over for Jose Lezcano, who rode World Approval in the Grade 2 Hall of Fame and rode Go Around in the Saranac.

"I could see when Johnny pointed to the outside and I said 'OK, this is my chance to go,' " Rosario said. "They picked up a little bit down the backside and I wanted to be on the inside the whole way and

save ground and hoped he had something in the end."

The win is the fourth of World Approval's career from nine tries and bumps his earnings to \$364,050 for owner/breeder Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation.

Although the meet has been an unlucky one for the Casse stable, sending out just three winners from 42 starters, Casse still has a positive takeaway from the summer.

"It's been a humbling experience, but at the same time, the majority of our horses ran well, we just never had any kind of luck," Casse said. "We're basically a head away from winning four stakes at Saratoga. That's the way I look at it. We got this one and three of them we got nailed at the wire, so we actually had a decent meet."

Father and son work closely with the stable. With Mark having departed Saratoga before the stable sent out their final runner, the 31-year-old was left alone to enjoy his first major success at Saratoga.

"It's what I've wanted to do for a long time," he said. "To be here, this is the pinnacle, to win a race like this is really exciting. It's just super exciting. We talk together. We both respect each other. At the end of the day, he makes the final decision on things, but I have a big influence in what he does."

Casse heads to Belmont next with a 12-horse string, but plans to be back at Saratoga next year. He is already looking forward to applying what he learned this season to next year's meet.

"Now we get to go. This is our last runner of the meet. We get to come back next year with some optimism."



# White Rose rides inside rally to Grade 3 triumph

Bill Mott made his way out of the winner's circle, through and to the back of the clubhouse to his usual spot to watch a replay and for a split second seemed like he was about to miss something.

"Whoop, Kentucky Downs," Mott said, making a beeline for a bank of televisions and casting his eyes high and to the right to watch a race already underway. The race was a \$300,000 stakes and he was represented by a colt he's always held in high regard, so don't think for a minute that he was forgetful or as attuned to where the members of his stable were running as he is to their training.

A few minutes earlier White Rose showed the benefits of her trainer's Hall of Fame horsemanship, perseverance and attention to detail with a course-record setting victory in the \$200,000 Glens Falls Stakes to cap a four-pack of graded stakes on the final Saturday of the 2015 Saratoga meeting. White Rose's victory came just before Tourist

dominated the field for the More Than Ready Mile at Kentucky Downs.

"Two stakes within about two minutes," Mott said as he made his way to the paddock for the finale. "How about that?"

Mott added to his big day in the gloaming as Take The Stand came from behind to win a \$90,000 allowance-optional on the grass in Saratoga's 12th race. Three wins, three separate ownership groups, two stakes, a course record, total purses of \$590,000 and a winner's haul of \$354,760.

"That was great," Mott said.

White Rose was great in the Glens Falls thanks to an ideal inside trip under Shaun Bridgmohan. The wellnamed 5-year-old daughter of Tapit rarely seems to get an inside trip and frequently gets pushed out while trying to make her run. She not only got the inside trip but a perfect setup in the 1 3/8-mile Glens Falls when a speed duel developed early.

Goldy Espony, the gate-to-wire winner of the Grade 3

Waya going 12 furlongs Aug. 8, was expected to be on the lead again in the Glens Falls but couldn't stay in front after leading early. Instead the frontrunner's role fell to Maximova, who set a strong early pace from her inside post, going the opening half-mile in :46.70 and 6 furlongs in 1:10.57.

Maximova barreled along on the lead and led by 3 lengths through that quick three-quarter split. Ceisteach and Goldy Espony gave immediate chase in front of the stands the first time and around the clubhouse turn. Neither looked particularly comfortable not being in front, headstrong and pulling, while White Rose and Eastern Belle relaxed in the next flight with several lengths of daylight between them and the leading trio.

Bridgmohan, who rode White Rose the last time she won in the 2014 Dowager Stakes at Keeneland in October, sliced into the lead when he sent the gray mare around the far turn. He kept her inside all the way around the bend, something she wasn't able to do in losses this year in the Waya, River Memories, Bewitch and Orchid. She raced wide in those races, sometimes extremely wide, and they were part of a six-race losing streak for the mare owned by Jake Ballis and former NBA star Rashard Lewis.

White Rose passed Goldy Espony first, at about the midpoint of the turn, then slipped past Ceisteach

just as the field turned for home and started to bunch up behind the tiring Maximova.

White Rose came off the inside to pass Maximova at the same time John Velazquez roused Eastern Belle toward the lead. White Rose repelled the challenge from Eastern Belle, holding a 1-length advantage at the sixteenth pole and maintaining it to the finish. The official margin was three-quarters and White Rose won in 2:11.46, topping the previous course mark of 2:11.66 set in 2008 by Hostess.

"I had a perfect trip. It was pretty straightforward," Bridgmohan said. "Got to the fence, saved every inch of ground, angled off at the top of the stretch and she gave me what she had. Obviously, Bill does a phenomenal job with her and she showed it.

"She's a very difficult mare to ride, so I just have

to ride her and not worry about anyone else. She gets along good with me. She likes me."

Saturday was their fourth win, and third stakes win, together. A \$225,000 purchase at the 2012 Keeneland April 2-year-olds in training sale, White Rose was originally trained for Ballis by Michelle Nihei and didn't race until late September of her juvenile season. She caught eventual graded stakes winners Emollient and Caroline Thomas in her first two starts and was transferred to Mott that winter.

White Rose won her second start for Mott, going 9 furlongs on the grass at Gulfstream. She was second in the 2013 Glens Falls at Saratoga, earning trips to the Grade 1 Flower Bowl Invitational and Grade 3 Long Island, where she finished off the board to end the season. She won only once in five starts to start her 4-year-old year, before backto-back wins once she really stretched out, in the 1 5/16-mile Kentucky Downs Ladies Marathon and the 1 ½-mile Dowager

The wide trips plagued her from there, until she got the more ideal trip in the Glens Falls.

"That can happen in those longer races sometimes," Mott said. "The frustrating thing is she doesn't have a real quick turn of foot so sometimes she gets packed a little wide. She got a beautiful rail trip today. She fit in here and if you were a numbers guy she's run some good speed figures but just because she's been taking the overland route every time."

"We couldn't be more happy. We got a graded stakes for her, these guys are here, Jake and Rashard, and I'm thrilled for them."





Bonomo's MeB Racing Stable, sent out Greenpointcrusader to win the 7-furlong maiden special weight for 2-yearolds. The son of Bernardini rode the rail to the top of the stretch, angled out in the lane and was up to win by a neck as the even-money favorite.

"I'm very happy. He's running as we expected," Bonomo said. "His first race, he just was a little short and his trip was a little tough. He's running to where we believe he is and we believe as the distance goes further, he'll get better."

Bonomo and Viola purchased Greenpointcrusader for \$575,000 at the 2014 Keeneland September yearling sale at the recommendation of trainer Dominick Schettino, although the deal almost didn't work out.

"Trainer loved him," Bonomo said. "He saw him in the sales and just loved the horse. Thank God for Vinnie Viola because I was bidding on him and I was stopping and Vinnie kept going. We've been in partnership for a couple of horses. We've got a couple of 2-year-olds that we're partners on that are all pretty promising. We grew up together, so it's kind of special when you win with a good friend. We grew up in Brooklyn.

"Our trainer is a great trainer. He does great with 2-year-olds. I sometimes don't think he gets the recognition he deserves. And it's special to win with him."


Bonomo was also thrilled to win the Nerud Memorial and plans to cherish that moment with his friends for a long time to come.

Irad Ortiz Jr. got paid back as Rafting pulled a minor upset in the seventh race while making his second career start.

Tale Of Life's disqualification spoiled a strong U.S. debut for the Japanese-bred son of Deep Impact. He rallied up the inside to win by a nose over Designed For War, but was disqualified for impeding fourth-place finisher and pacesetter Furyofthenorsemen.

"That's the game," Motion said about the disqualification. "It's just so tough up here."

Rafting helped take some of the sting away when he rated up the backstretch and kicked clear to win the 7-furlong maiden special weight on the main track by 2 1/4 lengths in his second start. The Tapit colt was seventh in a 1 1/16-mile maiden race on the grass Aug. 8 at Saratoga.

"His pedigree kind of leans toward grass," Motion said. "Having said that

he worked very well on the dirt, so that's why we decided to go this way."

Bred in Kentucky by his owners, Gerard and Alain Wertheimer, Rafting is out of the stakes-winning Kris S. mare Paiota Falls.

Rafting was the lone winner of the day for Ortiz, who takes a six-win lead over Javier Castellano into the final two days of racing as he seeks his first Saratoga riding title.

Trainer Henry Collazo walked Bullet Gone Astray around John Kimmel's barn adjacent to Union Avenue Friday morning. The 2-year-old colt just returned from the track, was cooling off and feeling good. Collazo was one step ahead of any possible antics.

"Stop it, stop it. Don't do it," Collazo told Bullet Gone Astray, who listened. "He's happy to be here. You have to hold his head up before he goes up on his own."

After a few more turns were completed, Bullet Gone Astray went quietly into his stall and peered out, looking for attention. He got plenty.

"It's not that he's really sharp, it's just that he's happy," Collazo said. "He's very quiet in the stall. You can walk up and lay hands on him. He's very sensible, he likes people. He's a little kid that wants to play and for him out there is play and he can't get enough."

Bullet Gone Astray is 2-for-2 entering Monday's Grade 1 Hopeful Stakes. He won his debut June 28 at Gulfstream Park as an 8-1 outsider before wheeling back Aug. 1 in the \$100,000 Mountaineer Juvenile Stakes. He romped that day, deci-

mating his four rivals by 9 lengths under left-handed urging from rider Luca Panici, who will be back aboard Monday.

"He won at Gulfstream and after the race, he was ready to go back to the track," Collazo said. "The effort didn't take anything out of him. As time went on, he was just getting sharper and more anxious. He just got sharper and when I did finally race him, two days later, he was wanting more. Took him to the track, he was using everything he did as a stepping stone. So I had a stick of dynamite with the fuse lit, it's either going to blow up in my hands, or I take it somewhere and have a safe explosion and that's what Mountaineer was. It was an opportunity for him to extend himself."

Although it looked like Bullet Gone Astray had a good blowout at Mountaineer, Collazo soon discovered that he still had a problem on his hands.

"He came back, he was still lit and he was still waiting to explode," he said. "I was just going to sit chilly on him, but he's lit and he's going to explode. He either blows up in my hand or he goes and applies himself in the

afternoon. I had about three different places to go, and for sure Saratoga is No. 1 on the hit list and there was no reason not to try."

Bullet Gone Astray will be Collazo's first Saratoga stakes runner. The trip to New York is something of a homecoming for the Florida-based trainer.

"I've been stabled in New York in the past," he said. "I just love New York. Who doesn't love Yankee Stadium? The history of it all. Being in this barn with John is just a taste of the good life. I was raised in Queens when I was little. I love baseball and I love horse racing. The only thing I could end up doing was training horses. I'm fulfilling my childhood dreams."

Although Collazo grew up in New York, his family relocated to California in the 1960s after a hurricane blew through the East coast. It was in California that he got his first taste of racing while visiting Hollywood Park, Santa Anita Park and Del Mar with his older brother, who has since passed away. After about nine years in California, Collazo's family moved again, this time to Florida. He spent time on the backstretch and began to work his way up the ladder.

"My parents figured hurricanes aren't as bad as earthquakes, so they went to Florida and when we got to Florida, my friends and I all went to work at Calder," Collazo said. "And I was walking hots and holding horses

for the blacksmith. I went to college and graduated high school, but every summer I was on the racetrack, every afternoon after I finished work I'd go and get the late double, sit there from the eighth to the 10th race. I just loved the races. In '79 got my trainer's license. I could never get this out of my mind."

For Collazo, the allure of racing wasn't about money, fame or glory; it was about the horse and the lasting connections he has built over the years.

"That's what makes everything special is the horses and then the people," he said. "It's a family and no matter where I go, I see somebody that knows me that I know. It's incredible the way everybody interacts with everyone else and they're all good-hearted people."

Although Collazo acts mainly as a manager for his team at Gulfstream Park, he is taking care of Bullet Gone Astray himself this week in Saratoga. As he recalled the first time he saw his stakes winner, he prepared the colt's feed bucket and mucked his stall.

"This is how I got my start," he said. "And not only how I got my start, this is my passion. The only problem is my age doesn't allow me to take care of two or three, but I'm good enough for one . . . For me, this is a vacation, it's a blessing.

"When I went down at the (OBS) April sale, I was by myself because (my owners) have real jobs," Collazo joked. "So we're on the phone. I read the catalog, they read the catalog, but I'm the one that goes hands on with everything. We bred a couple of our mares to Gone Astray, so we were interested in the stallion. My owner said, 'Hey listen, there's a Gone Astray there that looks pretty interesting. Go take a look at him.' I went over because he was bought back. He was in the stall and there was nobody around. I knew the consignors were friends of mine, so I went in the stall and took a look at him and about two minutes later, I'm on the phone saying, 'I bought him.' We shook hands and that was it."

What caught Collazo's attention wasn't a flashy pedigree or a perfectly built racehorse. It was something more, something intangible, that stood out about Bullet Gone Astray.

"From the very first moment I saw him, I just had a gut feeling," Collazo

said. "I look at their eyes. It's that innate thing that they have inside them. And just his attitude, his personality, he was either going to be a great racehorse or a great pet, but he was a great horse. That I knew. He was a great horse."




Bullet Gone Astray, who has been wanting to do more in the mornings.




